Dear Mrs. Gardner:

Have hoped that you would pass this way again soon, and I could tell you what I have been able to get done about moving your graves to Concord. So I have not written, been away part of the time and the balance just too plain lazy. besides am a sorry letter writer.

Aunt Drusilla is not very well her heart has gone bad. Some sort of an ailment of the heart that bears a Latin name about two yards long and begins with asmatic. She says she does not suffer. and except for occasional weak spells appears about as usual. She gets around the house as she likes. The Doctor says she is liable to go at any time. She is sitting on the kitchen porch now stringing beans for dinner. She often mentions you and Judge Welles.

If you want the graves moved to Concord, Alfred will come up and select the place. They can be moved in the latter part of July or first of August at very little expense. Did you get the "permit as ordered by the church" They have given you permission to bury them at any place you select on the church property. I can tell you much better in person. I'm not much of a "teller" with a pen.

If you cant read this dont bring it to me I cant either.
