Dear Fellow Student:



QUES FOR QOFDS

RESIDENCE HALL REGULATIONS

Each resident is under the direction of a Head Resident, House President, and a House Council. Each girl is expected to become acquainted with and to give full cooperation to those who carry the responsibilities to these positions.

The college provides maid service for the large living areas of the residence halls (lobbies, halls, porches, washrooms and community baths.) However, each woman resident is responsible for the care of her own room, which may be visited by the Head Resident at her discretion. Girls are not to mar the walls of their rooms at any time. Repair of damage to college buildings or furniture will be charged to the student responsible. No furniture may be moved from any room without the consent of the Head Resident. Television sets, hot plates, toasters and irons will not be allowed in rooms, but girls may have lamps, record players and radios. (This is a rule made by the N. C. Electric Code because some appliances strain the current.)

A kitchen has been provided in each of the residence halls, and each girls is expected to give full cooperation in the matter of keeping it clean. Detailed information concerning the use of the kitchen will be given in the house meetings.

COURTESY IN RESIDENCE HALLS

Girls wishing to have guests in the residence halls shall first notify the Head Resident, and upon the arrival of the guest shall introduce her to the Head Resident and register her on the Guest Register as soon as possible. A guest may remain only three days without room charge and must follow all residence hall regulations. If they cause a violation of W. S. A. rules or regulations, their hostesses will be held responsible for their conduct.

Pay telephones have been provided in each residence hall, and it is expected that the students will use these phones for personal use. Except in cases of emergencies, no student is permitted to use the telephones provided for the Dean of Women or the Head Resident. Under no circumstances is a girl to engage in telephone conversations of excessive length. No student is to make or receive a call during closed study hours or after 11:30 p. m.

The loud speakers are to be used only for the purpose of calling girls to the telephone or to the lobby. They are not to be used between 11:30 p. m. and 8:00 a. m.

Out of consideration for students who are studying or sleeping, radios should be turned down low enough so as not to be heard outside the room. This also includes typing after 11:30 p. m.

It is not becoming a girl of college age to talk out the windows or to make unnecessary noise in the residence halls.

In order to maintain the good habit of practicing economy, we are asking that girls turn off their lights when they leave their rooms for any length of time. This also applies to turning off radios and closing the windows and doors upon leaving for the holidays.

The Head Resident must be contacted before a male visitor is permitted into the halls.

Hall counselors will check at the beginning of each study session to see that each girl is in her room or accounted for. Tardies will be penalized. During study sessions the girls in one room are limited to four.

STUDY AND QUIET HOURS

All resident students must observe the following study hours, Monday through Friday:

- 7:15 p. m. - 9:30 p. m. - Study session
- 9:30 p. m. - 10:00 p. m. - Break (girls may visit the college student center.)
- 10:00 p. m. - 11:30 p. m. - Study session (quiet hours - restricted showers, washing and ironing.)
- 11:30 p. m. - Ready for bed - LIGHTS OUT (girls may take two light cuts a week to study in their own rooms. All lights must be out by 12:30 a. m.)

LIGHTS OUT at 12 midnight on Saturday and Sunday

REGISTERS

It is important and required for a student to sign out for the weekend on the WEEK END CARDS provided in each residence hall. This register is for the protection of the student and for the convenience of the Head Resident in accounting for each student. It is also a requirement to sign in after returning to the residence hall, and should be done immediately upon returning to the campus.

DAILY REGISTERS are placed in each residence hall and must be signed by the student when leaving on days designated or the residence halls at night. A student must sign out at night, which means 7:15 p. m. or later, even if she is on campus, and sign in immediately upon returning to the residence hall.

THE DATE REGISTER must be signed by a student when dating. Upon returning to the residence hall the student must sign in at once.

THE GUEST REGISTER is for the purpose of registering overnight guests.

When signing out on any of these registers, the student must sign out properly, giving complete and correct information.

If a student should fail to sign out on any of the specified registers, she should immediately call the residence hall and ask the Head Resident or House President to sign out for her.

A student must return to the residence hall by the time she has specified on the register. Arrangements must be made ahead of time if student discovers she will be late.

RESIDENCE HALL HOURS AND DATING REGULATIONS

The front doors of each residence hall are open at 6:45 a. m. by the Head Resident or one designated by her. No student is to leave the residence hall before this hour without special permission from the Head Resident.

The side doors of the residence halls will be locked each evening at 7:15 p. m. The front doors will be locked Monday through Thursday at 10:00 p. m., Friday and Saturday at 11:00 p. m. and Sunday at 11:00 p. m.

Under no circumstances may any girl open a locked door without the permission of the Head Resident. Those girls returning to campus after closing hours must call the Head Resident before reaching the campus.

The lobbies are open to male visitors the following hours:

Monday - Thursday	12 noon - 2:00; 4:00 - 7:15
Friday	12 noon - 11:00 p. m.
Saturday	12 noon - 11:00 p. m.
Sunday	12 noon - 7:30 p. m., and again from 8:30 - 11:00 p. m.

Boys wearing bermudas may not enter the lobbies.

Girls may date in the Parlors of the residence halls, for activities on campus, in Boiling Springs and Shelby, and are permitted to go to any city within a radius of fifty miles of the college in the state of North Carolina provided they sign out properly and return by 11:00 p. m. Sophomores who maintain a "C" average may date until 11:30 p. m. each Saturday night. Second semester freshmen maintaining a "C" average may date until 11:30 the first and third Saturday nights of each month. Boys will not come into the parlor upon return at 11:30 p. m.

Girls may date on Sunday afternoon between the hours of 1:00 and 6:00 p. m., but there is to be no excessive coming and going between the quiet hours (2:00 and 4:00.) The intercom system will not be used during quiet hours to call girls for dates.

Gardner-Webb College women students are expected to maintain a high standard of conduct at all times. They should not sit in cars with boys or walk or date in uninhabited or unlighted parts of the campus, or buildings, nor walk across campus with arms around one another.

Men visitors, whether students or non-students, must be properly dressed when calling for their dates. Preferable dress includes acceptable business attire with necktie and coat. Sports shirts are permitted.

Boys accompanying the girls to the dormitory must use only the parlor entrance. The only time when boys do accompany the girls to the dormitory is during social or dating hours and when studying at the library at closing time at night.

Girls have 12:00 p. m. permission on nights when there are home football games and 11:00 p. m. permission on nights preceding holidays.

PROPER DRESS ON CAMPUS

At no time may a girl leave the residence hall with her hair rolled up.

She may not come into the lobbies of the residence hall wearing slacks, shorts, or housecoat, or with her hair rolled up during the hours when the lobbies are open for visitors. At no time may a girl come on the first floor of the residence hall without being sufficiently dressed.

Shorts, culottes and blue jeans may not be worn anywhere on the campus except when girls are participating in athletic activities, at which time skirts or coats must be worn over shorts. Bermuda shorts and pedal pushers must be worn on approved outings, supervised field trips, group skating, or other activities which require such attire. Permission for this privilege can be obtained from the Head Resident who will also advise girls when it is necessary to wear a skirt or coat over the sports wear. When leaving and returning to the campus on the weekend, girls are to wear skirts or dresses.

Sunbathers must wear swim suits. Penalties will be given if proper attire is not worn.

For information concerning the proper attire on campus for specific occasions, see "What to Wear When."

PERMISSIONS

The parents or guardians of each girl must sign and return a permission form which is sent out by the Dean of Women just prior to the student's initial entrance to the college. When this form is completed it will serve as standing permission for items approved by the parents or guardians. If at anytime it becomes necessary to make changes in this form, the girl must secure a new permission form from the Dean of Women.

Permission from parents is required for each visit in the homes of friends and relatives, unless the parents write a letter giving standing permission, which is to be filed with the Head Resident. On ALL occasions an invitation (written or phoned to the Head Resident) from the mother in the home in which the girl is to visit must be extended for each visit.

SPECIAL PERMISSIONS

In the following instances special permission must be secured from the Head Resident:

1. To spend the night off the campus Monday through Thursday.
2. To return after the residence hall doors are locked. This late permission must be obtained and a permission slip given to the Head Resident before leaving the residence hall.
3. To go home following a school activity at night.
4. To go anywhere beyond a 50 mile radius from Gardner-Webb College.
5. To be away from the campus for more than five hours at one time before 6:00 p. m.

In the following instances special permission must be secured from the Dean of Women:

1. To spend the night in homes of Boiling Springs residents. No girl is to spend the night in Boiling Springs unless visiting in the home of a relative or with Boiling Springs girls who live in the residence halls.

2. To go on all picnics, outings and special school trips.
3. In the absence of the Head Resident, girls seeking special permission will contact the Dean of Women.

It is the responsibility of the student to notify the Dean of Women and your Head Resident of any travel emergency arising enroute, or any delay in returning to the campus because of accident or illness.

ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

Women whose parents have given them permission to smoke must smoke only in their own rooms, or in the other rooms with the occupant's permission.

Office hours and regulations are posted in the Dean of Women's office and must be observed.

At no time are women students to visit in the rooms or apartments of men's residences.

Expulsion or suspension will be the penalty for the use or possession of any alcoholic beverage for any purpose. The odor of alcohol on one's breath shall be considered incriminating.

Failure to respect the property of others, appropriating the belongings of others, or flagrant dishonesty of any sort will be dealt with in like manner.

Violation of the above regulations shall be subject to judicial action by the Judicial Court.

No card playing is permitted in the lobbies of the dormitories.

MISCELLANEOUS REGULATIONS

A Dean's Conference is held periodically for the purpose of promoting the welfare of the women students on the campus. Attendance is compulsory; absences can only be excused by the Dean of Women.

Once a month all women residents are required to attend a house meeting for the purpose of creating a feeling of "togetherness" and to promote special interest activities within the residence halls.

Individual floor meetings may be called at any time it is deemed necessary.

A nightly room check will be made by the House Counselors. Each girl must be accounted for at this time.

For safety purposes it is asked that no woman student leave the campus after dark unaccompanied.

It is expected that all Gardner-Webb College women students will refrain from frequenting places of questionable reputation.

Laundry hours and regulations for the laundry room are posted in the basement and must be observed.

There is to be no loud noise, no running in halls, no sweeping of trash in halls, no coke bottles or cups left in halls, parlors or the kitchen, and no clothes left in the bathrooms. Nothing should ever be thrown from the windows.

Cans, glass and materials which will not burn are not to be put in the incinerators, but are to be put in the cans provided for them in the halls, basement, and at the side entrance of the dormitory.

Clinic hours are from 8:00 - 9:00 a. m. and 4:30 - 5:30 p. m. Sign out to go to the clinic and report sickness to the Dean of Women or Resident Counselor before missing any class because of illness. NO EXCUSES FOR ABSENCES WILL BE GRANTED UNLESS THIS IS DONE. Have a doctor or nurse write excuses for classes you miss when they provide medical services. In case of an emergency or an accident, the nurse will be "On Call" day and night. A student cannot obtain excuses for morning classes that have been missed by going to the clinic at 1:00 p. m.

A card of instructions is posted in each room regarding furniture and room care. Each student is responsible for any damage to her room. Students are to have a dust mop, a dust pan, and a wastebasket in each room. Girls are requested to wash hair in showers or in large laboratories in the basement to prevent stoppage of sinks in rooms.

Each student is responsible for keeping her room in order at all times. The rooms must be ready for inspection each day by 9:30 a. m. Rooms must be clean at all times.

Trunks are not to be stored in the rooms. A special room will be designated for storage. Only trunks and luggage will be kept in the trunk rooms.

No pets are allowed in the residences.

There is to be no cooking in the rooms. Please observe regulations posted on the kitchen door. The kitchen in HAPY and on Second floor of Stroup are to be used by the girls and the kitchen on first floor is to be used by the Dean of Women and her assistants. Please do not request to use it unless it is some special event or activity. Food kept in rooms must be kept in covered containers to prevent bugs. Do not take any silver, dish, utensil or ice-tray from the kitchen. Take only the food that belongs to you.

Picture hangers - Tacks, adhesive tape, or scotch tape are not acceptable for the walls. Acceptable hangers are obtainable at the bookstore.

Blinds are to be drawn each evening at the beginning of study session and remain drawn until lights are out.

No furniture is to be removed from any room or moved from room to room.

Each room is expected to have door stops to keep doors from slamming and from breaking the long mirrors on the doors.

Baths and showers - Observe rules posted in each bathroom.

Each girl is responsible for the key to her room. Rooms should be kept locked and girls should carry their keys with them at all times when leaving the room. Girls locked out of their rooms must see the Dean of Women or Resident Counselor to unlock the door for them.

Any particular situation not covered by these regulations will be handled by the Women's Affairs Board or House Council, and their decision will be as binding as any of the other rules and regulations. All girls should be aware of these changes or additions which will be found posted on the bulletin boards of the residence halls. When in doubt as to the proper thing to do regarding any rule or situation, consult the Dean of Women, your Head Resident, or the President of the Women's Affairs Board. All girls will be held responsible for knowing and observing all W. S. A. rules and regulations.

An examination covering the Co-Ediquette will be given to all women residents at the beginning of the year.

DISCIPLINARY ACTION

1. Warning - The first violation of minor regulations such as failure to sign out on the daily register, leaving the residence halls with hair rolled up, etc., will be called to the attention of the offender by a council member. After six warnings the offender will receive a reprimand.

2. Reprimand - A third infraction of a minor regulation or the first violation of a more serious nature such as failure to attend required meetings and some violations of special permission, etc. will be called to the attention of the violator by a letter from the house council. After receiving three reprimands of a different nature, a girl will be required to appear before the house council.

3. Appearance before the House Council - Any violation of the same regulation for which a student has received a reprimand and violations of regulations considered to be more vital to the welfare of students, such as failure to sign out on the week-end register, will subject the student to appear before the house council. The penalty which will be set may extend from a counseling experience to a week's campus.

4. Referral to the Women's Affairs Board - The house council may at any time refer such cases as they deem wise to the Women's Affairs Board.

5. Appearance before the Women's Affairs Board - Girls who violate any administrative regulation which applies just to the women students will be required to appear before the Women's Affairs Board.

6. Campus - A girl on campus must abide by the following regulations:

- a. She may hold no conversations in any form with boys, except in classes, nor may she eat with boys.
- b. She must not leave the Gardner-Webb College campus. (The campus does not include the post office.) However, she may attend church and go to the Library.
- c. She must be in her residence hall by 7:15 p. m. Freshmen must be in their residence hall by 6:00 p. m.
- d. She may not place or receive any phone calls unless they are from her immediate family or are long distance.

7. Social Restriction - Girls who are placed on social restriction must abide by the following regulations:

- a. A student on social restriction must remain in her room at all times except when attending church or classes and eating meals. She is permitted one hour for each meal.
- b. She may hold no conversations in any form with boys except in classes. A boy may not sit at her table while she is eating.
- c. She may have no visitors in her room except suitemates or members of her immediate family. These visits must be brief.
- d. She may not go to the library except for getting up special library assignments. She must be accompanied by a member of the Women's Affairs Board or by a representative from the house council of the residence hall in which she lives.
- e. No phone calls may be placed or received unless they are long distance calls or calls to or from members of her immediate family.
- f. Her room will be checked hourly by members of her house council or by members of the Women's Affairs Board.
- g. All requests for special permission must go to the Women's Affairs Board.

THE CONSTITUTION

Women's Student Association

By virtue of certain privileges granted by the college to the women students and in accordance with the constitution of the Faculty Student Government Association, we, the women students of Gardner-Webb College, in order to assume the privileges and responsibilities of self government, to develop a spirit of democracy, to uphold social standards, and to further the ideals and principles of Gardner-Webb College, do hereby ordain and establish this constitution.

ARTICLE I

General

Section 1. Name. The name of this organization shall be the Women's Student Association of Gardner-Webb College.

Section 2. Purposes. The purposes of this association are:
(1) to deal effectively with matters concerning the women students,
(2) to train them in the practice of self government, (3) to cooperate with the Dean of Women and her staff, and (4) to maintain the highest standard of honor in every phase of college life.

Section 3. Membership. All women students are members of this association from and after the time of their registration as students of Gardner-Webb College.

ARTICLE II

Officers

Section 1. Officers. The officers of this association shall be a Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, House Presidents, House Vice Presidents and Secretary and Floor Chairman.

a. The Chairman. It shall be the duty of the Chairman: (1) to call and preside over the regular meetings of the Women's Affairs Board and over convocations of women students, (2) to appoint, in conjunction with the Dean of Women and Dean of Students, all committees not otherwise provided for in these articles, (3) and to represent the association on all public occasions. By provision made in the Constitution of the Gardner-Webb College Faculty Student Government Association, she shall serve as a member of the Executive Council of the Faculty Student Government Association.

b. The Vice Chairman. The Vice Chairman shall serve as chairman of the projects committee and act in any other duties of the chairmanship that the Chairman shall ask. She shall assume the duties of the Chairman in the event that the Chairman resigns, or is unable to discharge the powers of the office, or fails to qualify for office, or if she is absent from the campus.

c. The Secretary-Treasurer. The duties of the Secretary shall be: (1) to record in an orderly fashion the minutes and proceedings of the Women's Affairs Board and the association, and (2) to post all official notices. The Secretary shall also perform all other duties that the office may require from time to time which the Chairman shall designate. As Treasurer she shall (1) prepare and keep a record of the financial proceedings of the association. (2) be chairman of the budget committee, and (3) be prepared to submit a report of the financial status of the association when requested to do so.

d. The House President. The duties of the House President in each residence hall shall be: (1) to represent the girls in her hall on the Women's Affairs Board, (2) to conduct a weekly House Council Meeting, (3) to check the registers, and (4) to report all residence hall activities or problems to the Women's Affairs Board.

e. The House Vice President. The duties of the House Vice President shall be: (1) to perform the duties of the president in the event of her absence, and (2) to become house president in the event this office is vacated.

f. The Floor Chairmen. The duties of the Floor Chairmen shall be: (1) to act in matters dealing with unnecessary noise and improper conduct on their floors and be responsible for all irregularities, (2) to report immediately to the House President or Head Resident any irregularity which she cannot handle, (3) to meet weekly with the House Council and meet the first Monday of each month with the Women's Affairs Board unless another time is designated by the Chairman, (4) to maintain quiet on her floor, especially during the hours between 7:15 p. m. and 11:30 p. m., and (5) to check rooms and report to the House President after the nightly room check. They must keep an accurate account of the whereabouts of the girls on their floors at all times.

Section 2. Qualifications of Officers. All Women's Affairs Board members shall be of the incoming sophomore class. All officers shall have a 2.0 (c) average. The Women's Affairs Board may nominate candidates from those girls meeting the other requirements for the office and having served on the dormitory House Councils. All girls must be approved by the Dean of Women and Dean of Students.

Section 3. Method of Nominations. A nominating committee, composed of a representative from each residence hall, appointed by the Chairman, shall nominate not less than two and not more than four candidates for the positions on the Women's Affairs Board. In all nominating, the student's overall average shall be considered. Other nominations, provided that they meet the qualifications of office, may be made from the floor at the time of the presentation of the nominations.

a. The nominating committee shall nominate names for Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary-Treasurer. These names are to be approved by the Women's Affairs Board and the Dean of Women, and the Dean of Students. The names of the nominees shall be posted for one week before the election is to take place.

b. The nominating committee shall submit to the Women's Affairs Board the nominations for House Presidents, and upon their approval, these names shall be presented to the respective constituents.

c. The House President and House Vice President and Secretary-Treasurer shall present to the Women's Affairs Board the nominees for floor chairmen in their respective residence halls. Upon approval of these names, they shall be presented to their respective constituents.

Section 4. Election of Officers. The Chairman of the Women's Affairs Board shall be elected in keeping with the Faculty Student Government Association Constitution. The offices of Vice Chairman, Secretary-Treasurer shall be filled by popular election by secret ballot the week following the student body elections. The House Presidents in each residence hall shall be elected by popular ballot by the residents of each residence hall in the spring of the year as soon as the residents of each hall have been determined.

Section 5. Terms of Office. The Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary-Treasurer shall assume the duties of their respective offices at the end of installation of officers and shall serve until their successors have been duly elected and qualified under the provisions of this constitution. The House Presidents and House Vice Presidents and the Floor Chairmen shall assume their duties at the beginning of the fall term and will work with the outgoing officers from the time of election.

ARTICLE III Departments

Section 1. The Women's Affairs Board. The Women's Affairs Board shall consist of the Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary-Treasurer, and House Presidents.

Section 2. The General Council. The General Council shall consist of the Women's Affairs Board, The House Vice Presidents, and the Floor Chairmen.

Section 3. The House Councils. The House Councils shall consist of the House Presidents, House Vice Presidents, Secretaries, and the Floor Chairmen of each hall.

Section 4. Duties of the Women's Affairs Board and Councils. It shall be the duty of the Women's Affairs Board and House Councils to meet every week to enforce the rules and regulations of the associated women students and to consider any necessary business. The General Council shall meet the first Monday of each month, unless otherwise designated by the Chairman.

Section 5. Suspension of Officers. Members of these bodies will be automatically dropped if they are absent, without just cause, from more than two meetings during their term of office. Any members not carrying out her duties or failing to uphold the standard of her office may be suspended.

ARTICLE IV

Meetings

Section 1. The First Meeting. A meeting shall be held as soon as possible after the beginning of the college year, at which time the Chairman shall explain the purpose of the association and the rules governing the associated women students. At this time the constitution shall be adopted by the members present.

Section 2. Regular Meetings. A meeting shall be called at any time by the Chairman in conjunction with the Dean of Women. Attendance at these meetings is compulsory.

Section 3. Special Meetings. A special orientation of freshmen and transfer students shall be held during the first week of the college year. Attendance is compulsory.

ARTICLE V

Advisors

Section 1. The Advisors of the Association. The Dean of Women shall be head advisor to the Women's Affairs Board and General Council, and she shall attend all meetings if it is possible for her to do this. The Head Residents in each hall shall advise the House Councils.

ARTICLE VI

Provisions for Appeal

Section 1. Appeals. A member has the right to appeal any decision. Appeals must go to the higher body in accordance with the following order: House Council, Women's Affairs Board, Judicial Council, Final student authority rests in the Judicial Council of the Faculty Student Government Association.
