Dr. Craven E. Williams Named President of GWC

Dr. Craven Edward Williams is the new president of Gardner-Webb College.

Dr. Williams was named ninth president of the College, July 30, 1976, by the Board of Trustees. At the time of his appointment, he was serving as vice president of Davidson College.

Prior to beginning his work at Davidson in 1975, Dr. Williams was vice president of Mary Baldwin College, Staunton, Va., from 1970 to 1975. The two previous years, he was vice president for development at Mary Baldwin. From 1965 to 1968, he was assistant director of development and alumni affairs at Wake Forest University.

Dr. Williams received the B.A. degree in 1962 from Wake Forest University. From 1962 to 1965, he attended Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, where he earned the Master of Divinity degree. He engaged in graduate studies at Wake Forest University from 1965 to 1968. In 1971, he entered Union Theological Seminary, Richmond, Va., where he was awarded the Doctor of Ministries degree in 1973.

During the time he was a student at Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, he was pastor of the Wakeminster Baptist Church, Raleigh, N.C.

His educational emphases include philosophy and English on the undergraduate level, church history in the seminary, and Christian ethics and Biblical studies on the graduate level.

Dr. Williams has taught religion and philosophy, Biblical studies, and psychology dealing with leadership behavior. He has been a division co-

ordinator of professional training and experiential learning with the responsibility for accounting, career planning, education, experiential programs, physical education, and social work.

His professional interests include the development and advancement of independent, church-related education; the liberal arts emphasizing a field of concentration, interdisciplinary relationships, and international perspectives; and faculty development programs.

While attending Wake Forest, Dr. Williams was chosen for "Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities." He held membership in Omicron Delta Kappa and was president of Kappa Alpha Order. He played varsity football and was named to the Atlantic Coast

Conference Honor Roll.

He was born January 27, 1940, at Monroe, N.C., and is the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Howard Williams of Monroe. His wife is the former Miss Mary Elizabeth Parker of Marshville, N.C. She holds a B.A. Degree from the University of N.C. at Greensboro. She has been a teacher in the North Carolina Public Schools.

Dr. and Mrs. Williams are the parents of two children, a son, Joseph Howard born in 1968 and a daughter, Lee Hunley, born in 1968.

Although having been on campus only one month, Dr. Williams has earned the respect and support of the students, faculty, staff, alumni and others with whom he has been in contact. It appears that Gardner-Webb College has found a real winner in Dr. Craven Edward Williams.

Alumnus James "Frog" Sullivan '51 Author Of New Book

Those alumni and friends of Gardner-Webb who were associated with the college in the early 60's will surely remember James "Frog" Sullivan as a star football player. From the GWC campus "Frog" went on to receive his B.A. degree from the University of Tennessee. Later he earned a M.S. in Special Education and Educational Psychology at Central State University in Oklahoma.

Recently "Frog" authored a book, *The Frog Who Never Became a Prince*, which tells two stories. One is an exciting race against time and one of the most devastating hurricanes ever to hit the Texas Gulf Coast. Frog is trying to get home to his wife, Carolyn, through the storm at night. Bulldogs Are Described As "Older And Wiser"

Head Football Coach Oval Jaynes best describes the 1976 Bulldogs as "a year older and a year wiser," yet tempers his optimism by pointing out, "We will still be very young, possibly starting as many as 16 sophomores."

Granted, the Bulldogs will be young but experienced as they begin their second season under Jaynes' command. Fifty-two players return from last year's roster including 38 lettermen. The breakdown of lettermen shows 22 sophomores, 11 juniors and only 5 seniors.

"We're still a couple of years away from getting the number of upperclassmen we need in the program," he states.

Still, Gardner-Webb has a solid nucleus returning and Jaynes admits, "With a few good bouncers of the ball, we could be a contender for the SAC-8 crown."

Gardner-Webb's most obvious strength is in the offensive backfield which returns intact. Sophomore Dennis Stilley who quarterbacked the 'Dogs' final five games last year, should be the starting signal-caller. However, he will get plenty of competition from transfer Glenn Robertson and freshmen Greg Bess and Matt Ballard.

The explosive veer offense features four talented running backs, all lettermen and all starters at one time or another in '75. The school's all-time leading rusher Frank Taylor, returns for his senior year. Joining him are juniors Po Rogers, who was named to the All SAC-8 team last year, and

Johnny Walker, the 'Dogs' most valuable running back in '75. Rounding out the backfield is soph Obhis Todd, who averaged 8.5 yards per carry.

Wide receivers Elvin Webber, G.T. Johnson, Marc Walker and Mark Morningstar and tight end John Smith insure an experienced passing attack.

The offensive line promises to be much improved with lettermen two-deep at the interior positions.

At the tackles, Jaynes can choose from all-conference candidate Mark Classen, Jeff Carter, and Ken Eschardt. Mike Dover, Jody Douglas, Bob Barnes and Jim Furlough will man the guard posts while sophs Richard Mack and Gary Berryhill battle for the nod at center.

Defensively the entire front five returns with All-conference end Monte Walker, who led the team in tackles last year, heading the list of returnees. In the middle, the Bulldogs pack a lot of muscle with 225-pound nose guard Ronald Dunlap and tackle Phil Wright (240), Jack Yates (235), Frankie Smith (215), and Brad Stalvey (250). Three lettermen, Jeff

Keens, Robert Pettyjohn and Roy Kirby, are stacked up at right end opposite Walker.

Graduation weakened the linebacker slots, but Jaynes expects solid play from senior Bob Johnson, soph Mike Briggs and junior John Hargrove, a newcomer from Ferrum Junior College.

There are a lot of unanswered questions in the secondary, where eight candidates are battling for starting berths. The leading contenders at cornerback are Joe Russell, Don Montgomery, Donnie Andrews and Mike Baria. Juniors Bill Salyers and Jeff Johnson finished spring practice as the No. 1 players at strong safety and free safety, but both are being pushed by converted tight end Marvin Oliver and Alvin Lee, a transfer from Western Carolina.

The kicking game will be much improved with the addition of a pair of transfers, Mike Cox from East Carolina, and Ted Monica from the University of Miami. Mike Briggs, who averaged 35.5 yards per kick last year, will again handle the punting chores.

During his career, Dixon also held positions as dean, registrar and vice president of the college.
