Dear Mr. Tate:

We still have not heard from you about the location for 2 cabinets in the Office Room and possible location for 2 future cabinets. Can the cabinets be separated, one against the Vault wall and one against the wall next to the telephone desk? The cabinets are 2'-2" x 4'-7" and you want 2'-6" clear to the wall, each end, when they are separate or placed together. Therefore only one can be against the Vault wall. As these units weigh 2,000 lbs. each, we will need to place supports below the floor slab. We therefore need to know exactly where they will be placed.

We also need to know the size and position for all underfloor telephone conduit, from outside in, from inside out, to the Telephone Desk, etc, as needed now and for possible later need. The concrete slab cannot be poured in the cabinet room, nor in the Foyer until all telephone requirements are known and taken care of.

You probably have answers to our questions by now. We need to settle this matter soon so that the floor slab can be poured. You are over this way right often. I will appreciate your coming by our office or to the Webb Building to discuss your exact needs and for your advice. Please phone me before coming over.
