Annual Fund Sets Record: \$ 21,158

GARDNER-WEBB College's 1972-73 Annual Fund has set an impressive record. When the year ended on June 30, alumni and friends of the college had given and pledged \$21,158.58, well over the fund's goal of \$17,500.

The Annual Fund helps defray general operating costs at the college, and thus touches nearly every area of student and campus life. In a particular way, it is a "living endowment" to help underwrite the cost of Christian college education for Gardner-Webb's young men and women students.

Jack Creech of Shelby, who is the new president of the GWC Alumni Association, served as chairman of last year's successful Annual Fund campaign. Administratively, the drive is a responsibility of the alumni activities department, headed by Jerry Walker, director of alumni activities. And, traditionally, it has been Gardner-Webb's alumni who have responded most generously to the need. Some have given in appreciation for the education they themselves received at Gardner-Webb, in a spirit of love for alma mater, and in support of the goals of Gardner-Webb in providing "extra-dimensional" education for present students.

Gifts also have come from many friends of the college who believe in its purposes and want to assist students.

IMMEDIATELY, as the 1972-73 Annual Fund closed June 30, alumni began looking toward the 1973-74 year and the challenge of increasing Annual Fund support for the college.

Goal for the new year is \$25,000 and alumni officials are confident that it can be met with the continuing loyalty and help of the college's former students and friends.
