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Administration Building in Use at Gardner-Webb

BOILING SPRINGS — Finishing touches are being put on a new administration building at Gardner-Webb College. Construction began in March of this year. Administrative offices are already in operation in the new building.

It houses offices for the president, vice-president, business manager, dean of instruction, public relations officers, and headquarters for the Development Program, the Religion department and the Church-Community department.

The building is officially named the Webb Administration Building, honoring "... Mrs. O. Max Gardner, and in memory of her parents, Judge and Mrs. James Landrum Webb, and grandparents, the Rev. and Mrs. George Milton Webb, and the Rev. James Milton Webb."

The structure is a result of one of the first gifts in a \$550,000 fund-raising campaign that began with Founders' Day and Homecoming celebrations in 1959. Honorary chairman of the campaign, O. Max Gardner, Jr., announced the gift from the O. Max Gardner Foundation, Inc., at one of the first meetings of the cam-

paign leaders.

The building was constructed at an approximate cost of \$75,000. General contractor was Neal Construction Company, Forest City.


Webb Administration Building is a two-story brick structure, 37 by 85 feet, in Williamsburg Colonial style, in keeping with the architectural style of the other recently - constructed buildings on the campus.

The inside finish is cement block and striated plywood, with tile floors, acoustical ceiling, and fluorescent lighting. The building is air-conditioned, and is heated from the central heating plant on the campus.


Further plans for expansion of the college plant call for construction of a science building, to be located between Dover Library and Decker Hall.

Dr. Philip L. Elliott, president of the college, has expressed hope that the new science building will be completed for the 1961-62 school year.

Working plans will be made the last of November, at which time the administration hopes to receive bids.


