I sincerely regret that I have not been able to adequately reply to your letter of May 5 until now. I have been out of the city for over a month.

I am enclosing a genealogical chart with my Webb Ancestry line to Daniel Webb. Unfortunately, I do not have any information beyond that point. I have a rather large file concerning the descendants of the Reverend James Milton Webb, who was born in Rutherford County in 1802; however, I do not believe at this time you are interested in this rather complete and long list.
