The Elizabeth Baptist Church was organized in 1881. Because of a gift of three acres of land from her, and her interest in the new church, the church was named in honor of Elizabeth Love Wilson.

The first building was erected in 1884. Growth and progress led to the completion of a new building in 1918 which replaced the original one room structure. A third structure was completed in 1940. In December of 1954 a fire completely destroyed the building. In 1957 the first phase of the present edifice was completed. Then, in 1959, the present facilities were completed with an additional educational building. Estimated value of the physical plant is a million dollars.

Fred A. Mauney, the present pastor, has served the congregation since August of 1972. He is a native of Rockledge County and is a graduate of Wingate College, Furman University, and Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. His previous pastorates are: First Baptist, Stanley, N. C.; First Baptist, Valdese, N. C.; Florence, Forest City, N. C.; and First Baptist, New Bern, N. C.

Constitution

PREAMBLE

We, the members of Missionary Baptist Churches in the County of Cleveland, State of North Carolina, and territory adjacent thereto, do hereby purpose to establish and maintain the principles and rules of order of a districts Association in conformity to the following plan:

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of this body shall be the Kings Mountain Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

It shall be the purpose of the Association to cooperate with the State and Southern Baptist Convention in the promotion of Christian Missions at home and abroad and in any other related objects such as evangelism, Christian Education, Benevolent enterprises, and social services, which it may deem proper and desirable for the furtherance of the Kingdom of God.

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: The Association shall be composed of cooperating Baptist Churches in the area of the Association.

Section 2: Churches desiring membership in the Association shall apply to the Membership Committee. Application should include:

1. Formal action by the group seeking admission reflecting that 75% of those voting expresses the desire to come under the watchcare of the Association.

2. A written statement reflecting their beliefs and practices.

3. A written statement that expresses their intent to cooperate.

4. A willingness to meet with the Membership Committee to discuss other items of mutual interest to both parties.

The Membership Committee should be sensitive to groups seeking its services and be willing to present a statement of Baptist belief and practice and what it means to cooperate with other churches in the Association in a world-wide mission program. If recommended by this committee and accepted by the Association, a mission or a church shall agree to come under the watchcare of the Association for a minimum of one year. Membership within the Association shall be determined by vote of the Association at its annual meeting. Churches under the watchcare shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of the Association except their members shall not hold office nor vote.

Section 3: The Association shall be the sole judge of its membership and may receive churches, or reject churches, according to its constitution and by-laws. Member Churches may also withdraw as they desire, and if requested, the General Board may grant letters of recommendation to other like associations.

ARTICLE IV MEETINGS

Section 1: The Association shall meet annually on Tuesday and Wednesday after the third Sunday in October and continue until the business of the Association is disposed of.

Section 2: Special meetings may be called by the Moderator or General Board provided two weeks notice is given to the member churches.

Section 3: Each church shall elect annually, in addition to the pastor, two messengers to the meetings of the Association for each 10 members of the church, provided each church shall have not less than three nor more than ten messengers. These shall constitute the voting body of the Association. The names of messengers printed in the minutes shall include only those in attendance and registering at the Association's meeting.

ARTICLE V AUTHORITY

Each church in this Association is independent and sovereign in

its own affairs, and the Association has no authority over the churches except as provided in this Constitution in Article VII, Section 3 and 4.

ARTICLE VI OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTIONS

Section 1: The officers of the Association shall be Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, Auditor, Historian, Music Director, Organist, Sunday School Director, Chairman of the Library Council, Baptist Youth for Christ Director, Youth and Family Services Director and Parliamentarian.

Section 2: The officers shall be elected on the morning of the last day of the annual meeting for a term of one year each. The nominees shall be contacted and nominated by the Committee on Nominations (By-Law, Section 8) except the Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, WFO Director and Brotherhood Director shall be nominated and contacted for acceptance by their respective organizations and presented by the Committee on Nominations with their report of nominees. Committee nominations shall not preclude nominations from the floor.

Section 3: The newly elected Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, shall assume at the close of the annual session all duties incumbent upon them relating to the work of the ensuing associational year. All other officers shall assume all duties incumbent upon them relating to the work of the ensuing year on the following January 1.

Section 4: Any person having served two terms as Moderator shall be ineligible for re-election for two years.

ARTICLE VII TRUSTEES AND THEIR ELECTION

There shall be three Trustees of the Association, one preferably a lawyer, serving terms of three years each on a rotating basis. On Nomination by the Committee on Nominations, one new trustee shall be elected at the Annual Meeting, no trustee being eligible to succeed himself until after the lapse of one year. The expiration date of each trustee's term of office shall appear by his name in the Associational Minutes.

ARTICLE VIII THE GENERAL BOARD

The General Board shall be composed of all Associational officers (Article VI, Section 1), the Associational Director of Missions (an office without voting privileges), each active pastor, two members chosen by each member church from its membership and certified to the Association in its annual report, and chairmen of all standing committees of the Association. The General Board shall have the authority to act for the Association between sessions, except as limited by the Constitution. General Board members are the connecting link between the Association and the churches. General Board members should represent the churches to the Association. General Board members should act as representatives for the Association to the churches. It is the responsibility of the General Board members to promote the programs, represent the needs and report to the churches concerning the work and ministry of the Association. General Board members should seek acceptable means of representing the Association to their respective fellowships. It shall be the duty of the General Board to meet quarterly and to make reports and recommendations to the Association in its annual meeting.

The quarterly meetings will be in October, January, April, and July, on Monday after the third Sunday.

ARTICLE 18 COMMITTEES

Section 1: The Association shall have the following standing committees, with their terms of office being from the close of the annual meeting through the following annual meeting.

A. To be nominated by the Committee on Committees and elected by the Association at the annual meeting:

- (1) Order of Business and Program Committee (By-Law IV, Section 1)
- (2) Executive Committee (By-Law IV, Section 2)
- (3) Evangelism Committee (By-Law IV, Section 3)
- (4) Finance Committee (By-Law IV, Section 4)
- (5) Ordination Committee (By-Law IV, Section 5)
- (6) Nominating Committee (By-Law IV, Section 6)
- (7) Constitution Committee (By-Law IV, Section 7)
- (8) Membership Committee (By-Law IV, Section 8)
- (9) Calendar Committee (By-Law IV, Section 9)
- (10) Resolutions Committee (By-Law IV, Section 10)
- (11) Historical Committee (By-Law IV, Section 11)
- (12) Seminary Extension Committee (By-Law IV, Section 12)
- (13) Christian Life Committee (By-Law IV, Section 13)
- (14) Youth and Family Services Committee (By-Law IV, Section 14)
- (15) Church Reconciliation Committee (By-Law IV, Section 15)
- (16) Missions Committee (By-Law IV, Section 16)
- (17) South Mountain Baptist Camp Committee (By-Law IV, Section 17)
- (18) Recreation and Drama Committee (By-Law IV, Section 18)
- (19) Any other committee authorized by the Association.

B. To be appointed by the Moderator at the annual meeting, Committee on Committees, (By-Law IV, Section 14)

Section 2: The following committee shall be appointed by the Moderator at least thirty days prior to the annual meeting to serve during the annual meeting:

- (1) Enrollment Committee (By-Law IV, Section 14)

ARTICLE 19 AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this constitution may be made at any annual session of the Association upon an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the voting members present. Proposed changes must be presented to the Association on the first day and voted upon by a standing vote of the Association on the last day. It is recommended that all proposed changes first be submitted to the Constitution Committee.

By-Laws

By-Law I PARLIAMENTARY RULES

Robert's Rules of Order shall be followed at the Association's rules for conducting its deliberative assemblies, except as the Association prescribes otherwise.

By-Law II ASSOCIATIONAL YEAR

The Associational Year shall begin October 1 and close September 30.

By-Law III DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1: The Moderator shall preside over the meeting of the body according to the Constitution and By-Laws, appoint committees on Committees and Committee on Pardonment. He shall be the Chairman of the General Board and be an ex officio (without voting privileged) member of all other committees. Upon completion of his term of office, the Moderator shall become a member-at-large (for two years) of the Missions Committee, Executive, and the General Board.

Section 2: The Vice-Moderator shall preside in the absence, or at the pleasure, of the Moderator, and shall be the Vice-Chairman of the General Board.

Section 3: The Clerk-Treasurer shall send annual report forms to the member churches at least a month before the Association's annual meeting, distribute at the annual meeting copies of the digest of these reports, make an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, supervise the printing and distributing of Minutes to the member churches, keep on file copies of Minutes, records, and other documents of the Association, and shall also serve as Secretary of the General Board. He shall inform all members elected to office or appointed to serve on committees of such action. He shall receive and bank all funds of the Association in the name of the Association; disburses the same upon instructions from the Association, its General Board, or as designated in the Budget (no money is to be disbursed which is not included in the budget except upon recommendation of the Finance Committee to the General Board or the Association in Annual Session); render an accurate report of receipts and disbursements and distribute same at the annual meeting and give a report at each quarterly General Board meeting and keep books available and up-to-date for examination.

Section 4: The Auditor shall, at the close of the Association Year, make an audit of the Treasurer's records and report to the Association in session.

Section 5: The Historian shall collect and preserve historical data on the Association and its churches, and make a written report to each annual meeting of the Association.

Section 6: The Sunday School Director shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Sunday School Department. This officer shall attend the Executive Committee meetings and offer creative plans to this committee that would promote this work.

The Associational Sunday School should assist church leaders to be more effective in their responsibility. This should include:

1. Provide opportunities for fellowship and inspiration.
2. Interpret the Sunday School program.
3. Train Sunday School leaders.
4. Consult with Sunday School leaders concerning their program.
5. Provide organization and leadership for cooperative work among the churches.

Section 7: The Church Training Department shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Church Training Department by the Executive Committee of the Association is carried out and that the on-going work of this department is maintained at all times.

Section 8: The Music Director shall provide leadership for the Association in session and when requested at other times during the year. This officer shall attend the Executive

Committee meeting and offer creative plans to this Committee that would promote the work. He shall encourage music growth in the churches throughout the year and shall make a written report to the annual meeting.

Section 9: The Brotherhood Director shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of men and boys in the churches. The officer shall attend the Executive Committee meetings and offer creative plans to promote the development of men and boys and an awareness of world missions needs.

Section 10: The Women's Missionary Union Director serves on the Executive Committee of the Association and works with the Director of missions; leads the WMU Council; confers with other associational WMU officers and assists them in their work; leads in providing opportunities for leaders and members of church WMU's to have fellowship and receive inspiration concerning their mutual missions task; leads in interpreting the WMU program to church leaders; leads in training church WMU workers and members; consults with church leaders concerning initiation of WMU work and the improvement of existing work; presides at and plans for associational meetings; leads in associational WMU annual planning; leads in discovering mission action needs and in coordinating the work being done; and reports progress of WMU work to the association and serves as contact between the association and state WMU.

Section 11: The Chairman of the Library Council shall promote the beginning and maintenance of church libraries in the churches; provides training opportunities for church librarians; maintain and develop the associational library; attend the Executive Committee meetings; cooperate with the Director of Missions and make an annual report of the association at its annual session.

Section 12: The Baptist Youth for Christ Director shall, under the supervision of the Director of Missions, guide and promote the youth activities of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association. Such activities may include:

1. Youth Council sessions
2. Bi-monthly sessions of Youth for Christ in local churches.
3. A Haires Crusade for Christ every 3 to 5 years.
4. Mission Vacation Bible School and/or Backyard VBS.
5. Sponsorship of a booth at Cleveland County Fair each October.
6. Any other activity which the Baptist Youth for Christ, Youth Council, Director of Missions, and Executive Committee deems necessary to foster a positive Christian witness for Christ.

Section 13: The Youth and Family Services Director shall work under the Director of Missions in the building up of family life in the churches and in the community-at-large. He shall give attention to troubled young people. His major work will be in relation to the county juvenile court in support of court counselors, youth and families. He shall enlist and supervise volunteer workers to support troubled youth and their families.

Section 14: The Parliamentarian shall, at the annual meeting of the Association, rule on all questions of parliamentary procedure which shall arise during the sessions. The Parliamentarian shall serve as a resource person to the churches and shall, upon request, advise and assist the churches on matters of parliamentary procedure.

Section 15: Vacancies occurring between annual sessions shall be filled by the General Board except the office of Moderator, in which case the Vice Moderator shall automatically become Moderator.

By-Law IV DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Section 1: THE ORDER OF BUSINESS AND PROGRAM COMMITTEE shall be composed of three members and the Moderator, Clerk, and the Associational Music Director. It shall rotate the place of meeting among the groups of churches with the host church being determined by the group. It shall recommend the Preacher and the alternate for the annual session. It shall prepare a printed program for the Annual Meeting for the Association which shall be sent to all persons on the program and to all pastors at least thirty days before the annual meeting. It shall, on the opening day of the annual meeting of the Association, present the printed program for adoption and serve through the session when adjustments in the order of business become necessary. This Committee will be responsible for promoting the annual meeting through the various news media.

Section 2: THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

(1) Shall be composed of the Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, Music Director, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, Brotherhood Director, WFO Director, Baptist Youth for Christ Director, Youth and Family Services Director, President of Pastor's Conference, Chairman of Nominating Committee, Chairman of Committee on Committees, Chairman of Christian Life Committee, Chairman of Membership Committee, Chairman of Finance Committee, and Chairman of Evangelism.

(2) When without a Director of Missions, this Committee shall seek out and recommend to the Association, or its General Board, for election of a new Director of Missions according to By-Law VI, Section 11.

(3) It shall administer all matters referred to it by the Association or General Board and act on routine or emergency matters between meetings of the General Board. It shall initiate and recommend matters concerning business management, approve employment of all office personnel, deal with problems relating to personnel, and maintain adequate equipment for the office. It shall meet regularly not less than quarterly, but a quorum of seven be necessary to transact business.

Section 3: THE EVANGELISM COMMITTEE, composed of 4 members, shall promote the work of Evangelism in the churches and the Association in cooperation with the State Department of Evangelism. All plans and programs to be subject to the approval of the Association or its General Board.

The Committee shall assume the responsibility for coordinating the radio ministry, available for Revival, as a means of evangelizing the community. Churches shall be encouraged to contribute to this program through budgets.

Section 4: THE FINANCE COMMITTEE, composed of three members, with the treasurer shall study the Association's financial needs of an adequate program, present a budget to the Association for the following year, devise plans for securing the cooperation of the churches raising funds to meet the budget, and make a written report to the annual meeting.

The Committee shall be prepared to assist any church within the association, upon request, with the stewardship programs offered by the Convention.

The Committee shall express gratitude to the churches for their stewardship development that enables them to participate in local, home, and foreign missions.

Section 5: THE ORIENTATION COMMITTEE, composed of 5 members, with the pastor of the candidate, Director of Missions, and/or Deacons

of the requesting churches, shall, when requested by a member church, assist with the examination and ordination of a candidate for the Gospel Ministry.

The Chairman shall notify the candidate of the time, place, and procedure.

The Committee shall ask the candidate to share his conversion experience, his call to the ministry, and question him in the area of his beliefs, convictions, and doctrine.

The candidate may ask questions of the Committee members regarding any area of the ministry that concerns him. This Committee may counsel the candidate.

It is suggested that the candidate be questioned at least two weeks prior to his ordination.

The Committee shall approve or disapprove the ordination of the candidate with written notice to the ordaining church.

The Committee should secure an Ordination Certificate for the candidate.

The Chairman of the Ordination Council should report its activities to the General Board quarterly and provide a written report for the annual meeting.

Section 4: THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE, composed of 4 members, shall contact before and nominate on the last day of the annual meeting of the Association the officers of the Association according to Articles VI and VII of the Constitution. This Committee, shall also, in cooperation with the nominating committee of various departments except the WMC and Brotherhood organizations, recommend workers for these various departments. The officers and workers of these respective organizations shall be nominated by the organizations themselves and submitted to the Nominating Committee. Article VI, Section 11 It shall also nominate Associational Representatives for the various institutions and agencies of our convention and members of the General Board of our Baptist State Convention. This Committee shall also assist the General Board in filling vacancies which occur between annual meetings of the Association. This Committee's nominations shall not be preclude other nominations from the floor.

Section 5: THE CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE, composed of three members, shall be available to study changes or revisions in the Constitution, and to make recommendations as needed.

Section 6: THE MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE, composed of 3 members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution and By-Laws. The Membership Committee should be sensitive to groups seeking its services and be willing to present a statement of Baptist faith and practice and what it means to cooperate with other churches in the Association in a world-wide mission program. The Membership Committee shall annually review all churches and missions under the watchcare of the Association and may present them for membership within the Association or that they continue under the watchcare.

Section 7: THE CALENDAR COMMITTEE shall be composed of the following Associational officers: Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, WMC Director, Brotherhood Director, Music Director, and Vice-Moderator as Chairman. This committee shall work out as soon as possible each year an Associational Calendar for the coming year and present same to the General Board for Adoption.

Section 8: THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE, composed of three members, shall draw up and present to the Association resolutions

of appreciation; plan and promote the work of the committee in an annual planning meetings; and present resolutions of appreciation to individuals, organizations, and churches when there are events worthy of commendation.

Section 11: THE HISTORICAL COMMITTEE shall be composed of the Historian as chairman and 4 other members. It shall be the duty of the historical committee to collect, compile, and preserve all materials of interest to the Association as member churches. It shall make its report at the Annual Associational meeting.

Section 12: THE SEMINARY EXTENSION COMMITTEE, composed of three members, shall publicize study courses and programs that are available and shall plan, provide and promote Seminary Extension studies as they may be desired.

Section 13: THE CHRISTIAN LIFE COMMITTEE, composed of 4 members, will give continual attention to the moral climate of the community and shall initiate necessary action to maintain and improve the climate. The committee shall commend those persons and institutions that uphold Christian virtue, and shall support the churches in the teaching of Christian personal and social righteousness.

Section 14: THE COMMITTEE ON COMMITTEES, composed of 5 members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution (Article II, Section 17, and shall assist the General Board in filling vacancies on all standing committees occurring between sessions. This committee shall also name the Chairman of each committee.

Section 15: THE PLACE AND PREACHER COMMITTEE, composed of three members, shall receive of solicit invitations for the place or places of meetings for the next annual meeting of the Association, and shall recommend place or places. It shall also recommend the preacher and alternate for the annual session.

Section 16: THE ENROLLMENT COMMITTEE shall prepare for and direct the enrollment of the messengers at all of the sessions.

Section 17: THE YOUTH AND FAMILY SERVICES COMMITTEE, composed of 1 members, shall assist the Youth and Family Services Director in co-ordinating the work of Associational Youth and Family Services.

Section 18: THE CHURCH RECONCILIATION COMMITTEE shall be composed of the present Moderator, as chairman, two immediate past Moderators and two lay persons to be appointed annually by the above stated members. The chairman will report to the Executive Committee or the General Board the names of those lay persons appointed. This committee will be open to any person or persons of a member church seeking assistance with problems related to their church.

Section 19: THE MISSIONS COMMITTEE shall be made up of the following members: The Director of Missions will be the chairman, without voting privileges; Moderator; Vice-Moderator; Clerk-Treasurer; Finance Committee Chairman; Sunday School Director; Church Training Director; Brotherhood Director; WBO Director; and President of the Pastor's Conference.

This committee is to be available as a sounding board, to support the Director of Missions as a person (as well as an officer in the association), provide feed-back concerning Associational programs and activities, conveying suggestions from the Association, and offering support in projecting programs to Executive Committee and/or General Board. The Missions Committee has no authority other than to make recommendations to the Executive Committee or the General Board. The Missions Committee

may be called together at the discretion of the Chairman or determine its own meeting time and place.

Section 20: THE SOUTH MOUNTAIN CAMP COMMITTEE shall promote the camp program in the Association, attend the annual meeting of the camp, and be aware of the needs and plans, cooperate with the Director of Missions.

Section 21: THE RECREATION AND DRAMA COMMITTEE shall promote a program of Christian recreation and drama in the churches. The Committee shall regard recreation and drama as a means, not an end. The Recreation and Drama Committee shall use their programs as a way to teach, a means of witnessing and an avenue of expressing the abundant Christian life. The Recreation and Drama Committee shall be responsible to give assistance to any church that should request help in the area of recreation and drama. The Committee's responsibilities shall include fellowships, Senior Adults, Retreats, Crafts, Drama Workshops and other assignments of the Association if asked. The Chairman of the Recreation and Drama Committee shall plan with the Director of Missions and give a report of the Committee's activities at the General Board quarterly meetings.

Section 22: Members of all these committees, except those appointed by the Moderator, shall be elected to serve not more than three year on a rotating basis.

By-Law V TRUSTEES

The duty of the trustees shall be to hold in trust any property, money, endowment, or other securities of said Association, and they shall handle all legal matters of the Association under the direction of the Association or its General Board.

By-Law VI DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS

Section 1: His selection shall be upon the recommendation of the Executive Committee and on vote by the Association at its annual meeting, or between sessions of the Association, by its General Board. His time of office shall continue until terminated by mutual consent or request of either party. He shall be a member of all committees and organizations of the Association in a serving and advisory capacity.

By-Law VII AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the By-Laws may be made at any session of the annual meeting by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

By-Law IX OFFICE PROCEDURE

Section 1: The business session of the Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.

Section 2: Every report, resolution, or amendment offered to the Association shall be submitted in writing if requested by the Moderator.

Section 3: No person shall speak more than twice on the same subject except by permission of the Association.

Section 4: Messengers present from half the churches shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5: Unless the Association decides otherwise, annual Sessions shall be held on a rotating basis with a church or churches in each of the six Associational Groups as follows: Polkville, Lattimore, Shelby, Kings Mountain, Grover, and Waco.

By-Law X THE CONFESSION OF FAITH

Elizabeth Baptist Church
Tuesday Evening, October 19, 1971

1. Mrs. E. T. Bailey at the organ and Miss Delores White at the piano presented a musical prelude as messengers and visitors gathered in Elizabeth Baptist Church, Shelby for the 126th Annual Session of Kings Mountain Baptist Association.

2. Mr. Carlos Young, Moderator, called the meeting to order.

3. Rev. Allen Jolley, minister of music at First Baptist Church, Kings Mountain, led the congregation in singing hymn No. 285 "There Was Love".

4. Psalm 8 was read by Rev. L. Hal Schuman, pastor of David Baptist Church.

5. Rev. Marvin Whisnant, pastor of Buffalo Baptist Church, led the opening prayer.

6. Rev. Roy Taylor, pastor of Second Baptist Church in Shelby, and Chairman of the Order of Business Committee, moved that the printed program with necessary changes be the Order of Business of this 126th Annual Session of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association. The motion was seconded and is carried.

7. Rev. Marion Adams, pastor of Lily Memorial Baptist Church and chairman of the Constitution Committee, presented the Constitutional changes (these had been duplicated and handed out to the congregation) to be voted on tomorrow.

8. Moderator Carlos Young appointed the Committee on Committees: Rev. Eugene Land, Chairman; Rev. Ed Seacore; Rev. Don Farrow; Mrs. T. S. Putnam and Mrs. Gus Stanton.

9. Moderator gave a few minutes time to getting acquainted.

10. Carlos Young gave the Moderator's Message. During his message Mr. Young paid tribute to the wives of all pastors.

11. A Drama, written by Rev. Paul Sorrells, pastor of First Baptist Church, Grover was presented depicting the organization of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association in 1851. Characters in the drama were pastors and laymen from various churches in the association.

12. The following new ministers and their wives were recognized: Rev. David Lucas, Moss Grove; Rev. and Mrs. Paul Childers, New Buffalo; Rev. and Mrs. Randall Bunton, Plains View; Rev. Eddie Wright, New Camp Creek; Rev. Est Walters, Union; Rev. and Mrs. Hal Schuman, David; Rev. and Mrs. Royd T. Tucker, Churchill Drive; and Rev. Eddie Gripp, Victory.

13. In his Director of Missions' report, Rev. Cline Borders reported on last year's activities: a Pastoral Leadership Seminar with Bob Dale and Jim Charis; a Deacon's Retreat with Charles Treadway; five events celebrating the 21-Centennial; a Marriage Enrichment Retreat; an Equipping Conference; plus many committee meetings; Pastors' Conferences; Executive Committee meetings and General Board. All of these in the association and also attending the State YMB Clinic, and other Training opportunities. Mr. Borders also reported on the work of our Summer Youth Worker.

14. Bill McDaniel, Vice-Moderator, presiding, a report on attendance was given: 235 messengers, 12 non-messengers and 2 visitors for a total of 349.

15. Special music was presented by Mr. Ed Beckley, minister of

music of First Baptist Church of Shelby. Mr. Backley sang several numbers accompanying himself on the guitar. He also invited the congregation to sing along on some of the numbers.

14. Rev. Max Linnens, pastor of the Boiling Springs Baptist Church, brought an inspirational message based on John 14, "Peace Is For Pilgrims." Included in his sermon were two poems: "Legacy For My Children" and "The Driving Beat Goes On." We are including both of these poems.

CHURCH TRAINING REPORT

The Church Training Department of the Kings Mountain Baptist

Association is glad to report that we have a very active department this year.

While not every church in the association has a Sunday Evening Church Training Program, the majority of our churches has some type of evening church training activities. We have, however, had some churches in the association to add the Sunday Evening program to their schedule.

A Review of Our Work

(1) Associational Church Training M-Night was held on November 10, 1973 with the Elizabeth Baptist Church. Total attendance for this service was 175 representing 23 Churches. Two awards were presented at the M-Night service. First Baptist Church of Dover, N.C. received the award for having the highest percent of the enrollment. First Hill Baptist Church received the award for the greatest number present.

(2) In March of 1974 the Church Training Department held three WIS Institutes. This was considered a very successful project indeed. The records states that we had a total of 308 people enrolled in the three schools from 13 churches. We had 3 first time decisions reported from the visiting teams on Thursday evening.

(3) On September 21, 1974 The Church Training Department sponsored an Equipping conference for the association. Twenty six conferences were offered in each area of our work for leaders in our Church Work. The total number reported in attendance was 184 from 44 different Churches.

Where We Stand

We are in the very early stages of our plans and preparation for the new Associational year. However, we are now considering:

(1) Some type of help program for International Students and children of Missionaries at Gardner Webb College. (Depending upon approval of the Association)

(2) M-Night Service on December 4.

(3) We stand ready to assist any church in the association with your Church Training program. We will assist with the total program or any given department. Please call upon us if we can help.

WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION REPORT

For 1976 - 77 the W. M. U. has two emphases: Teach Missions, to know, to grow and binding the future. The first is to improve the image and quality of teaching missions and to encourage participation in mission study. The second is to promote Mission Friends, Girls in Action, and Acteens.

A highlight of our year was the Baptist Women World Day of Prayer on November 1 at Westview Baptist Church. Members of the Shenandoah Association met with us and participated in the planning and program. About 250 attended.

In January a Workshop was held with three divisions: Mission Action, Mission Study, and Mission Support. Other than our Come All, Rev. Cline Borders, Dr. Fred McGehee, and Dr. Robert Lamb were workshop leaders.

At the annual spring meeting held at First Baptist Church, Shelby, Mrs. C. E. Price, President of the Pennsylvania - South Jersey W. M. U. Convention, spoke.

In March at the State Convention in Greensboro, our organization was recognized as a Distinguished W. M. U., the highest recognition given on the Achievement Guide. This is evidence of good work, but there is much still to be done.

During the summer months, members of the W. M. U. Council went to Ridgecrest and Fruitland for training and inspiration. Regular meetings have been held for planning and evaluation.

Mission Action has been given special attention this year. In December we sent 500 toothbrushes for the North Carolina Correctional Center for Women in Raleigh. Since that time we are in the process of training persons to minister to released prisoners and their families. Also we are assigning names of persons released from Broughton Hospital and Western Carolina Center who are now in nursing homes in the county. These persons will be visited by Baptist Women during the year.

The Baptist Women held a missions banquet in February at which time Mr. and Mrs. Cline Borders spoke. Baptist Young Women met at Macedonia with Miss Nancy Curtis of Raleigh as guest. Girls in Action leaders had a very helpful workshop on Daycamping in May led by Miss Pat Ritchie of Raleigh. She also had a meeting with Mission Friends leaders. Acteens have held quarterly meetings.

We continue to promote special offerings and weeks of prayer, Focus Week, and leadership training. I have attended regularly the General Board, Missions Committee, and Executive Committee. "WOM NEWS" mailed quarterly is an instrument for keeping the church members informed of events and activities.

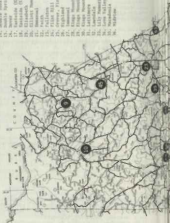
MEMORIALS REPORT

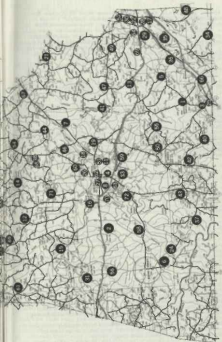

- (7) Approved a recommended Financial Budget for the Association Year beginning October, 1976 in the amount of \$42,934.

YOUTH AND FAMILY SERVICES REPORT TO THE KING'S MOUNTAIN BAPTIST ASSOCIATION IN ANNUAL SESSION

This past year has been another effective one in terms of service. However, in terms of need and the potential for an expanded ministry, it can only offer limited service until that time when the way can be cleared for a full-time social ministry in the Association.

We suffered a real loss this year in the moving out of our Association of Dr. Fred McNetee. The Pioneer Director of Youth and Family Services, and Dr. Bill McKinney, one of our able Volunteer Counselors. Their contribution to our Association and to our country cannot be measured in mere words.

I would like to highlight four specific areas of service now being rendered by our Assoc's Youth & Family Service personnel.

1. The Counseling Service

a. The Juvenile Court Counselors continue to recommend that the parents of young people coming through the juvenile court see members of the Youth and Family Services staff for Family Counseling.

b. The Juvenile Counseling Office in the Law Enforcement Center continues to provide limited free office space and secretarial help for our ministry.

c. The Juvenile Court Counselors under the able supervision of Mrs. Gloria Newman continue to offer full support of our counseling ministry and have set up an adequate referral system for such.

d. In addition to the referrals of the Juvenile Counselors, the Youth and Family Services staff is available for personal, marriage or family counseling referrals from the community.

e. The results has been approximately 250 interviews this year.

f. With the potential of a worship, teaching and counseling ministry in the county jail, county prison camp and nursing homes, and the potential for a counseling ministry through the domestic court as well as the juvenile court, the need for a full-time

social ministry becomes even more acute.

II. The Volunteer Program

a. Under the able coordination of Ms. Frances Mackburn, volunteers from various churches are rendering a valuable service.

b. There is still a need for more volunteers to be a friend to the juveniles, build a one-to-one relationship which might lead into participation in family activities, and assist in tutoring programs and transportation.

c. Unlike our sister counties, Gaston and Lincoln, Cleveland County does not have any court foster parents. This would be a voluntary service to provide a temporary home for youthful offenders when it is impossible for them to remain at home, or have placement elsewhere.

III. Cleveland County Girls Home

a. Cleveland County Commissioners have agreed to fund the Cleveland County Girls Home for one more year. Federal funding for the Home may continue but there must be community matching funds provided from some source.

b. Youth and Family Services share in the treatment of the residents in the Girls Home through family counseling and case conferences.

c. There are other specific needs the Girls Home has which need to be filled.

IV. Speaking Engagements, Community Service, etc.

This year members of the Youth and Family Services staff worked with the Human Relations Council, Gardner-Webb College and the Council for Developmental Disabilities on Community Concerns. They also spoke to WCU and brotherhood groups concerning the work and assisted the local hospital in securing a chaplain. They also participated in other community activities.

The possibilities for Christian Service through Community Ministry are unlimited. Proverbs 29:18A says: "Where there is no vision, the people perish". May God grant that persons in need in Cleveland County will not perish because we have no vision.

BY-LAWS OF THE ASSOCIATIONAL W. M. C.

ARTICLE I: NAME. The name of this organization shall be "Woman's
Missionary Union, Auxiliary to the Kings Mountain Baptist

Association.

ARTICLE II: OBJECT. The object shall be to promote Christian missions through the organizations of Woman's Missionary Union in the churches and missions of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association.

ARTICLE III: RELATIONSHIPS.

Section 1. Woman's Missionary Union, Auxiliary to Kings Mountain Baptist Association, shall be the liaison between church organizations and the North Carolina Woman's Missionary Union.

Section 2. This associational Union shall recognize the autonomy of church organizations as provided in the Baptist Democratic process of operation.

Section 3. Church organizations shall be recognized as units through which the object of this Woman's Missionary Union is accomplished, each responsible for its own program, and contributing to the work of the association.

Section 4. This associational Union shall be guided in its plan of work by the Associational WMU Achievement Guide.

ARTICLE IV: MEMBERS. The members of Woman's Missionary Union organizations in the churches and missions of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association shall constitute the membership.

ARTICLE V: OFFICERS.

Section 1. The officers shall be a Director, Assistant Director, Secretary-Treasurer, Baptist Women's Director, Assistant Baptist Women's Director, Baptist Young Women's Director, Assistant Baptist Young Women's Director, Arzenea Director, Assistant Arzenea Director, Girls in Action Director, Assistant Girls in Action Director, Mission Friends Director, Assistant Mission Friends Director and others as needed. These officers shall be elected annually in a meeting of the associational WMU and shall hold office for one year or until their successors are elected. The tenure of office shall be five consecutive years.

Section 2. These officers shall perform the duties set out for them in these By-Laws and the "Woman's Missionary Union Work in the Association."

ARTICLE VI: NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

Section 1. The Nominating Committee, composed of six women, shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee, and elected by the associational WMU to serve one year.

Section 2. The Nominating Committee shall nominate officers and age group directors and assistants. Other nominations may be made from the floor.

Section 3. The Nominating Committee, in event of vacancy, shall present a nominee for the unexpired term for election by the associational WMU Council.

ARTICLE VII: MEETINGS.

Section 1. Day and/or night associational WMU meetings shall be held annually.

Section 2. Other meetings shall be held as authorized by the WMU Council.

ARTICLE VIII: W. M. U. COUNCIL.

Section 1. The WMU Council shall be composed of the officers, age group directors and any others desired.

Section 2. The WMU Council shall schedule the regular meetings of the organizations, plan the program of activities, hear reports, and check progress on the Achievement Guide.

Section 3. Regular meetings of the WMU Council shall be held quarterly, or as needed.

ARTICLE II: COMMITTEES.

Section 1. There shall be committees, standing or special, as needed.

Section 2. Committees, except those otherwise provided for, shall be appointed by the Director.

Section 3. The Director shall be an ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee.

Section 4. The duties of these committees are such as are set forth in these By-Laws and "Woman's Missionary Union Work in the Association."

ARTICLE III: FINANCES.

Section 1. The associational WMO shall adopt an annual budget, funds to be allocated from the associational budget.

ARTICLE IV: PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY. The rules contained in Robert's RULES OF ORDER, REVISED shall govern the Union in all cases to which they are applicable.

ARTICLE V: AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS. These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the associational WMO, provided the amendment has been submitted in writing at a previous meeting.

EVANGELISM REPORT

This has been an exciting year for the evangelism committee. We have continued to secure the speakers for Seville for Festival a radio program that is heard by hundreds and appreciated by many.

This committee also helped plan and carry out the county wide census and the simultaneous revival, held in the spring of this year with fifty-two of our churches participating.

We also had a desire to have an area wide crusade, and this past Monday night the General Board gave approval to the evangelism committee to extend an invitation to the James Robinson Team to lead in an area wide crusade in July of 1977. To make this crusade a success we need and encourage the support of all our churches.
