Area Leaders Reflect Confidence In College

GARDNER-WEBB LAUNCHES NEW ERA . . . TRUSTEES VOTE TO ENTER A CAPITAL FUND CAMPAIGN

Prayer For Challenge Brings Unusual Task for Youthful GW Student

Bob Campbell asked "God to give him a challenge this summer" and he has done just that. The rising junior at Gardner-Webb College left school in May for student mission work in Illinois with the Home Mission Board and now, to his surprise, he has a tremendous work in urban Chicago as pastor of a church.



Bobby went to his home church in the Middleburg Area, Mt. Airy, Woodland Baptist Church, and discussed the challenge with his pastor, the Rev. W. G. Davis. Both agreed that he needed to be ordained before accepting the ministerial position of the Rogers Park Baptist Church of Chicago. "I was before the Ordination Committee of the Association and received a unanimous vote with a resolution commending me on the matter in which I answered my questions during the examination," stated the new Reverend Campbell.

He was ordained June 5 and now from work in the Chicago church (7033 North Paulina St., Chicago) which is the only Baptist church in a 12 block section with a population of 8,000 persons and a total church field of approximately 30,000 people.

His assignment in this work came from the Home Mission Board and Rev. Campbell left June 15 to begin the task. His home address is c/o Mr. and Mrs. Robert Lee Campbell, 1400 Meadow Lane, Charlotte, N. C.

Anonymous Excerpts From Campaign Survey

I think the administration and faculty have developed Gardner-Webb into a good college. . . . Dr. Poston has accomplished wonders at the college. Am impressed with the faculty. . . . In recent years the academic standing has improved considerably and is getting better every year. . . . I would like to visit a year. The area is in need of a four year college.

I have been talking to a lot of local people and we are going to get contributions from Methodists and Lutherans because they want a four year college in the community. I think we will be able to raise a lot of money here in Gaston County.

Gardner-Webb College's Board of Trustees and Board of Advisors in a joint session May 20 voted unanimously to enter a capital fund campaign with Marts and Lundy, Inc. of New York City as professional counsel.

Dr. E. Eugene Poston, president of the college, stated that exact dates involving the campaign will be announced in the near future. Marts and Lundy, Inc. worked with the college in a campaign of five years ago when nearly \$2.5 million was raised for physical facilities and endowment.

"One purpose in this is to put our four year program over the top and to insure for this area an outstanding, accredited senior college by 1971," stated Dr. Poston. Now an accredited junior college, Gardner-Webb will put in its junior year this fall and its senior year in 1970-71.

The joint action by the boards reflects confidence derived from an intensive survey of the area by Marts and Lundy in five major areas of interest; confidence in college leadership, desire to work and give in a campaign, attitude toward the college and estimated degree of interest. Gardner-Webb showed large jumps in favorable opinion over a similar survey in 1964.

Out of 80 key persons interviewed a high regard was expressed for the president, the trustees, alumni, administration, staff and faculty. Some of the reasons for this response were: helping local young people get a four-year degree while living at home; a source of college graduates for area businesses and industry; a selling point for industry when bringing in new employees and a rich source of culture and creativity for the area.

Accreditation is a four year college under the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools which first came in 1973 when the first class is graduated. Accreditation criteria around these focal points: Purpose, Organization and Administration, Educational Program, Financial Resources, Faculty, Library, Student Personnel and Physical Plant.

Largest Budget Ever At GW Is Approved

The largest budget in the history of Gardner-Webb College was approved May 26 by the Board of Trustees. The college will operate on a \$3,200,000 budget in 1969-70—a \$500,000 increase from 1968-69.

Much of the increase is reflected in the college's move to put in its third year this fall. The senior year will begin in 1970-71 year.

The employment of 26 additional persons at the college to help handle the increased duties of teaching was a major portion of the budget increase. Of these 24 persons, 12 of them have the doctorate degree, seven have three years of academic training beyond the bachelor's degree and five have the master's degree and above.

The college income was \$2,462,233 in 1968-69. It was not until 1966-67 that income topped the \$1 million mark. Since that time, income has increased steadily as the school grew in how and gained endowment and other support.

Endowment, including a trust fund, tops the \$2 million mark and there are now over 120 persons, including faculty, staff and administration, employed at the college.

In its third year program, the college will have already met accreditation standards in the critical areas of faculty and library. The faculty standards call for one-third of the faculty to have the doctorate degree in the field of study in which they are teaching and that over 80 per cent of the faculty have three years of study beyond the bachelor's degree. The library is required to have at least 50,000 volumes. Gardner-Webb now has over 40,000 selected volumes and will meet the 50,000 volume figure by the end of 1969-70.

Financial resources requirements are that a senior college of GW's size must spend \$1,115,000 yearly on its educational programs, plus \$450 per student for every student over 1,000 enrolled. The college is already meeting this four year standard as a junior college.

Herbert C. Richman of Marts and Lundy presented the firm's report on recent findings which come from a survey. The survey was made over several weeks in the area in which the college is located. J. Stoker Barr of Marts and Lundy conducted the sampling among 60 members of the college's community, including trustees, former trustees, associates, alumni, deans, directors, area leaders and friends.

Five key questions were asked: What is their attitude toward the college? Do they approve the fund-raising program? Will they give? Will they work on committees for the campaign? The estimated degree of interest

Behind Wayne in the pre-registration line was his sister, Mrs. Bonnie (R. E.) Price. She is the widow of a former trustee of the college and is a 1943 graduate of Gardner-Webb. A resident of Rutherfordton, she is now having a home constructed in Boiling Springs and will complete her final two years of college work.

She is one of three sons of Wayne who have attended Gardner-Webb. The other two are Miss Annie Leona Roberts of Charlotte and Shelby who graduated in 1937 and Mrs. Vera Guy Blanton (neé Roberts) of 220 N. Post Road at Shelby who attended GW in 1937-38.
