but high that is those I like. I wish you had looked at them for I don't know which color you prefer. Will have her select one this evening & write & let her know. So you will not have to say anything against - as you wouldn't look at them yourself - The silk she sent me to line with is at 1.00 a yard which will make dress very expensive. Did she say she would fix winter dress & organza waist? She didn't write anything about it. I have been writing some bills for Papa this morning & will send some more

This evening. I will have
to write Miss Amy in.
See Papa & Uncle Beck
coming now will finish
later. Thorough with dinner
& it is now four o'clock
will have to hurry to

letters off. Would send

Dear Madge, —

As mamma is
writing to you and Ralph
I will too. How are you?
We are all very well.
I was sick the night you
went off. School starts

To-morrow Mr. Carr is here
He played the organ at Sunday
School this morning. One
of Mrs. Scates twin baby
is dead. It died this morning
mamma has been up there
a little while. Mamma
might go to Rutherford
to-morrow at 11 o'clock &
I will stay over to grand
ma's for dinner and all
week. I wish I could go

with her but I can't for
she will go the very day
school starts. Dove said
for you to write to her.
The other night mamma
& myself were eating
supper & mamma wanted
an onion. I went to get
one and when I was
under the house Martha
knocked at the door. It
scared me and I forgot

the house was there & I
bumped my back. It hurt
too. Mamma come to the win-
dow with the lamp to see
if I was hurt but I wasn't
We both laughed till we
cried. "Now haint that
funny." I got my room
fix'd up fine. I will close
because I want to write
to Ralph. Good-by.
