BOILING SPRINGS — A full schedule of events which began last night with a bonfire and pep rally will be on tap for students, alumni and friends of Gardner-Webb College as the college observes homecoming this weekend.

It will be a packed weekend from the bonfire last night through a Saturday night concert with a top recording star, Rick Nelson, whose record "Garden Party" is number one this week on the pop music ratings.

Tonight at 7 o'clock the annual Founder's Day Dinner will be held with Dr. E. Eugene Poston, president of the college, as the speaker. At that time the formal dedication of the new John R. Dover, Jr. Memorial Chapel will take place.

Saturday morning at 10 o'clock the cornerstone placement of the chapel will take place with a small copper box filled with present day college mementos being sealed in the chapel structure. Following the cornerstone laying the chapel will be open for public inspection.

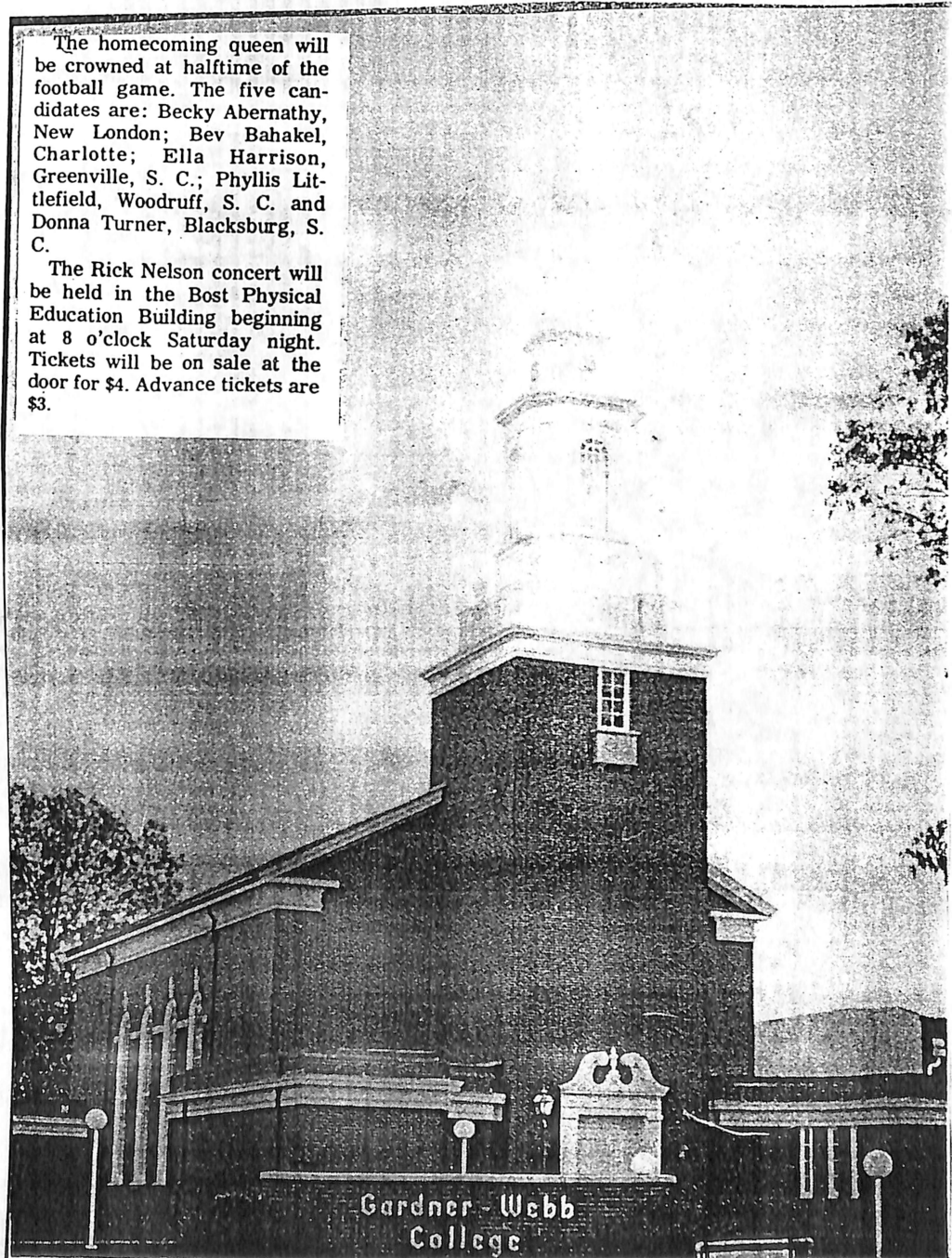
Registration of guests of the college and alumni will take place from 10 o'clock until 1 o'clock in the Charles I. Dover Campus Center. There will also be open house in the residence halls from 11 o'clock until noon.

The afternoon's activity is built around the annual football game matching G-W with Mars Hill, a traditional rival. Two years ago the Bulldogs whipped Mars Hill 18-13 in the homecoming game and last year the Lions gained revenge by beating Gardner-Webb 27-13 in their homecoming game in Mars Hill.

Despite the fact that Mars Hill is a favorite, Bulldog followers have high hopes that Coach George Litton's men will pull an upset.

The homecoming queen will be crowned at halftime of the football game. The five candidates are: Becky Abernathy, New London; Bev Bahakel, Charlotte; Ella Harrison, Greenville, S. C.; Phyllis Littlefield, Woodruff, S. C. and Donna Turner, Blacksburg, S. C.

The Rick Nelson concert will be held in the Bost Physical Education Building beginning at 8 o'clock Saturday night. Tickets will be on sale at the door for \$4. Advance tickets are \$3.
