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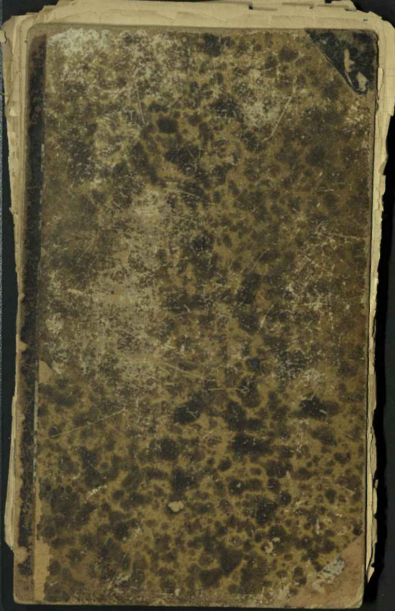

After sermon by the pastor on the subject of communion, the doors of the Church were opened and Bro John Barrett and wife Ann Barrett were presented letters of dismission from Church in Rutherford County N.C. and were unanimously received into the fellowship of this church. A hymn was sung, during which the right hand of fellowship was extended by the whole church to Bro and Sister Barrett and a Sister Cabot, and the church then proceeded to celebrate the Lords supper for the first time in months.

Treasurer on contingent fund reports that the debt of church has been reduced to \$238 00 out of which Elder reports \$100 in cash and pledges contributed by the church and friends to the church extension funds for the support of the Lincoln Baptist Church from the anti-slavery spirit of the Baptist of Italy and record that because of the same reason he has been unable to secure the services of an efficient pastor and report that conference motion carried.

Motion also that the Deacons be requested to estimate the Annual contingent expenses of the Church and endeavor to get each Member to pay his proportionate of the same motion carried.

Sister Jane Madden a member of the church having been reported as being guilty of the crime of Fornication and adultery and the facts being made known by the Williams from Governor's indictment.

Upon motion following is hereby established. It is agreed that the church hereafter meet in conference Friday night before each first Sunday in the month. No further business.

The church votes in the affirmative, then moved & second to consider the 4th Inst. in said letter Carried, it reads thus "4th Are the brethren and sisters ready to discontinue the discipline of the affairs of the church on the streets in the presence of those who are not members of this particular church? upon the Inst. the church votes in the affirmative, Moved & second, that the letter from bro Cobb to the Church through the Committee be recorded on the Church book, the motion was disrupted and decided by the church in the negative then a ~~motion~~ moved & second to return said letter to bro Cobb which was Carried in the Affirmative Moved & second to make no record of the proceedings of this Conference upon the Church book, upon the ground that the letter upon which the Church has been acting must be returned to bro Cobb.

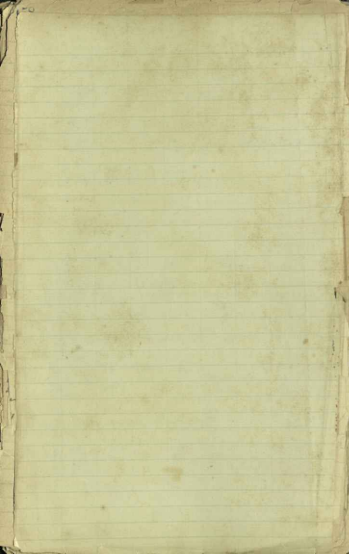

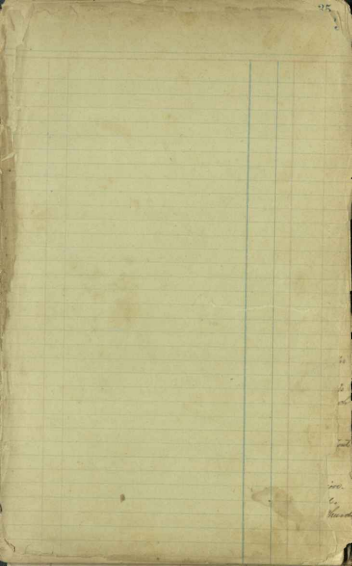

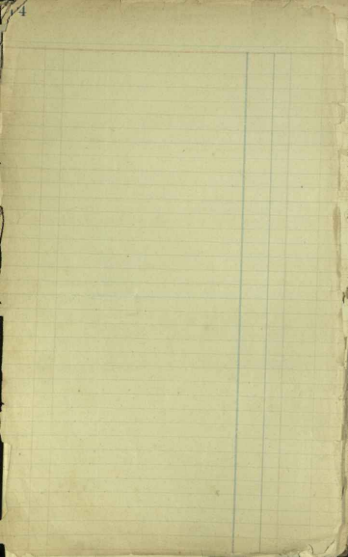

- 7th That all public Offences against the Church, and the Cause of Christ, are to be brought regularly before the Church, and for the Church may appoint a Committee to investigate said Offences and report the same to the Church for its approval or rejection. These public Offences are such as Adultery, Adultery, Fornication, Drunkenness, Swearing, Gambling and such like as found in Gal 5 Chapter.
- 8th That all grievances between Members of the Church of a personal Character, shall be brought before the Church, according to the teachings or rule laid down in the 15th Chap 14, 15 & 17 of Matthew.
- 9th That each member of this Church shall pay his or her proportionate share of the expenses of the Church. (Such as Pastors Salary's Contingent expenses of the Church.)
- 10th That any male member failing to attend the regular Church Conferences, shall send his excuse or attend at the next Conference and render it himself, and if he shall fail to attend the 3rd time and render his excuse, then the Church shall send for him, and deal with him even to exclusion if necessary. And that any female member absconding or staying away from Public Worship for Six Months, shall be liable to Complaint by the Church and sent for, to answer the Cause.
- 11th That no male member shall depart from Conference without leave of Absence from the Moderator.
