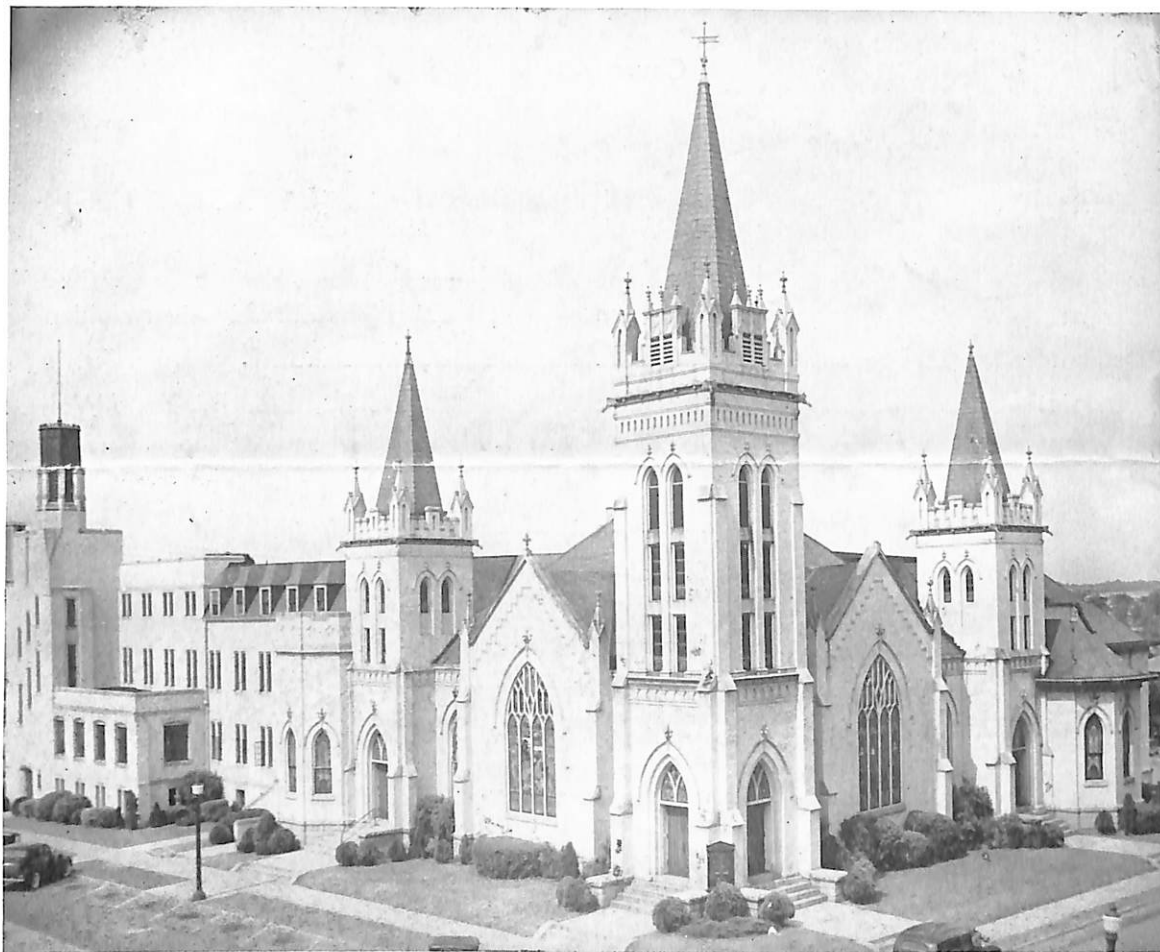

FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH

Organized on June 19, 1846, and the first Church building was constructed soon thereafter. This building was a wooden structure and the auditorium seated about 200 people. Outgrowing the facilities, the second building was erected in 1889. This was of brick. The congregation and membership increased and in 1910 another building was constructed, part of which is still standing. The Church outgrew the auditorium and educational equipment. In 1928 another building program was launched and on Easter Sunday, 1929, the congregation began worshipping in the present spacious remodeled auditorium and using the newly constructed educational building. "The Lord hath done great things for us, whereof we are glad."
