Bells Will Ring



GROUNDBREAKING—Gardner-Webb University (GWU) broke ground July 30 for the construction of a bell tower at the Lake Hollifield Complex on campus. More than 40 bells will hang in the 70-foot structure when completed.

The tower is made possible by a gift from Wyndolyn and the late Hughy Hollifield of Winston-Salem to GWU's \$20 million "Dreaming, Daring, Doing" capital campaign. Four years ago the couple committed \$1 million toward the creation of a six-acre recreational complex on the campus, complete with a lake, walking trails, picnic areas and the bell tower. Completion of the tower is set for November.


Gardner-Webb receives gift to fund bell tower

ardner-Webb University (GWU) has received a gift for its \$20 million "Dreaming, Daring, Doing" capital campaign for use in the construction of a unique bell tower and plaza on the GWU campus.

The gift was made by Wyndolyn Hollifield and her husband, the late Hughy Hollifield of Winston-Salem. The Hollifields, prior to Mr. Hollifield's death in May, paid off — ahead of schedule — a multi-year pledge of \$1 million for the construction of a lake complex. The early completion of the gift provided enough funds for the construction of the bell tower and plaza.
