Sixteenth Pastor

Rev. G. P. Hamrick was born in Cleveland County near Boiling Springs on August 23, 1849. He joined the Boiling Springs church in 1863, he was educated at Wake Forest College and graduated in 1879, he was also graduated from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. Rev. Hamrick was ordained to the ministry in January, 1880, he served as pastor at the following places: Grover, Boiling Springs, N. C. Buffalo, S. C., Paelet, S. C., Fingerville, S. C., Asheville, Biltmore, Canton, N. C. These pastorate covered a period of forty years, he was pastor of this church from July 1, 1890 until February 1, 1892. The Baptist denomination, in this section of the Carolinas, owes much of its progress to the leadership of Rev. Hamrick. He died on October 14, 1924.

He married Miss Sarah (Sallie) Anthony and to them one son was born Earl Hamrick
