- To provide physical activities for youth which can be carried over into adult recreational life.
- To seek to teach adults enjoyable and recreative activities in which they can continue to participate throughout life.
- To promote physical fitness and thus develop healthier, happier Christian individuals.
- To provide physical activities which will promote fun, self-improvement, and personal satisfaction.
- To provide a release from emotional tensions.
- To teach playing skills and knowledge of the rules of play.
- To foster the development of leader-10. ship, "followship", and group spirit.
