#### PROF. HUGGINS

The memorial statement impressed in the gray granite composition expresses the deep regard former students hold in their hearts for Professor James Dwyre Huggins, Sr. Professor Huggins was not only instrumental in helping to get the Boiling Springs High School started, but he was the institution's first principle and the college's first Dean.

The man for whom this landmark was erected neither enjoyed a view of the Arch nor the Christian college to which Gardner-Webb has evolved, for he died April 19, 1932. His memory lived on and under the leadership of Jesse E. Bridges, president of the Alumni Association of 1943, and the many alumni donors, the monumental Arch was erected.

The arch was repositioned a few feet in 1946 to accommodate widening of the street in front of the college. Since that time thousands of students and graduates have passed under its memorial inscription to go into the world as teachers, preachers, missionaries, doctors. lawyers, business men and women, and Christian mothers and fathers.

The walk to the Gardner-Webb Administration Building is now being landscaped with shrubs and in the very near future the pillars on which the arch rests, will be permanently placed.
