A Bold Dimension in Higher Education

PROGRAM ANNOUNCED

Gardner-Webb College President Dr. Craven E. Williams recently announced a \$30.5 million development program.

Trustee board chairman R. Patrick Spangler stated, "This \$10.5 million program grew out of studies carried out during the 1976-77 school year which cited future directions for financial and physical improvements at Gardner-Webb College. The specific objectives were established by a faculty-student long-range planning committee along with the Trustee Development Committee. The college's known long-range objectives go beyond this \$10.5 million, but our initial effort will focus on these specific objectives. Once they are achieved we will move on to the next set of objectives."

Williams said, "Gardner-Webb has clearly assessed its priorities for the immediate future, and this program will turn its visions into realities. The successful completion of the program will result in exciting new and bold dimensions in church-related higher education. The recently announced program for the deaf is but one example of the new service opportunities envisioned." Spangler added, "The \$10.5 million program will seek new capital for endowment, new construction, renovations, and annual operations.

The objectives of the program are as follows:

— \$4 million for endowment of academic programs supporting faculty salaries, faculty study and research, program development,

and library book purchases.

- \$2 million for endowment for students, including scholarships, loan funds and other forms of financial aid.
- \$3.5 million for improvements in the physical plant, including a much needed Special Events/Convocation Center, and building renovations.
- \$1 million for annual operations, partially supporting an operating budget in excess of \$4.6 million.

Williams noted, "This continuing effort is designed to guarantee, through comprehensive, systematic, long-range planning, the continuing financial stability of the college and its work of high quality in educating young men and women." The Bold Dimensions Program will parallel the Bold Missions thrust of the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina.

As an independent, church-related, liberal arts college, Gardner-Webb af-

The Dover Challenge to the Annual College Fund

Gardner-Webb College is the recipient of a challenge gift up to \$100,000 from Mr. Charles I. Dover and the Dover Foundation. The grant launches the new \$30.5 million Bold Dimensions in Higher Education Program at the college.

As a challenge gift, the money will match on a dollar-for-dollar basis up to \$80,000 all new or increased gifts to the Annual College Fund. In other words, if someone who gave \$100 last year increases his or her gift to \$175 this year, the Dover Foundation will match \$75. If someone who did not give last year does contribute this year the entire gift will be matched. The Dover challenge funds realized through this matching arrangement will be placed in the permanent endowment, the interest from which will be used for academic program development. Through this gift the Dover Foundation not only

will be providing necessary funds for the development of academic programs, but also challenging all friends of Gardner-Webb, through the Annual College Fund, to support the on going programs so vital to the continued well-being of the institution.

Mr. Dover, his family, and the Dover Foundation are long-time friends of Gardner-Webb and of education. In 1944, Mr. Charles Dover and his late brother, John R. Dover, Jr., established the Dover Foundation to support deserving educational, religious, and charitable causes. Over the years, the Foundation has contributed to the educational development of the area while undergirding charities, service agencies, and community health, welfare, recreational and cultural activities. The Foundation also makes a unique college scholarship plan avail-

Academic Vice-President Named

Dr. Robert E. Knott, Dean of Arkansas College, Batesville, Arkansas, has been appointed Academic Vice-President and Dean of Gardner-Webb College effective October 1, 1977. The appointment was announced by college President Craven Williams at the July 29 meeting of the college's Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees.

In making the announcement Williams described Knott as "one of the most respected and creative academic leaders." He is a frequent speaker and workshop leader in the area of curriculum design and faculty development. His expertise is widely sought around the country by colleges and universities seeking to redesign undergraduate curricula. He has served as a consultant to such institutions as University of Miami, UCLA/Berkeley, Bowling Green State University, and the University of Rhode Island.

Williams added, "Dr. Knott is a publishing scholar who contributes frequent articles to professional journals concerned with academic leadership, curriculum design and evaluation, and academic planning. We feel quite fortunate in being able to bring a person of his stature back to N. C. and to Gardner-Webb. He is truly a builder, an architect of academic programs. His experience as a chief academic officer, proven innovator, experienced classroom teacher and professional consultant will be invaluable to Gardner-Webb College. Furthermore, Dr. Knott is a strong churchman who is committed to the values orientation of a church related liberal arts college. His personal and professional life ably reflect the values for which this college stands."

Knott is a native of Winston-Salem, N.C. He earned the Bachelor and Master of Arts degrees from Wake Forest University in 1962 and 1969 respectively. He also holds the B.D. degree from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, and the Ph.D. from State University of New York at Buffalo. His dissertation topic was "A Study of Efficiency and Effectiveness in the Small, Private, Liberal Arts College."



For the past two years Knott has served as Dean of Arkansas College. Prior to that he was Associate Dean for General Studies and Educational Development Officer at Mars Hill College where he was also Assistant Professor of Philosophy. He served for two summers with the N. C. Governor's School as Director of the Institute for Teachers of Gifted and Talented Students. He has also taught mathematics at the high school and college level, and served one year as Assistant Chaplain at Wake Forest University.

Knott is married to the former Brenda Sue Harris of Mooresville, N.C. They have two children, Andrea Leigh, age 9, and Robert Eugene, Jr., age 6.

Both the Dover Textile Group and Gardner-Webb College were opened in 1907, and the Dover family has been a driving force in the parallel growth and development of the two institutions. Mr. Charles Dover and his brother have been trustees of the college, and both served as Chairman of the Board. The Dover family was instrumental in construction of the original Dover Memorial Library in 1952, and the new John R. Dover Memorial Library in 1974. The Charles I. Dover Campus Center was dedicated in 1966, and the John R. Dover, Jr., Memorial Chapel was opened in 1972.

In 1963, the college awarded Mr. Dover a "special citation" for outstanding service in the field of education. At the graduation exercises last May, Mr. Charles Dover received the Doctor of Humane Letters Degree from Gardner-Webb.
