Burrell Blanton, son of Geo. Blanton, who came
to N.C. from Va. settled in Tryon Co. now
Cleveland Co. N.C. Burrell Blanton was born
1762, and was drafted in Rutherford Co. 1782
and served as a private at the age of
17 years, for 3 months and 10 days at the
close of the war in Capt. Neval's Company

Capt. John Earle's N.C. Militia.

The pension records say he was still a resident of Cleveland Co. in 1858, he was therefore ~~three~~ ^{over} nearly 100 years old!

On Feb. 27, 1859 warrant no. 59093 for 160 acres of bounty land was issued on account of above service.

His father, Geo. Blanton was born 1740, moved to N.C. from Va. and in his early life was a Justice of the Peace and the Colonial Records give evidence of his service in the State 1765-1775.

He was one of the petitioners to establish the S.C. line and did service for the King's most Excellent Majesty.
