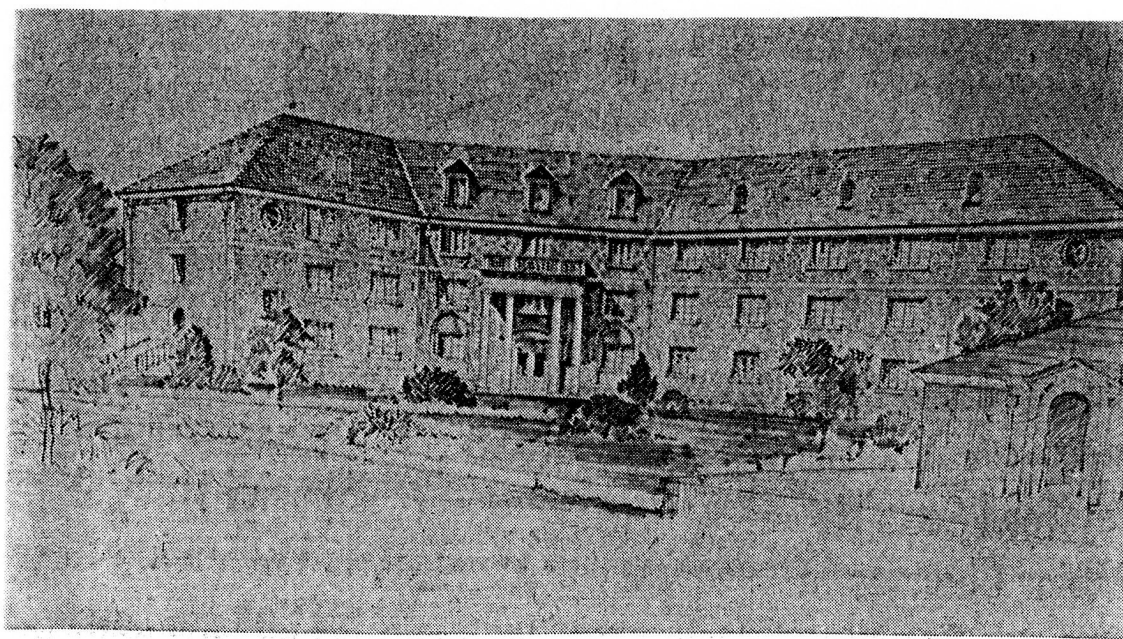

G-W To Receive Bids On New Dormitory

BOILING SPRINGS—Gardner-Webb College is ready to receive bids on a new girls' dormitory, it was announced today by Arnold W. Kincaid of Kings Mountain, chairman of the building committee.

The committee met last night at the college and voted approval of the architects' plans. The building will be three stories, of brick construction, and will house 100 girls. It will be fireproof construction, and in architectural design will conform to other new buildings on the campus.

Bids will be opened at the college Sept. 30 at 2:30 p.m., and plans call for ground to be broken on Oct. 2. Aug. 15, 1956, is to be set by the college as completion date.

Senator Sam J. Ervin and Congressman Woodrow Jones are among the dignitaries expected to be present for the groundbreaking ceremony. Senator Ervin will be principal speaker for the occasion, which launches a drive for building funds in Cleveland and Rutherford counties.

This represents the first step in actual construction in the current expansion program. The trustees have approved plans for six new buildings by Gardner-Webb's Golden Anniversary in 1957.

Other proposed buildings include a boys' dormitory, faculty apartments, and buildings for physical education, science, and classrooms and administration. A total of almost \$1 million is needed for new buildings, plus \$740,000 for additional endowment.
