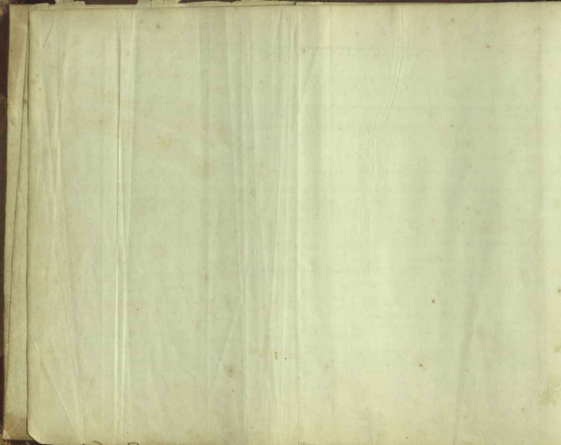

No eulogy at our hands is necessary to fix his virtues in the hearts of those who knew him. His own honest, guileless life wrote itself into our heart-strings without any effort on his part. And when his death was announced, all hearts who loved him--and all loved him--were torn and lacerated and cast in gloom. We bless our Master for the life of our dear young brother--a young man who had no enemies, against whom no one could say aught: everybody's friend and to whom everybody was a friend.

The distinctive element in his life and character--and they are the noblest in the make-up of a man--were, unselfishness and purity utterly without guile and devoid of malice. The words malice and envy did not appear anywhere in his lexicon of life. Unselfish! yes! even

To the sacrifice of his own sweet life a fitting close for such a life that he laid it down to save his companion. Greater love hath no man than this, and as the cruel waters enveloped him for last sleep he triumphed in the sacrifice even like the savior of men triumphed on Calvary:

Whether on the cross uplifted high
 Or in the battles van
 The fittest place for man to die
 Is where he dies for man.

It seems to us finite beings who grieve for him that such a gentle sunshiny life should have had a less tragic close, but without murmuring, we remember that God doeth all things well, and paraphrasing a stanza of The Eternal Goodness, by Whittier, we have our feelings expressed:

We long for household voices gone
 For vanished smiles we long
 But God hath led our dear one on
 And we can do no wrong

In the Church on the playground everywhere he was one of nature's young noblemen. With sympathies with the bereaved parents, he was ~~their~~ son but our Stough. And though it was just five years from the time he was buried in baptism to the time earth opened to receive him, it is a beautiful and consoling thought to his mother and father, that they had such a lovely flower to bloom on earth and so soon to be transplanted to adorn the garden of paradise. Bro. O. M. Mull made a short talk stating that the need of financial assistance was urgent and that the trustees had not been doing a selfish work but were appointed by the King Mtn. Association and had been laboring in behalf of the school and had individually assumed large personal liability, and it was earnestly desired that the people of the two Associations would aid in the work liberally with their means. But that the Committee did not feel that the Shelby Church would be willing to assume a financial liability as a corporate body. But that if the Committee was mistaken in this and the Church did desire to assume financial liability it was free to do so. But, to get the matter before the Church the Committee desired to introduce the following resolution, which resolution

was presented by the unanimous opinion of the Committee as to what our Church would be willing to do, but that it did not accord with the unanimous personal opinions of the Committee. The following Resolution was then read before the Church Conference, to wit:

"Resolved that the relation of the Shelby Baptist Church to the Bailing Springs High School shall be fraternal and that we extend to it our cordial good will and commendation, but that we deem it inexpedient for our Church as a corporate body, to assume any financial relation or responsibility to said School but recommend that each member of the Church assume separately and individually such financial assistance as each one may feel to be his duty."

On motion the foregoing Resolution was then adopted by the Conference with but one or two dissenting votes and declared adopted by the moderator.

Bro. Geo. S. English another member of the Committee made a brief but urgent appeal in behalf of the Bailing Springs High School and offered the following Resolution:

"Resolved, That this Church send three delegates to the Convention of Churches, called for Nov. 8th, 1908 to consider the relation of the Churches to the Bailing Springs High School, and that these delegates are hereby authorized and instructed to cooperate by their

to counsel and assist in any plans that may be adopted by the Convention, provided such plans are in accordance with the resolution adopted this day defining the relation of this Church to this work.

On motion said resolution was adopted.

On motion it was ordered that the Choir (or present pastor) appoint the three members of said Committee.

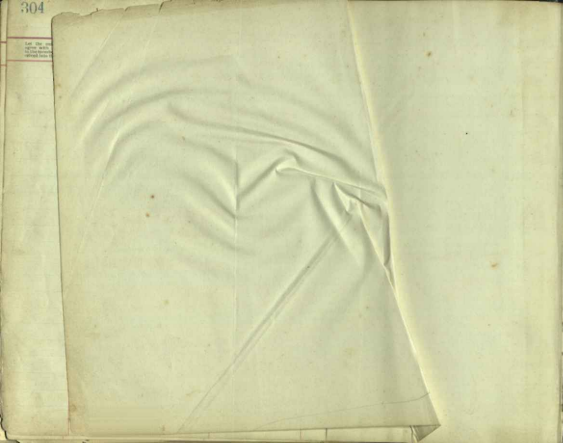
