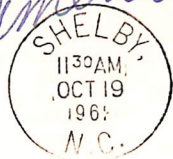

Zeno Wall, clergyman, born near Mooresboro, N.C., Aug. 20, 1882 son of S.F. and Elora Jane (Robinson) Wall; student of Mars Hill College and the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Ky., Doctor of Divinity of Mississippi College, Clinton, Miss; married Ada Kate Ramsey of Marshall N.C., May 4, 1911; children Zeno, Jr., (Gatlinburg, Tenn) Abbie Jane (Mrs. Ollie Harris, Kings Mountain, N.C.) Yates of Columbia, S.C., Woodrow of Knoxville, Tenn, and Ada Ramsey (Mrs. W.L. Fanning, Ridgewood, N.J.) Ordained to the ministry at Cliffside, N.C., on July 8, 1908; pastor Marshall Baptist Church 1909-1910; Enlistment Secretary of Home Mission Board 1914-1915; pastor at Clinton Baptist church (worshipping in Old College Chapel) 1916--22; First Baptist church, Goldsboro, N.C., 1922-25; Secy of Board of Trustees, Mississippi College (Our Baptist College) 1916, 17; Pres. Boiling Springs, Junior College 1930-32; Vice Pres. Board of Trustees of Baptist hospital, Winston-Salem, N.C; President of Baptist State Convention for four years, 1932-36; Pres. Board of Trustees of Baptist Orphanage for many years; Gen. Supt of this Orphanage; chaplain of 140 Field Artillery in World War I; author of three books: Heartening Messages, Verities of the Gospel, and A Day for God-called Men. Home address: 853 W.
