## Carolina Freight Makes New Computer Possible

The department of business administration of Gardner-Webb College is anxious awaiting the arrival of a new computer system for the college. Through the generosity of Carolina Freight Company of Cherryville, N.C., a Honeywell 390 computer has been acquired, which will make many new areas of instruction possible, and fill many administrative needs.

The new Honeywell computer is vastly different from the one the college has been using. The Honeywell computer has a memory of 42,000 positions, an 800 card per minute card reader, 5 magnetic tape drives, 2 magnetic disk drives, and an 1100 line per minute printer.

The acquiring of the new computer system was made possible by the need for Carolina Freight to upgrade their facilities to a more powerful system.

Besides enhancing the capabilities of the administrative needs of budgeting, record keeping, registration, grade reporting, and financial reports of the college, the new computer will be used primarily in the academic programs.

In making this announcement, Deck Andrews, chairman of the department of business, said, "We are very excited about our new computer system and feel that now we will be able to expand our curriculum and offer courses to the entire student body. We will be able to teach our students on a system that is very much like what they will encounter in the real business world."

At present, Gardner-Webb offers these computer-related courses: accounting, COBOL, RPG, Fortran, computer concepts, principles and fundamentals. With the acquisition of the new computer several more computer-related courses can be developed by the college, and the computer fee will be dropped from the present \$125 to \$55. This will give each student an opportunity to take courses related to the computer and strengthen their academic program.

The computer will be moved into the area being remodeled for it is the Webb Administration Building by August 1 and is expected to be fully functional soon after the start of the fall semester.

## Gardner-Webb Receives "Webb's Universe"

Edwin Yates Webb, Jr., of Gastonia has presented Gardner-Webb College with a large beautifully framed copy of the speech his father made in Congress May 8, 1866, which was responsible for the sealing of the Kings Mountain Battleground monument and the naming of the battlefield as a national park.

This presentation, Mr. Webb says, is only the beginning, however. He has made arrangements for Gardner-Webb to receive the entire "Webb's Universe." "Webb's Universe" is a unique gathering of thousands of bits of mementos relating to Mr. Webb's family. There are thousands of pictures of family and friends, newspaper clippings, cards given to him at his father's day, curiosities, lamps, framed declarations of his philosophies, all housed in a special building 12 x 36 x 6 feet and designed and constructed by Webb. The building now is near his home on the Belmont City road in Gastonia, but is completely portable, and will at sometime in the future be transported to a suitable location on the Gardner-Webb campus.

Webb is obviously proud of his family and his country, and his family has meant much to his country. He tells of a great grandfather named Gaston, who inspired the name of his home county, of his father, E.Y. Webb, who served in the U.S. Congress from Shelby for 20 years, and was also a federal judge. Webb, himself, is an inventor, a scientist, a photographer, an engineer, and a craftsman. He is a graduate of what is now North Carolina State University with masters degree from Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Webb is especially proud of his two sons, one now dead, who followed their dad into engineering fields. A special area of Webb's life is devoted to the memory of his younger son, Eugene, who died three years ago. His "little red-headed boy" is how Webb refers to him. Webb says he has always read extensively, as many as 36 newspapers and four magazines regularly. All that so he could be able to answer his sons' questions. But, he emphasizes, when he didn't know an answer, he'd go to the library because he wanted "always to be correct."

Duplicates of the famed "Kings Mountain" speech of his father are located in the museums at the battleground and at the Shelby Hall of Fame.

## Alumna, Alumnus, Alumnum

There is much confusion about the appropriate term for a graduate of an institution because the most widely used terms are Latin words, with plural, possessive and objective usages governed by the rules of declension of Latin nouns.

To facilitate correct use of the proper words for the proper persons, we are providing for your reference the basic singular and plural forms of the word formed from the base root "alumnus—," in the nominative, or subject case.

Masculine singular:	alumnus
Feminine singular:	alumna
Masculine plural:	alumni
Feminine plural:	alumnae

The term "alumni" is also used in schools English language-instruction groups of "alumnus" and "alumnae," regardless of gender. Therefore we have an "alumni" association. Many Latin pundits would have this term be "alumnae," because that is the neuter plural word. But the confusion between an "alumnae" (meaning woman graduate) and "alumni" (meaning a group of male graduates) would be endless.

If there is ever any doubt as to the appropriate term for a person who is a graduate, then he/she/it may be correctly referred to in the neuter singular: "alumna."

Now for the possessive, or genitive, case...

# Charles E. Mack, Jr. Steps Down


