Dear Mum and Cousin Mary:-

I much appreciated your letter that was awaiting me when I got back from Mission Meeting last week. I sent them on to Jane and Flora. No, Mum, the green dress is not worn out but will do no service again this spring and summer. The Chinese like loose styles so it has been all right to wear it without the belt. It is kind of you to offer to send me another. Pollen has sent me some since I came back and I gave Flora one; the sleeves were too small for me, and also gave Dr. King one when she went to meet her daughter in Shanghai last Nov. We do not care to keep up with styles and, as the dresses prove fine and save not only the expense of buying new ones but also time and thought in making them after getting them made which I should have to do as Judie spoilt me, like Esbie did you sister, by always doing my sewing and I am not capable of making my own!

Our Chinese friends do not know much about our styles, and if we go to Shanghai, as I shall have to do to get some dental work done, are many months, that is such a cosmopolitan place we can wear any thing we have and still not be very conspicuous. There are always some who are a little more out of style than we!! I am still using the Gorona you used, Cousins, and the circle gave me, and always most grateful for it. I also use the tan pillow Esbie gave me, in our sitting room, and I always recall most pleasantly the time spent in your home. How I wish I might have a visit from you four, in return! I am alone, in the last home Pleasant on Lena built, but keep busy and so very seldom think of my being alone.

We are having the equinoxial rain and if it will warm up after I hope to get some gardening done. It is still cool. As glad Cousin Mary can be with you. I thought she would like to see what the Chinese put on O.P.'s tomb stone. If she wants to send it to Bib. Researcher, please one of you copy it.
