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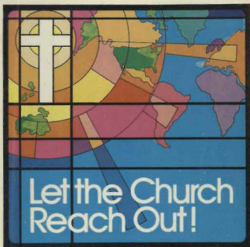

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POLKVILLE BAPTIST CHURCH



Polkville Baptist Church was organized July 28, 1940. A Presbytery met at the Polkville High School for the purpose of establishing a Baptist Church in Polkville. As a result of work accomplished by Rev. D. F. Putnam, Rev. H. E. Waldrup, N. L. Whitman, and Fred Mintz, plans were made to organize what is now Polkville Baptist Church.

Rev. J. W. Suttle, moderator of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association was elected as moderator, and Wyan Washburn of Double Springs was elected as secretary.

The Rev. D.F. Putnam was recognized and spoke briefly on the status of work at Polkville. Residents of the community and the executive committee had asked him to study the feasibility of a church at Polkville. He stated that with the help of Rev. Lawrence Roberts, and N.L. Whitman a survey made in May had resulted in the establishment of a Sunday School at Polkville totaling 75 members.

The Presbytery approved the petition asking for the privilege of organizing a new church. The convention covenant and 18 articles of faith were accepted unanimously by the church.

August 11, 1940 was set as the deadline for charter members. A revival was conducted the following week.

The newly organized church continued to hold worship service at Polkville High School for about 15 months. On October 4, 1940, a tract of land was purchased from Mr. & Mrs. Fred Eason for the purpose of erecting a church building. Construction started immediately, and the congregation moved to the new building late in 1940. Services were first held in the main auditorium of the church on the third Sunday of August, 1942. Minor construction continued for several years. The W.M.U. ladies desiring to see carpet placed in the sanctuary, planned a tea were cotton patch and donated the profits to the church for carpet. The building was dedicated in 1950, while W.P. Eggerstaff was pastor.

A brief sketch of important events follows:

Two men have been ordained to the gospel ministry by our church, Rev. Ben Davis and Rev. Glenn Walker.

In 1950 a new educational building was completed by the congregation. Property has been purchased at different times and now totals approximately 14 acres.

Parsonage was completed in 1953.

Under the leadership of our present pastor, Rev. Alton Martin, plans were approved with Tom Pagnan, an Architect and McCluskey Construction, Inc. as builder, ground was broken May 18, 1973. Construction began in May of 1973 on the New Sanctuary. Total cost of the structure was \$180,000.00, and has a seating capacity of 400. It is a modern up-to-date facility. Dedication of the new sanctuary was on February 1, 1976 with Rev. W.P. Eggerstaff being the principle speaker. Also, on the program were Rev. Kenneth Lambert, Carlos Young and the present pastor, Alton Martin.

God has richly blessed Polkville Baptist Church since its conception in 1940 at the Polkville High School.

DEDICATED



The 1977 Minutes are dedicated to the memory of the Reverend L. D. Scruggs, pastor of the Macedonia Baptist Church. L. D. Scruggs was born in Richland County April 11, 1928. He later married Helen Lanier Scruggs, and they have four children: Dean, Sheila, David and Lori.

Mr. Scruggs served as a pastor at the Calvary Baptist Church, Gaffney, S. C.; Wyatt's Grove Baptist Church and the Needmore Baptist Church in Salisbury, N. C.; Patterson Road Baptist Church, Dayton, and First Baptist Church, Newton, Cincinnati, Ohio. Mr. Scruggs had begun his eighth year at Macedonia Baptist Church when death came on October 18, 1977.

The ministry of L. D. Scruggs extended far beyond the boundary of his local church. His involvement in the life of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association and community agencies was widespread and effective.

Constitution

PREAMBLE

We, the members of Missionary Baptist Churches in the County of Cleveland, State of North Carolina, and territory adjacent thereto, do hereby purpose to establish and maintain the principles and rules of order of a district Association in conformity to the following plan:

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of this body shall be the Kings Mountain Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

It shall be the purpose of the Association to cooperate with the State and Southern Baptist Convention in the promotion of Christian Missions at home and abroad and in any other related objects such as evangelism, Christian Education, Benevolent enterprises, and social services, which it may deem proper and a desirable for the furtherance of the Kingdom of God.

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: The association shall be composed of cooperating Baptist Churches in the area of the Association.

Section 2: Churches desiring membership in the Association shall apply to the Membership Committee. Application should include:

1. Formal action by the group seeking admission reflecting that 75% of those voting expresses their intent to cooperate.
2. A written statement reflecting their beliefs and practices.
3. A written statement that expresses their intent to cooperate.
4. A willingness to meet with Membership Committee to discuss other items of mutual interest to both parties.

The Membership Committee should be sensitive to groups seeking its services and be willing to present a statement of Baptist belief and practice and what it means to cooperate with other churches in the Association in a world-wide mission program. If recommended by this committee and accepted by the Association, a mission or a church shall agree to come under the watchcare shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of the Association except their members shall not hold office nor vote.

Section 3: The Association shall be the sole judge of its membership and may receive churches, or reject churches, according to its constitution and by-laws. Member Churches may also withdraw as they desire, and if requested, the General Board may grant letters of recommendation to other like associations.

ARTICLE IV MEETINGS

Section 1: The Association shall meet annually on Tuesday and Wednesday after the third Sunday in October and continue until the business of the Association is disposed of.

Section 2: Special meetings may be called by the Moderator or General Board provided two weeks notice is given to the member churches.

Section 3: Each church shall elect annually, in addition to the pastor, two messengers to the meetings of the Association for each 50 members of the church, provided each church shall have not less than three nor more than ten messengers. These shall constitute the voting body of the Association. The names of messengers printed in the minutes shall include only those in attendance and registering at the Associational meeting.

ARTICLE V AUTHORITY

Each church in this Association is independent and sovereign in its own affairs, and the Association has no authority over the churches except as provided in this Constitution in Article III, Section 2 and 3.

ARTICLE VI OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTIONS

Section 1: The officers of the Association shall be Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, Auditor, Historian, Music Director, Organist, Sunday School Director, Chairman of the Library Council, Baptist Youth for Christ Director, Youth and Family Services Director and Parliamentarian.

Section 2: The officers shall be elected on the morning of the last day of the annual meeting for a term of one year each. The nominees shall be contacted and nominated by the Committee on Nominations (By-Law, Section 6) except the Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, WMU Director and Brotherhood Director shall be nominated and contacted for acceptance by their respective organizations and presented by the Committee on Nominations with their report of nominees. Committee nominations shall not preclude nominations from the floor.

Section 3: The newly elected Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, shall assume at the close of the annual session all duties incumbent upon them relating to the work of the ensuing associational year. All other officers shall assume all duties incumbent upon them relating to the work of the ensuing year on the following January 1.

Section 4: Any person having served two terms as Moderator shall be ineligible for re-election for two years.

ARTICLE VII TRUSTEES AND THEIR ELECTION

There shall be three Trustees of the Association, one preferably a lawyer, serving terms of three years each on a rotating basis. On Nominations by the Committee on Nominations, one new trustee shall be elected at the Annual Meeting, no trustee being eligible to succeed himself until after the lapse of one year. The expiration date of each trustee's term of office shall appear by his name in the Associational Minutes.

ARTICLE VIII THE GENERAL BOARD

The General Board shall be composed of all Associational officers (Article VI, Section 1), the Associational Director of Missions (ex officio without voting privileges), each active pastor, two members chosen by each member church from its membership and certified to the Association in its annual report, and chairmen of all standing committees of the Association. The General Board shall have the authority to act for the Association between sessions, except as limited by the Constitution. General Board members are the connecting link between the Association and the churches. General Board members should represent the churches to the Association. General Board members should act as representatives for the Association to the churches. It is the responsibility of the General Board members to promote the programs, represent the needs and report to the churches concerning the work and ministry of the Association. General Board members should seek acceptable means of representing the Association to their respective fellowships. It shall be the duty of the General Board to meet quarterly and to make reports and recommendations to the Association in its annual meeting.

The quarterly meetings will be in October, January, April, and July, on Monday after the third Sunday.

ARTICLE IX COMMITTEES

Section 1: The Association shall have the following standing committees, with their terms of office being from the close of the annual meeting through the following annual meeting.

A. To be nominated by the Committee on Committees and elected by the Association at the annual meeting:

- (1) Order of Business and Program Committee (By-Law IV, Section 1)
- (2) Executive Committee (By-Law IV, Section 2)
- (3) Evangelism Committee (By-Law IV, Section 3)
- (4) Finance Committee (By-Law IV, Section 4)
- (5) Ordination Committee (By-Law IV, Section 5)
- (6) Nominating Committee (By-Law IV, Section 6)
- (7) Constitution Committee (By-Law IV, Section 7)
- (8) Membership Committee (By-Law IV, Section 8)
- (9) Calendar Committee (By-Law IV, Section 9)
- (10) Resolutions Committee (By-Law IV, Section 10)
- (11) Historical Committee (By-Law IV, Section 11)
- (12) Seminary Extension Committee (By-Law IV, Section 12)
- (13) Christian Life Committee (By-Law IV, Section 13)
- (14) Youth and Family Services Committee (By-Law IV, Section 17)
- (15) Church Reconciliation Committee (By-Law IV, Section 18)
- (16) Missions Committee (By-Law IV, Section 19)
- (17) South Missouri Baptist Camp Committee (By-Law IV, Section 20)
- (18) Recreation & Drama Committee (By-Law IV, Section 21)
- (19) Any other committee authorized by the Association.

B. To be appointed by the Moderator at the annual meeting, Committee on Committees, (By-Law IV, Section 14)

Section 2: The following committee shall be appointed by the Moderator at least thirty days prior to the annual meeting to serve during the annual meeting:

- (1) Enrollment Committee (By-Law IV, Section 16)

ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this constitution may be made at any annual session of the Association upon an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the voting members present. Proposed changes must be presented to the Association on the first day and voted upon by a standing vote of the Association on the last day. It is recommended that all proposed changes first be submitted to the Constitution Committee.

By-Laws

By-Law I PARLIAMENTARY RULES

Robert's Rules of Order shall be followed as the Association's rules for conducting its deliberative assemblies, except as the Association prescribes otherwise.

By-Law II ASSOCIATIONAL YEAR

The Associational Year shall begin October 1 and close September 30.

By-Law III DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1: The Moderator shall preside over the meeting of the body according to the Constitution and By-Laws, appoint Committee on Committees and Committee on Enrollment. He shall be the Chairman of the General Board and be an ex officio (without voting privileges) member of all other committees. Upon completion of his term of office, the Moderator shall become a member-at-large (for two years) of the Missions Committee, Executive, and the General Board.

Section 2: The Vice-Moderator shall preside in the absence, or at the pleasure, of the Moderator, and shall be the Vice-Chairman of the General Board.

Section 3: The Clerk-Treasurer shall send annual report forms to the member churches at least a month before the Association's annual meeting, distribute at the annual meeting copies of the digest of these reports, make an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, supervise the printing and distributing of Minutes to the member churches, keep on file copies of Minutes, records, and other documents of the Association, and shall also serve as Secretary of the General Board. He shall inform all members elected to office or appointed to serve on committees of such action. He shall receive and bank all funds of the Association in the name of the Association; disburse the same upon instructions from the Association, its General Board, or as designated in the Budget (no money is to be disbursed which is not included in the budget except upon recommendation of the Finance Committee to the General Board of the Association in Annual Session); render an accurate report of receipts and disbursements and distribute same at the annual meeting and give a report at each quarterly General Board meeting and keep books available and up-to-date for examination.

Section 4: The Auditor shall, at the close of the Association Year, make an audit of the Treasurer's records and report to the Association in session.

Section 5: The Historian shall collect and preserve historical data on the Association and its churches, and make a written report to each annual meeting of the Association.

Section 6: The Sunday School Director shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Sunday School Department. This officer shall attend the Executive Committee meetings and offer creative plans to this committee that would promote this work.

The Associational Sunday School should assist church leaders to be more effective in their responsibility. This should include:

1. Provide opportunities for fellowship and inspiration.
2. Interpret the Sunday School program.
3. Train Sunday School leaders.
4. Consult with Sunday School leaders concerning their program.
5. Provide organization and leadership for cooperative work among the churches.

Section 7: The Church Training Department shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Church Training Department by the Executive Committee of the Association is carried out and that the on-going work of this department is maintained at all times.

Section 8: The Music Director shall provide leadership for the Association in session and when requested at other times during the year. This officer shall attend the Executive Committee meeting and offer creative plans to this Committee that would promote the work. He shall encourage music growth in the churches throughout the year and shall make a written report to the annual meeting.

Section 9: The Brotherhood Director shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of men and boys in the churches. The officer shall attend the Executive Committee meetings and offer creative plans to promote the development of men and boys and an awareness of world missions needs.

Section 10: The Woman's Missionary Union Director serves on the Executive Committee of the Association and works with the Director of missions; leads the WMU Council; confers with other associational WMU officers and assists them in their work; leads in providing opportunities for leaders and members of church WMUs to have fellowship and receive inspiration concerning their mutual

missions task; leads in interpreting the WMU program to church leaders; leads in training church WMU workers and members; consults with church leaders concerning initiation of WMU work and the improvement of existing work; provides at and plans for associational meeting; leads in associational WMU annual planning; leads in discovering mission action needs and in coordinating the work being done; and reports progress of WMU work to the association and serves as contact between the association and state WMU.

Section 11: The Chairman of the Library Council shall promote the beginning and maintenance of church libraries in the churches; provides training opportunities for church librarians; maintain and develop the associational library; attend the Executive Committee meetings; cooperate with the Director of Missions and make an annual report of the association at its annual session.

Section 12: The Baptist Youth for Christ Director shall, under the supervision of the Director of Missions, guide and promote the youth activities of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association. Such activities may include:

1. Youth Council sessions
2. Bi-monthly sessions of Youth for Christ in local churches.
3. A Kalros Crusade for Christ every 3 to 5 years.
4. Mission Vacation Bible School and/or Backyard VBS.
5. Sponsorship of a booth at Cleveland County Fair each October.

Council, Director of Missions, and Executive Committee deems necessary to foster a positive Christian witness for Christ.

Section 13: The Youth and Family Services Director shall work under the Director of Missions in "a b-tiding up of family life in the churches and in the community-at-large. He shall give attention to troubled young people. His major work will be in relation to the county juvenile court in support of court counselors, youth and families. He shall enlist and supervise volunteer workers to support troubled youth and their families.

Section 14: The Parliamentarian shall, at the annual meeting of the Association, rule on all questions of parliamentary procedure which shall arise during the sessions. The Parliamentarian shall serve as a resource person to the churches and shall, upon request, advise and assist the churches on matters of parliamentary procedure.

Section 15: Vacancies occurring between annual sessions shall be filled by the General Board except the office of Moderator, in which case the Vice Moderator shall automatically become Moderator.

By-Law IV DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Section 1: THE ORDER OF BUSINESS AND PROGRAM COMMITTEE shall be composed of three members and the Moderator, Clerk, and the Associational Music Director. It shall rotate the place of meeting among the groups of churches with the host church being determined by the group. It shall recommend the Preacher and the alternate for the annual session. It shall prepare a printed program for the Annual Meeting for the Association which shall be sent to all persons on the program and to all pastors at least thirty days before the annual meeting. It shall, on the opening day of the annual meeting of the Association, present the printed program for adoption and serve through the session when adjustments in the order of business become necessary. This Committee will be responsible for promoting the annual meeting through the various news media.

Section 2: THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

(1) Shall be composed of the Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, Music Director, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, Brotherhood Director, WMU Director, Baptist Youth for Christ Director, Youth and Family Services Director, President of Pastor's Conference, Chairman of Nominating

Committee, Chairman of Committee on Committees, Chairman of Christian Life Committee, Chairman of Membership Committee, Chairman of Finance Committee, and Chairman of Evangelism.

(2) When without a Director of Missions, this Committee shall seek out and recommend to the Association, or its General Board, for election of a new Director of Missions according to By-Law VI, Section 11.

(3) It shall administer all matters referred to it by the Association or General Board and act on routine or emergency matters between meetings of the General Board. It shall initiate and recommend matters concerning business management, approve employment of all office personnel, deal with problems relating to personnel, and maintain adequate equipment for the office. It shall meet regularly not less than quarterly, but a quorum of seven by necessary to transact business.

Section 3: THE EVANGELISM COMMITTEE, composed of 6 members, shall promote the work of Evangelism in the churches and the Association in cooperation with the State Department of Evangelism. All plans and programs to be subject to the approval of the Association or its General Board.

The Committee shall assume the responsibility for coordinating the radio ministry, Revival for Revival, as a means of evangelizing the community. Churches shall be encouraged to contribute to this program through budgets.

Section 4: THE FINANCE COMMITTEE, composed of three members, with the treasurer shall study the Association's financial needs of an adequate program, present a budget to the Association for the following year, devise plans for securing the cooperation of the churches raising funds to meet the budget, and make a written report to the annual meeting.

The Committee shall be prepared to assist any church within the association, upon request, with the stewardship programs offered by the Convention.

The Committee shall express gratitude to the churches for their stewardship development that enables them to participate in local, home, and foreign missions.

Section 5: THE ORDINATION COMMITTEE, composed of 5 members, with the pastor of the candidate, Director of Missions, and/or deacons of the requesting churches, shall, when requested by a member church, assist with the examination and ordination of a candidate for the Gospel Ministry.

The Chairman shall notify the candidate of the time, place, and procedure.

The Committee shall ask the candidate to share his conversion experience, his call to the ministry, and question him in the area of his beliefs, convictions, and doctrine.

The candidate may ask questions of the Committee members regarding any area of the ministry that concerns him. This Committee may counsel the candidate.

It is suggested that the candidate be questioned at least two weeks prior to his ordination.

The Committee shall approve or disapprove the ordination of the candidate with written notice to the ordaining church.

The Committee should secure an Ordination Certificate for the Candidate.

The Chairman of the Ordination Council should report its activities to the General Board quarterly and provide a written report for the annual meeting.

Section 6: THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE, composed of 6 members, shall contact before and nominate on the last day of the annual meeting of the Association the officers of the Association according to Articles VI and VIII of the Constitution. This Committee, shall also, in cooperation with the nominating committee of various departments except the WMU and Brotherhood organizations, recommend workers for these various departments. The officers and workers of these respective organizations shall be nominated by the organization themselves and submitted to the Nominating Committee. (Article VI, Section 1) It shall also nominate Associational Representatives for the various institutions

and agencies of our convention and members of the General Board of our Baptist State Convention. This Committee shall also assist the General Board in filling vacancies which occur between annual meetings of the Association. This Committee's nominations shall not be preclude other nominations from the floor.

Section 7: THE CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE, composed of three members, shall be available to study changes or revisions in the Constitution, and to make recommendations as needed.

Section 8: THE MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE, composed of 5 members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution and By-Laws. The Membership Committee should be sensitive to groups seeking its services and be willing to present a statement of Baptist faith and practice and what it means to cooperate with other churches in the Association in a world-wide mission program. The Membership Committee shall annually review all churches and missions under the watchcare of the Association and may present them for membership within the Association or that they continue under the watchcare.

Section 9: THE CALENDAR COMMITTEE shall be composed of the following Associational officers: Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, WMU Director, Brotherhood Director, Music Director, and Vice-Moderator as Chairman. This committee shall work out as soon as possible each year an Associational Calendar for the coming year and present same to the General Board for Adoption.

Section 10: THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE, composed of three members, shall draw up and present to the Association resolutions of appreciation; plan and promote the work of O - C - M in an annual planning meeting; and present resolutions of appreciation to individuals, organizations, and churches when there are events worthy of commendation.

Section 11: THE HISTORICAL COMMITTEE shall be composed of the Historian as chairman and 6 other members. It shall be the duty of the historical committee to collect, compile, and preserve all materials of interest to the Association and member churches. It shall make its report at the Annual Association meeting.

Section 12: THE SEMINARY EXTENSION COMMITTEE, composed of three members, shall publicize study courses and programs that are available; and shall plan, provide and promote Seminary Extension studies as they may be desired.

Section 13: THE CHRISTIAN LIFE COMMITTEE, composed of 6 members, will give continual attention to the moral climate of the community and shall initiate necessary action to maintain and improve the climate. The committee shall commend those persons and institutions that uphold Christian virtue, and shall support the churches in the teaching of Christian personal and social righteousness.

Section 14: THE COMMITTEE ON COMMITTEES, composed of 3 members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution (Article IX, Section 1), and shall assist the General Board in filling vacancies on all standing committees occurring between sessions. This committee shall also name the Chairmen of each committee.

Section 15: THE PLACE AND PREACHER COMMITTEE, composed of three members, shall receive of which invitations for the place or places of meetings for the next annual meeting of the Association, and shall recommend place or places. It shall also recommend the preacher and alternate for the annual service.

Section 16: THE ENROLLMENT COMMITTEE shall prepare for and direct the enrollment of the messengers at all of the sessions.

Section 17: THE YOUTH AND FAMILY SERVICES COMMITTEE, composed of 3 members, shall assist the Youth and Family Services Director in co-ordinating the work of Associational Youth and Family Services.

Section 18: THE CHURCH RECONCILIATION COMMITTEE shall be composed of the present Moderator, as chairman, two immediate past Moderators and two lay persons to be appointed annually by the above stated members. The chairman will report to the Executive Committee or the General Board the names of those lay persons appointed. This committee will be open to any person or persons of a member church seeking assistance with problems related to their church.

Section 19: THE MISSIONS COMMITTEE shall be made up of the following members: The Director of Missions will be the chairman, without voting privileges; Moderator; Vice-Moderator; Clerk-Treasurer; Finance Committee Chairman; Sunday School Director; Church Training Director; Brotherhood Director; WMU Director; and President of the Pastor's Conference.

This committee is to be available as a sounding board, to support the Director of Missions as a person (as well as an officer in the association), provide feed-back concerning Associational programs and activities, conveying suggestions from the Association, and offering support in projecting programs to Executive Committee and/or General Board. The Missions Committee has no authority other than to make recommendations to the Executive Committee or the General Board. The Missions Committee may be called together at the discretion of the Chairman or determine its own meeting time and place.

Section 20: THE SOUTH MOUNTAIN CAMP COMMITTEE shall promote the camp program in the Association, attend the annual meeting of the camp, and be aware of the needs and plans, cooperate with the Director of Missions.

Section 21: THE RECREATION AND DRAMA COMMITTEE shall promote a program of Christian recreation and drama in the churches. The Committee shall regard recreation and drama as a means, not programs as a way to teach, a means of witnessing and an avenue of expressing the abundant Christian life. The Recreation and Drama Committee shall be responsible to give assistance to any church that should request help in the area of recreation and drama. The Committee's responsibilities shall include fellowships, Senior Adults, Retreats, Crafts, Drama Workshops and other assignments of the Association if asked. The chairman of the Recreation and Drama Committee shall plan with the Director of Missions and give a report of the Committee's activities at the General Board quarterly meetings.

Section 22: Members of all these committees, except those appointed by the moderator, shall be elected to serve not more than three years on a rotating basis.

By-Law V TRUSTEES

The duty of the trustees shall be to hold in trust any property, money, endowment, or other securities of said Association, and they shall handle all legal matters of the Association under the direction of the Association or its General Board.

By-Law VI DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS

Section 1: His selection shall be upon the recommendation of the Executive Committee and on vote by the Association at its annual meeting, or between sessions of the Association, by its General Board. His time of office shall continue until terminated by mutual consent or request of either party. He shall be a member of all committees and organizations of the Association in a serving and advisory capacity.

By-Law VII AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the By-Laws may be made at any session of the annual meeting by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

By-Law IX DEFINE PROCEDURE

Section 1: The business session of the Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.

Section 2: Every report, resolution, or amendment offered to the Association shall be submitted in writing if requested by the Moderator.

Section 3: No person shall speak more than twice on the same subject except by permission of the Association.

Section 4: Messengers present from half the churches shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5: Unless the Association decides otherwise, annual Sessions shall be held on a rotating basis with a church or churches in each of the six Associational Groups as follows: Polkville, Lattimore, Shelby, Kings Mountain, Grover, and Waco.

SEARCH COMMITTEE REPORT

Just over one year ago, the General Board of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association voted to employ an associate who will serve as Director of Christian Social Ministries. In keeping with that decision, Moderator Carlos Young appointed a Search Committee with W. Clyde Bearden as Chairman. Other members of the committee are Mrs. John Berry Hamrick, Vice-Chairman, Rev. Charley Sandifer, Secretary, Mr. Norman Bud Talley, Mrs. Katy Ruth Dixon, Rev. L. D. Scruggs, Rev. Russell Pitts, And Rev. C. A. Kirby, Jr. Rev. Clae Borders, our Director of Missions, was invited by the committee to meet with us, and he has been of great help.

The first responsibility of the committee was that of writing a job description and a policy statement. This task was completed, however, while writing the job description, the committee began to see the advantages and wisdom of an association with the City and Metropolitan Missions Department of the Baptist State Convention, and the Home Missions Board. After consultation with Dr. Ernest Upchurch, who represents both of these boards, the committee asked the General Board, meeting in regular session at the Polkville Church, January 17, 1977, for permission to negotiate an agreement with these two boards. Permission was granted, and the committee began to work in this direction.

A Job Description and Guidelines for Agreements for Christian Social Ministries were written, in keeping with the requirements of the Home Mission Board, and presented to the General Board in its regular meeting at the Ear Church, April 18, 1977. After thorough discussion, the General Board unanimously adopted both documents.

Since that time the committee has given careful and prayerful consideration to the thirty-seven applications we have received. We have tried to establish an order of priority for our investigation, and at present, we are conducting an intensified investigation of one of the applicants.

The committee will make a recommendation to the General Board just as soon as we have found the person we believe to be God's man for the position. This is what we believe you have asked us to do, and not just fill a position.

Your Search Committee has met regularly, and has worked faithfully and prayerfully, and we sincerely invite your continued interest, help, and prayers. We earnestly seek God's blessings on all our search and investigation, that His guiding hand will be upon the work when it is begun.

REPORT OF SUMMER WORKER

It is always exciting for me to sit back and hear of the many activities going on in our association and to know that I'm a small part of such an energetic, dedicated, enthusiastic and outgoing team.

I hope tonight as we recapture the highlights of my summer work that you won't feel it's something Debbie has done, but rather something that you've been a very vital part of. Before I begin, let me assure you I've made many mistakes, but I feel God used these mistakes to help me and give me new direction. For those of you who may not be familiar with my work, I would briefly like to share with you the job description which guided the committee to calling me as your summer worker two summers ago.

1. To call attention to and stimulate the use of puppets in worship and teaching.
2. To offer a day camping experience to the churches in the association.
3. To begin as many Backyard Bible Clubs as possible.
4. To offer a variety of worship services to the Kings Mountain State Park.

In fulfilling this job description it was a joy for me to visit in 42 churches across our association. As I visited these churches I was constantly reminded of the words of a familiar song, "Give of the best to your Master, Give Him first place in your heart. Give Him first place in your service, Consecrate every part. Give and to you shall be given; God His beloved Son gave; Gratefully seeking to serve Him, Give Him the best that you have." These words printed on an index card and attached to my dash panel kept me reminded of my purpose in visiting these churches. As I introduced them to these new ministries I was also to encourage them to use their talent and resources that they might gratefully serve Him; and that as they gave of their very best to these ministries as well as to other church activities they would see growth in their church and community as well as in their mission outreach. The words also said, "Give and to you shall be given" and I believe because many of you gave of yourselves—your time, energy and talent—God so graciously gave back to us by allowing us to have:

- 21 successful Backyard Bible Clubs
- 18 Day camps
- 14 Kings Mountain State Park Programs
- 12 churches involved in a Puppet Ministry.

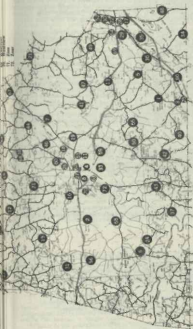
Tonight I would like for us to look at each of these areas in a little more detail:

- a. Of the 21 Backyard Bible Clubs held, 15 different churches were involved in conducting the clubs which varied in length from one night to one week. The

average attendance ranged from 10-12 persons. We had 4 Backyard Bible Clubs conducted by mission organizations of various churches which they held in black or economically deprived neighborhoods where the children seldom attended church and knew very little of Jesus Christ. Including these children approximately 250 children were reached through Backyard Bible Clubs this past summer.

b. Of the 18 Day Camps held, 13 churches were involved in conducting these. The majority of day camps held ran for 3 days with attendance ranging anywhere from 15-100 children.

A highlight of the day camping program was the one held at the Boy's Club. This program met once a week for five meetings reaching 100 boys per meeting. Through the entire Day Camping Program approximately 450 children were exposed to learning about God through nature.

c. The Kings Mountain State Park Program was a big success this summer. We held 14 Saturday evening programs with the attendance ranging from a low of 65 to a high of 250. The park programs became something the campers looked forward to and I received so many complimentary remarks about the programs there. I'd like to share with you 2 letters that I received concerning how the campers felt about the programs.

This first letter I received after my Pre-school Choir sang--my children call me "Miss Debbie," this particular lady overheard them and she addressed my letter:

Dear Miss Debbie,

I just wanted to let you know what an inspiration the program was to me on Saturday evening. I'm sure God was in our midst for He touched my heart even through the simplicity of those little children. May you know of my prayers for you and may God bless you in your summer work.

Remember us in your prayers as we travel and we look forward to visiting the campground and attending your program the weekend of August 18. Take care--see you then.

I had the privilege of meeting not only this couple and this elderly lady but many others who shared with us in these worship experiences.

One of the most fruitful ministries we had this summer was our puppet ministry. We started the summer off with only 3 churches with an active puppet ministry and we now have 7 in our area with 5 others in the process of introducing this ministry to their people. In order to help these churches enrich their puppet ministries, we formed an associational puppet team. This group, composed of 14 young dedicated people, representing 7 different churches, worked up the production, "Musical Stories for Puppets and People." They presented this production 3 times and had many invitations which we had to turn down. I was extremely pleased with the work that they did. I think all who have had any dealings with puppets have found them to be a unique way of preaching and teaching, and have proven them to be a great asset for many churches.

I feel the summer has been a rich and rewarding one. Words cannot express or describe to you what being your summer youth worker has meant to me. I thank God for the privilege as well the opportunity that was mine in serving you. May you know there's a special place in my heart for each of you and that I'm praying for you and your church.

In closing I'd like to leave with you a short story that was shared with me while visiting one of our churches. This story again reminded me I was to give God my very best, not only in my job but in every area of my life.

One morning a Hindu mother went out to the banks of the Ganges, leading by either hand her two children. A missionary saw her going to the banks of the river, and he knew why she was going there. He looked into her eyes with all the pleading of fatherhood and tried to persuade her not to do it--not to give up one of these little children. Then he looked at the faces of the two children. One of them was as perfect a baby as any mother ever held close to her heart; the other was lame and blind. But he knew he could not persuade that woman to break from the thought of centuries in a single hour's pleading. He came back to the spot, and saw the mother still standing by the river bank, her heart breaking! One child was missing. As the missionary drew near he discovered that the perfect child was gone; the mother had kept the little blind and lame one for herself. As he looked into the eyes of that mother, he said to her "Woman, if you had to give one up, why didn't you give this little lame and blind one and keep the perfect one for yourself?" She said, "O Sir, I do not know what kind of God you have in America, but I know that here in India our god expects us to give him our very best."

Tonight my prayer and my challenge to each of you is to give Him your very best!

EVANGELISM REPORT

This has been a busy and exciting year for the Evangelism Committee of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association. Plans were made in the fall of 1976 for a county-wide crusade in the summer of 1977. The James Robinson Evangelistic Association agreed to participate in a county-wide effort July 24-25 of 1977 at the Stanton Memorial Stadium, Shelby High School, Shelby.

A Kick-Off Banquet for the crusade was held at Gardner-Webb College in February with 500 people from the Association in attendance. A follow-up seminar conducted by Dudley Hall had 900 in attendance and was rated a Number 1 spiritual experience.

The churches and people of this Association made this effort possible, and we thank God for their support and love. The crusade is another first for Kings Mountain Baptist.

There is one sad note in our report this year. Revells for Revival, a radio program sponsored by the Association, was discontinued in May of 1977.
