## PLEASANT RIDGE BAPTIST CHURCH

### Historical Sketch - 1915-1978

Prior to the organization of the church in 1915, a Sunday School was held in the Old Pleasant Ridge school building. Mr. P. C. Blanton, then a member of the Beaver Dam Baptist Church, was in charge of the Sunday School.

With a membership of twenty-six males and twenty-nine females, the Pleasant Ridge Church was accepted as a member of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association in September, 1915. The messengers to that association were J. B. McSwain and J. J. Sperling.

The first building was erected in the fall of 1915, on a tract of land formerly owned by the L. A. McSwain family. It was a memorable occasion when the first members moved into this building, which was valued at \$2,000.

The Rev. B. M. Bridges was called to serve as the first pastor of this new church. The first deacons included: J. B. McSwain, L. E. Putnam, P. C. Blanton, G. B. McSwain, G. L. Hamrick, and G. W. McSwain.

In 1921, the Rev. I. D. Harrell became the second pastor. Mr. Harrell served until 1928, and the following year the Rev. W. G. Camp succeeded him, preaching on Saturday and Sunday afternoons. Mr. Camp served until 1939.

In 1940, the Rev. Jesse Blalock became the fourth pastor, and served until 1943. In 1946, Rev. W. G. Camp became pastor for the second time, and served until 1954.

The first building seemed adequate for the community until 1951. In the fall of that year, a Thanksgiving service was held in the new building, which was valued at about \$140,000.

In June 1954, the Rev. Albert Hastings became pastor. In 1956, the church constructed a beautiful parsonage near the church plant. Mr. Hastings served until 1957. In October, 1957, the Rev. James Stamey became the church's sixth pastor.

In December 1957, the second building was totally lost by fire. For twenty-three months, services were held at the Lanesboro school building. In November 1959, the present plant was ready for regular services. Mr. Stamey served until February, 1967.

In July, 1967, the church called the Rev. J. Max Evington to become the seventh pastor of the church.



E. Paul West, the present pastor, has served Pleasant Ridge since January, 1973.

The present building, the parsonage, and almost nine acres of land, bring the total value of church property to \$350,000. The total church membership is 348 and total gifts to the church for all causes in 1977 were \$57,000.

## CONSTITUTION

### Preamble

We, the members of Missionary Baptist Churches in the County of Cleveland, State of North Carolina, and territory adjacent thereto, do hereby propose to establish and maintain the principles and rules of order of a district Association in conformity to the following plan:

### ARTICLE I NAME

The name of this body shall be the Kings Mountain Baptist Association.

### ARTICLE II PURPOSE

It shall be the purpose of the Association to cooperate with the State and Southern Baptist Convention in the promotion of Christian Missions at home and abroad and in any other related objects such as evangelism, Christian Education, Benevolent Enterprises, and Social Services, which it may deem proper and a desirable for the furtherance of the Kingdom of God.

### ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: The Association shall be composed of cooperating Baptist churches in the area of the Association.

Section 2: Churches desiring membership in the Association shall apply to the Membership Committee. Application should include:

1. Formal action by the group seeking admission reflecting that 75% of those voting expresses their intent to cooperate.
2. A written statement reflecting their beliefs and practices.
3. A written statement that expresses their intent to cooperate.
4. A willingness to meet with Membership Committee to discuss other items of mutual interest to both parties.

The Membership Committee should be sensitive to groups seeking its services and be willing to present a statement of Baptist belief and practice and what it means to cooperate with the churches in the Association in a world-wide mission program. If recommended by this committee and accepted by the Association, a mission or a church shall agree to come under the watchcare shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of the Association except their members shall not hold office nor vote.

Section 3: The Association shall be the sole judge of its membership and may receive churches, or reject churches, according to its constitution and by-laws. Member churches may also withdraw as they desire, and if requested, the Associational Executive Board may grant letters of recommendation to other like associations.

#### ARTICLE IV MEETINGS

Section 1: The Association shall meet annually on Tuesday and Wednesday after the third Sunday in October and continue until the business of the Association is disposed of.

Section 2: Special meetings may be called by the Moderator or Executive Board provided two weeks notice is given to the member churches.

Section 3: Each church shall elect annually, in addition to the pastor, two messengers to the meetings of the Association for each 50 members of the church, provided each church shall not have less than three nor more than ten messengers. These shall constitute the voting body of the Association. The names of messengers printed in the minutes shall include only those in attendance and registering at the Associational meeting.

#### ARTICLE V AUTHORITY

Each church in this Association is independent and sovereign in its own affairs, and the Association has no authority over the churches except as provided in this Constitution in Article III, Section 2 and 3.

#### ARTICLE VI OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTIONS

Section 1: The officers of the Association shall be Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, Auditor, Historian, Music Director, Organist, Sunday School Director, Chairman of the Library Council, Baptist Youth for Christ Director, and Parliamentarian.

Section 2: The officers shall be elected on the morning of the last day of the annual meeting for a term of one year each. The nominees shall be contacted and nominated by the Committee on Nominations (By-Law, Section 6) except the Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, WMU Director and Brotherhood Director shall be nominated and contacted for acceptance by their respective organizations and presented by the Committee on Nominations with their report of nominees. Committee nominations shall not preclude nominations from the floor.

Section 3: The newly elected Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk/Treasurer shall assume at the close of the annual session all duties

incumbent upon them relating to the work of the ensuing associational year. All other officers shall assume all duties incumbent upon them relating to the work of the ensuing year on the following January 1.

Section 4: Any person having served two terms as Moderator shall be ineligible for re-election for two years.

## ARTICLE VII TRUSTEES AND THEIR ELECTION

There shall be three Trustees of the Association, one preferably a lawyer, serving terms of three years each on a rotating basis. On nomination by the Committee on Nominations, one new trustee shall be elected at the Annual Meeting, no trustee being eligible to succeed himself until after the lapse of one year. The expiration date of each trustee's term of office shall appear by his name in the Associational Minutes.

## ARTICLE VIII THE ASSOCIATIONAL EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Associational Executive Board shall be composed of all Associational officers (Article VI, Section 1), the Associational Director of Missions, the Christian Social Ministries Director, (ex officio without voting privileges), each active pastor, two members chosen by each member church from its membership and certified to the Association in its annual report, and chairmen of all standing committees of the Association. The Associational Executive Board shall have the authority to act for the Association between sessions, except as limited by the Constitution. Associational Executive Board members are the connecting link between the Association and the churches. Executive Board members should represent the churches to the Association. Executive Board members should act as representatives for the Associational Executive Board members to promote the programs, represent the needs and report to the churches concerning the work and ministry of the Association. Executive Board members should seek acceptable means of representing the Association to their respective fellowships. It shall be the duty of the Associational Executive Board to meet quarterly and to make reports and recommendations to the Association in its annual meeting.

The quarterly meetings will be in October, January, April, and July, on Monday after the third Sunday.

## ARTICLE IX COMMITTEES

Section 1: The Association shall have the following standing committees, with their terms of office being from the close of the annual meeting through the following annual meeting.

A. To be nominated by the Committee on Committees and elected by the Association at the annual meeting:

- (1) Order of Business and Program Committee (By-Law IV, Section 1)
- (2) Executive Committee (By-Law IV, Section 2)
- (3) Evangelism Committee (By-Law IV, Section 3)
- (4) Finance Committee (By-Law IV, Section 4)
- (5) Ordination Committee (By-Law IV, Section 5)
- (6) Nominating Committee (By-Law IV, Section 6)
- (7) Constitution Committee (By-Law IV, Section 7)
- (8) Membership Committee (By-Law IV, Section 8)
- (9) Calendar Committee (By-Law IV, Section 9)
- (10) Resolutions Committee (By-Law IV, Section 10)
- (11) Historical Committee (By-Law IV, Section 11)
- (12) Seminary Extension Committee (By-Law IV, Section 12)
- (13) Christian Life Committee (By-Law IV, Section 13)
- (14) Christian Social Ministry Committee (By-Law IV, Section 17)
- (15) Church Reconciliation Committee (By-Law IV, Section 18)
- (16) Mission Committee (By-Law IV, Section 19)
- (17) Recreation and Drama Committee (By-Law IV, Section 20)
- (18) Any other committee authorized by the Association.

B. To be appointed by the Moderator at the annual meeting, Committee on Committees. (By-Law IV, Section 14).

Section 2: The following committee shall be appointed by the Moderator at least thirty days prior to the annual meeting to serve during the annual meeting:

- (1) Enrollment Committee (By-Law IV, Section 16)

## ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this constitution may be made at any annual session of the Association upon an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the voting members present. Proposed changes must be presented to the Association on the first day and voted upon by a standing vote of the Association on the last day. It is recommended that all proposed changes first be submitted to the Constitution Committee.

## BY-LAWS

### By-Law I PARLIAMENTARY RULES

Robert's Rules of Order shall be followed as the Association's rules for conducting its deliberative assemblies, except as the Association prescribed otherwise.

### By-Law II ASSOCIATIONAL YEAR

The Associational Year shall begin October 1 and close September 30.

### By-Law III DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1: The Moderator shall preside over the meeting of the body according to the Constitution and By-Laws, appoint Committee on Committees and Committee on Enrollment. He shall be the Chairman of the Associational Executive Board and be an *ex officio* (Without voting privileges) member of all other committees. Upon completion of his term of office, the Moderator shall become a member-at-large (for two years) of the Mission Committee, Executive, and the Executive Board.

Section 2: The Vice-Moderator shall preside in the absence, or at the pleasure, of the Moderator, and shall be the Vice-Chairman of the Executive Board.

Section 3: The Clerk-Treasurer shall send annual report forms to the member churches at least a month before the Association's annual meeting, distribute at the annual meeting copies of the digest of these reports, make an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, supervise the printing and distributing of Minutes to the member churches, keep on file copies of Minutes, records, and other documents of the Association, and shall also serve as Secretary of the Executive Board. He shall inform all members elected to office or appointed to serve on committees of such action. He shall receive and bank all funds of the Association in the name of the Association; disburse the same upon instructions from the Association, its Executive Board, or as designated in the Budget (no money is to be disbursed which is not included in the budget except upon recommendation of the Finance Committee to the Executive Board of the Association in Annual Session); render an accurate report of receipts and disbursements and distribute same at the annual meeting and give a report at each quarterly Executive Board meeting and keep books available and up-to-date for examination.

Section 4: The Auditor shall, at the close of the Association Year, make an audit of the Treasurer's records and report to the Association in session.

Section 5: The Historian shall collect and preserve historical data on the Association and its churches, and make a written report to each annual meeting of the Association.

Section 6: The Sunday School Director shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Sunday School Department. This officer shall attend the Executive Committee meetings and offer creative plans to this committee that would promote this work.

The Associational Sunday School should assist church leaders to be more effective in their responsibility. This should include:

1. Provide opportunities for fellowship and inspiration.
2. Interpret the Sunday School Program.
3. Train Sunday School leaders.
4. Consult with Sunday School leaders concerning their program.
5. Provide organization and leadership for cooperative work among the churches.

Section 7: The Church Training department shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Church Training Department by the Executive Committee of the Association is carried out and that the on-going work of this department is maintained at all times.

Section 8: The Music Director shall provide leadership for the Association in session and when requested at other times during the year. This officer shall attend the Executive Committee meeting and offer creative plans to this Committee that would promote the work. He shall encourage music growth in the churches throughout the year and shall make a written report to the annual meeting.

Section 9: The Brotherhood Director shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of men and boys in the churches. The officer shall attend the Executive Committee meetings and offer creative plans to promote the development of men and boys and an awareness of world missions needs.

Section 10: The Woman's Missionary Union Director serves on the Executive Committee of the Association and works with the Director of Missions; leads the WMU Council; confers with other associational WMU officers and assists them in their work; leads in providing opportunities for leaders and members of church WMUs to have fellowship and receive inspiration concerning their mutual missions task; leads in interpreting the WMU program to church leaders; leads in training church WMU workers and members; consults with church leaders concerning initiation of WMU work and the improvement of

existing work; provides at and plans for associational meeting; leads in associational WMU annual planning; leads in discovering mission aition needs and in coordinating the work being done; and reports progress of WMU work to the association and serves as contact between the association and state WMU.

Section 11: The Chairman of the Library Council shall promote the beginning and maintenance of church libraries in the churches; provides training opportunities for church librarians; maintain and develop the associational library; attend the Executive Committee meetings; cooperate with the Director of Missions and make an annual report to the association at its annual session.

Section 12: The Baptist Youth for Christ Director shall, under the supervision of the Director of Missions, guide and promote the youth activities of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association. Such activities may include:

1. Youth Council sessions
2. Bi-monthly sessions of Youth for Christ in local churches.
3. A Kairos Crusade for Christ every 3 to 5 years.
4. Mission Vacation Bible School and/or Backyard VBS.

5. Sponsorship of a booth at Cleveland County Fair each October. Council, Director of Missions, and Executive Committee deems necessary to foster a positive Christian witness for Christ.

Section 13: The Parliamentarian shall, at the annual meeting of the Association, rule on all questions of parliamentary procedure which shall arise during the sessions. The Parliamentarian shall serve as a resource person to the churches and shall, upon request, advise and assist the churches on matters of parliamentary procedure.

Section 14: Vacancies occurring between annual sessions shall be filled by the Executive Board except the office of Moderator, in which case the Vice-Moderator shall automatically become Moderator.

#### **By-Law IV DUTIES OF COMMITTEES**

Section 1: THE ORDER OF BUSINESS AND PROGRAM COMMITTEE shall be composed of three members and the Moderator, Clerk, and the Associational Music Director. It shall rotate the place of meeting among the groups of churches with the host church being determined by the group. It shall recommend the Preacher and the alternate for the annual sermon. It shall prepare a printed program for the Annual Meeting for the Association which shall be sent to all persons on the program and to all pastors at least thirty days before the annual meeting. It shall, on the opening day of the Annual Meeting of the Association, present the printed program for adoption and serve through the session when adjustments in the order of business become



necessary. This Committee will be responsible for promoting the annual meeting through the various news media.

## Section 2: THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

(1) Shall be composed of the Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk/Treasurer, Music Director, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, Brotherhood Director, WMU Director, Baptist Youth for Christ director, Chairperson of the Christian Social Ministry Committee; President of the Pastor's Conference, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, Chairman of Committee on Committees, Chairman of Christian Life Committee, Chairman of Membership Committee, Chairman of Finance Committee, and Chairman of Evangelists.

(2) When without a Director of Missions, this Committee shall seek out and recommend to the Association, or its Executive Board, for election of a new Director of Missions according to By-Law VI, Section 11.

(3) It shall administer all matters referred to it by the Association or Executive Board and act on routine or emergency matters concerning business management, approve employment of all office personnel, deal with problems relating to personnel, and maintain adequate equipment for the office. It shall meet regular by not less than quarterly, but a quorum of seven is necessary to transact business.

Section 3: THE EVANGELISM COMMITTEE, composed of 6 members, shall promote the work of Evangelism in the churches and the Association in cooperation with the State Department of Evangelism. All plans and programs to be subject to the approval of the Association or its Executive Board.

Section 4: THE FINANCE COMMITTEE, composed of three members, with the treasurer shall study the Association's financial needs of an adequate program, present a budget to the Association for the following year, devise plans for securing the cooperation of the churches in raising funds to meet the budget, and make a written report to the annual meeting.

The Committee shall be prepared to assist any church within the association, upon request, with the stewardship programs offered by the Convention.

The Committee shall express gratitude to the churches for their stewardship development that enables them to participate in local, home, and foreign missions.

Section 5: THE ORDINATION COMMITTEE, composed of five members, with the pastor of the home church (the church of which the candidate is a member), Director of Missions, and deacons of the home and requesting churches, shall, when requested by a member church, assist with the examination and ordination of a candidate for the Gospel Ministry.

The Committee requires that it receive a copy of that portion of the Minutes, signed by the clerk, of the church conference at which the home church voted to request examination of the candidate.

The Committee requires that the candidate be called by a church for ministry before requesting examination.

The Chairman shall notify the candidate of the time, place, and procedure.

The Committee suggests that the candidate be questioned at least two weeks prior to his ordination.

The Committee shall question the candidate about his conversion, his call, his priorities, his doctrine, and his personal life. The Committee may also counsel the candidate.

The candidate should feel free to seek advice from the Committee regarding any area of the ministry.

In every instance, the Committee shall be guided by the Scripture, especially 1 Timothy 3:1-7 and Titus 1:5-9.

The Committee shall give written notice to the home church as to whether or not it recommends that the church proceed with the ordination.

The Chairman shall report the Committee's activities to the Executive Board quarterly and provide a written report for the annual meeting.

**Section 6: THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE**, composed of 6 members, shall contact before and nominate on the last day of the annual meeting of the Association the officers of the Association according to Articles VI and VIII of the Constitution. This Committee, shall also, in cooperation with the Nominating Committee of various departments except the WMU and Brotherhood organizations, recommend workers for these various. The officers and workers of these respective organization shall be nominated by the organization themselves and submitted to the Nominating Committee. (Article VI, Section 1). It shall also nominate Associational Representatives for the various institutions and agencies of our convention and members of the General Board of our Baptist State Convention. This Committee shall also assist the Executive Board in filling vacancies which occur between annual meetings of the Association. This Committee's nominations shall not preclude other nominations from the floor.

**Section 7: THE CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE**, composed of 3 members, shall be available to study changes or revisions in the Constitution, and to make recommendations as needed.

**Section 8: THE MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE**, composed of 5 members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution and By-Laws. The Membership Committee should be sensitive to groups seeking its services and be willing to present a statement of Baptist faith

and practice and what it means to cooperate with other churches in the Association in a world-wide mission program. The Membership Committee shall annually review all churches and missions under the watchcare of the Association and may present them for membership within the Association or that they continue under the watchcare.

Section 9: THE CALENDAR COMMITTEE shall be composed of the following Associational officers: Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, WMU Director, Brotherhood Director, Music Director, and Vice-Moderator as Chairman. This committee shall work out as soon as possible each year an Association Calendar for the coming year and present same to the Executive Board for adoption.

Section 10: THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE composed of 3 members, shall draw up and present to the Association resolutions of appreciation; plan and promote the work of the committee in an annual planning meeting; and present resolutions of appreciation to individuals, organizations, and churches when there are events worthy of commendation.

Section 11: THE HISTORICAL COMMITTEE shall be composed of the Historian as chairman and 6 other members. It shall be the duty of the Historical Committee to collect, compile, and preserve all materials of interest to the Association and member churches. It shall make its report at the Annual Association meeting.

Section 12: THE SEMINARY EXTENSION COMMITTEE, composed of 3 members, shall publicize study courses and programs that are available; and shall plan, provide and promote Seminary Extension studies as they may be desired.

Section 13: THE CHRISTIAN LIFE COMMITTEE, composed of 6 members, will give continual attention to the moral climate of the community and shall initiate necessary action to maintain and improve the climate. The committee shall commend those persons and institutions that uphold Christian virtue, and shall support the churches in the teaching of Christian personal and social righteousness.

Section 14: THE COMMITTEE ON COMMITTEES, composed of 5 members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution (Article IX, Section 1), and shall assist the Executive Board in filling vacancies on all standing committees occurring between sessions. This committee shall also name the Chairman of each committee.

Section 15: TELEPHONE CONTACT COMMITTEE shall be composed of one person from each group of churches in the Association (8). These committee members shall relay messages to pastors and key leaders during the year. All messages to be sent should be cleared with the Director of Missions.

Section 16: THE ENROLLMENT COMMITTEE shall prepare for and direct the enrollment of the messengers at all of the sessions.

Section 17: THE CHRISTIAN SOCIAL MINISTRY COMMITTEE, composed of 6 members, shall advise the CSM Director in the planning, promoting and correlation of the Christian Social Ministry programs. This is to be a subcommittee of the Associational Missions Committee, with the Chairperson of the CSM Committee serving as a member of the Missions Committee. Ex officio members shall be the Moderator and the Director of Missions.

Section 18: THE CHURCH RECONCILIATION COMMITTEE shall be composed of the present Moderator as chairman, two immediate past Moderators and two lay persons to be appointed annually by the above stated members. The chairman will report to the Executive Committee or the Executive Board the names of those lay persons appointed. This committee will be open to any person or persons of a member church seeking assistance with problems related to their church.

Section 19: THE MISSIONS COMMITTEE shall be made up of the following members: The Director of Missions will be the chairman, without voting privileges; Moderator; Vice-Moderator; Clerk-Treasurer; Finance Committee Chairman; Chairperson of CSM Committee ; Sunday School Director; Church Training Director; Brotherhood Director; WMU Director; and President of the Pastor's Conference.

This Committee is to be available as a sounding board, to support the Director of Missions as a person (as well as an officer in the Association), provide feed-back concerning Associational programs and activities, conveying suggestions from the Association, and offering support in projecting programs to the Executive Committee and/or Executive Board. The Missions Committee shall seek to determine areas of need within and without the Association and formulate recommendations to the Associational Executive Committee. This responsibility includes recommending the purchase of land for future church development to the Associational Executive Committee. The Missions Committee has no authority other than to make recommendations to the Executive Committee or the Executive Board. The Committee may be called together at the discretion of the Chairman or determine its own meeting time and place.

Section 20: THE RECREATION AND DRAMA COMMITTEE shall promote a program of Christian recreation and drama in the churches. The Committee shall regard recreation and drama as a means, not programs as a way to teach, a means of witnessing and an avenue of expressing the abundant Christian life. The Recreation and Drama Committee shall be responsible to give assistance to any church that should request help in the area of recreation and drama. The Committee's responsibilities shall include fellowships, Senior Adults, retreats, crafts, drama workshops and other assignments of the Association, if asked. The Chairman of the Recreation and Drama

Committee shall plan with the Director of Missions and give a report of the Committee's activities at the Executive Board quarterly meetings.

Section 21: Members of all these committees, except those appointed by the Moderator, shall be elected to serve not more than three years on a rotating basis.

### **By-Law V TRUSTEES**

The duty of the trustees shall be to hold in trust any property, money, endowment, or other securities of said Association, and they shall handle all legal matters of the Association under the direction of the Association or its Executive Board.

### **By-Law VI DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS**

Section 1: His selection shall be upon the recommendation of the Executive Committee and on vote by the Association at its annual meeting, or between sessions of the Association, by its Executive Board. His time of office shall continue until terminated by mutual consent or request of either party. He shall be a member of all committees and organizations of the Association in a serving and advisory capacity.

### **By-Law VII DIRECTOR OF CHRISTIAN SOCIAL MINISTRY**

Section 1: Employment...The Director of CSM shall be jointly employed by the Association, the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina and the Home Mission Board. The employee should be elected to work until the sponsoring groups mutually agree to cease the tenure of service or the employee resigns. The CSM Director shall work under the supervision of the Director of Missions and in compliance with the Job Description provided by the State and Association.

Section 2: Basic Function...The basic functions are to work with the CSM Committee to organize, supervise and promote a program of activities to meet the spiritual, educational, emotional and physical needs of the people within the geographical boundaries of the Association.

Section 3: The CSM Director shall be an ex officio member of the Associational Executive Board, Associational Executive Committee and Missions Committee without voting privileges.

Section 4: When without a Christian Social Ministries Director, the Associational Executive Committee shall be responsible for the appointment of a Search Committee to seek a person to serve as Christian Social Ministries Director according to By-Law VII Section 1 and 2.

### **By-Law VIII AMENDMENTS**

Amendments to the By-Laws may be made at any session of the Annual Meeting by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

### **By-Law IX DEFINE PROCEDURE**

Section 1: The business session of the Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.

Section 2: Every report, resolution, or amendment offered to the Association shall be submitted in writing if requested by the Moderator.

Section 3: No person shall speak more than twice on the same subject except by permission of the Association.

Section 4: Messengers present from half the churches shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5: Unless the Association decides otherwise, annual Sessions shall be held on a rotating basis with a church or churches in each of the six Associational Groups as follows: Polkville, Latimore, Shelby, Kings Mountain, Grover, and Waco.

### **By-Law X THE CONFESSION OF FAITH**

The Baptist Faith and Message as revised and adopted by the Southern Baptist Convention on May 9, 1963.

## PROCEEDINGS

### PLEASANT RIDGE BAPTIST CHURCH

October 17-18, 1978

Tuesday Afternoon

1. Mrs. Wallace Horn rendered a program of organ music as messengers and visitors gathered in Pleasant Ridge Baptist Church for the 628th Annual Session of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association.

2. Moderator William B. McDaniel called the meeting to order at 3 P.M.

13. A report on enrollment showed 255 messengers, 34 visitors for a total of 289 registered.

14. Reverend Cline Borders, Director of Missions, gave a digest of the Church Letters received up to now. This total does not include five churches whose letters were not in.

15. Reverend Bob Davis, Christian Social Ministries Director, gave his report. That report is found elsewhere in this volume.

16. Reverend Allen Jolley led the congregation in singing these hymns: "Why Do I Sing About Jesus?", "Saved, Saved!", and "How Great Thou Art!"

17. Reverend Richard Plyler, pastor of Patterson Grove Baptist Church and chairman of the General Building Committee, reported on the activities of his committee. He reported that they have visited three associational offices to view their facilities; selected an architect (Vaughn, Talley Associates); approved a floor plan and exterior sketch for the new associational office building. Mr. Plyler asked the people to pray for the committee.

He also expressed appreciation for the retired pastors in the association.

### **CHRISTIAN SOCIAL MINISTRIES REPORT**

On April 1st of this year I began serving as the Director of Christian Social Ministries of our association. This has been a busy and challenging work for me, and I am pleased to share the following report with you who have made it possible.

Since April 1st, it has been my privilege to speak to forty — four church groups. I appreciate the invitations received and the time that you allowed me to share with you. I would welcome the opportunity to come and share our work with you. As of October 1st, eighteen churches have responded to my request for a Christian Social Ministries Representative. I look forward to your letting me know of your representative.

In the area of Youth and Family Services, it has been my joy to have the privilege to work with fifteen families. Some of these have been through the Juvenile Court, some through the Department of Social Services, and some from the community at large. This summer we took fifteen youth involved in the Juvenile Court processes for a three — day retreat at Camp Lay White. This is being followed by a monthly social for these youth, and we are in the planning stages of some winter camping experiences for them. There is a tremendous challenge in sharing Christ with these youth and their families.

During this year we received Health Care Kits for the migrants. There were two churches who were involved in this project. These were delivered to the migrants at the Joe Pendleton farm near Polkville. Also, we received toys from one church. These toys were new and used and were taken to a day care facility for migrant children. Five Spanish interpreters were enlisted and most of these were used in working with a migrant who was ill and in the local hospital. This man spoke no English. We were able to help the doctors, nurses, technicians, and

personnel of the Migrant and Seasonal Farmworkers Association minister to him. Also, it gave us a great opportunity to let him know of our love and concern for him, and to share the love of God with him.

The prison ministry began in the latter part of September with a training session for students from Gardner-Webb College. There were twelve students who came for the training. We have begun the work in the prison, and on the first night there were eight students and twenty-five inmates at the service. In addition to this I go to the prison once a week and spend two hours in counseling on a one-to-one basis.

In the Emergency and Relief area of our work we assisted twelve families. This involved 61 people. Assistance was in the areas of fuel, clothing, medicine, rent, and referral. Three churches assisted by providing clothing news.

Our Literacy Ministry was begun with the enlisting of volunteers to work with the family from Laos. One volunteer is working with the two children at Shelby Junior High School, and we are in need of a volunteer to work with the three children at Graham School. We are looking forward to the literacy workshop to be held at the Westview Baptist Church on November 10th and 11th. On the 10th we will meet from 6:30 - 9:30 and on the 11th we will meet from 9:00 - 4:00. This will give us the required ten hours to be certified a Literacy Teachers. Mrs. Olna Davis from Gassonia will lead the workshop. The cost will be \$15.00 for materials.

My joy within my work has come about by the fine spirit of cooperation that you have shown to me; by the comment of the woman whose house we helped to save, who said, "Thank you so much. I didn't know there were so many nice people in the world"; the prison inmate who said, "You know, just the idea of someone telling you that they are going to do something for you and then do it with the speed that you did it in, is really something for which to be thankful"; the child at the migrant day care center who said, upon receipt of a health care kit, "Now I have my very own wash cloth"; the young man at Juvenile Retreat who said, "Thank you for letting me come here. This has really meant so much to me, and I appreciate being able to come. This is the first time that anyone has invited me to go anywhere"; and the Spanish speaking migrant farmworker who said to Viola Talley and then she to me, "I know that you love me because you speak my language and have come to talk to the doctors so that they might help me to get better, and I know that the senior loves me because he does not speak my language, yet he has come and stood by my bed in silence for two hours."

These situations and others like them bring a new depth of meaning to these words "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat; I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink; I was a stranger and you invited me in, naked and you clothed me, sick and in prison and

you visited me." Thank you for the continued joy of serving with you in the work of Christian Social Ministries.

## GENERAL BOARD REPORT

1977 - 1978

Four regular quarterly meetings of the General Board were held during the past church year. Our meetings were held on Monday evenings after the third Sunday, the months of October, January, April and July. Each of our meetings was well attended. Our programs were informative and inspirational. Our church host for the meetings were: October - Eastside, Shelby; January - Ross Grove; April - Kings Mountain; July - Poplar Springs. One special called meeting of the General Board was held March 16, 1978. The First Baptist Church of Kings Mountain was host for this Meeting.

Various reports of committees were received, in addition to routine matters. Major items of information and recommendations were approved by the General Board. Some of the items were:

(1) Unanimously approved the purchase of 1.6 acres of land on the north side of Wyke Road, adjoining Eastside Baptist Church in Shelby, to be an available site for a future office building for our Association.

(2) Approved the appointment of a Special Committee to study needs and present plans for an office building.

(3) Unanimously approved recommendation of Special Search Committee to call Reverend Robert C. Davis to serve as Christian Social Ministries Director.

(4) Approved a recommended Financial Budget for the Associational Year beginning October, 1978, in the amount of \$97,621.46.

## SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT

During the 1977-78 associational year, the Sunday School organization of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association has emphasized Bold Mission Outreach.

This Outreach emphasis began with the High Attendance Day on October 30, 1977.

In March, 1978, we had our VBS clinic under the fine leadership of Frank Stroupe of Elizabeth Church.



Then on April 24, we launched the Bold Mission Bible Conferences with simultaneous rallies at Second Baptist, Shelby under the leadership of John Tresh Jr., new professor of evangelism at Southeastern Seminary; at Macedonia Baptist in Kings Mountain, led by Cecil Seagle, pastor of Mulberry Baptist, Charlotte, and at Fallston Baptist, led by Dan Deaton, also of Charlotte. These rallies started the study of the book *God's Mission and Man's*, which teaches the biblical basis of Bold Missions. Following these rallies, participating pastors finished the study in the local churches.

The highlight of associational Sunday School activities was the Equipping Conference held September 10-11, 1978 at Elizabeth Baptist Church. The emphasis was again on outreach as the Book for study was *Witness to Win*, the suggested book for study during Sunday School Preparation Week. Enrollment was 294 from 37 churches.

Your associational Sunday School will continue its emphasis on outreach. This need is illustrated by the fact that while our area's total population has increased by 900, Sunday School enrollment has declined by almost the same (866). Average attendance has continued the decline started in 1976. Our average attendance this past year was 9,393.....1,000 less each Sunday in Sunday School through 1978.

The next big event is High Attendance Sunday, October 29.

The Sunday School Council is being trained to be resource people to help churches in our association to continue to develop their Sunday School work.

Next fall will see another training conference, Monday and Tuesday of the second week in September.

Our prayer is for our Sunday Schools to greatly develop their role in the evangelistic outreach of our churches.

## CHURCH TRAINING

The Church Training Department is proud to be a part of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association during these phases of Bold Missions. We have been strengthened by others in the Association and believe that we have made some contributions in the other departments as a part of the team.

We are pleased to announce that this has been a good year for the Church Training Department. Some of the things we have accomplished are:

First: We joined the Sunday School Department in sponsoring an associational-wide Equipping Conference on November 7 and 8, 1977. This was considered a very successful conference.

Second: We had two Banquets for International Students and M. S. at Gardner Webb College during the associational year. Each banquet

was well attended by both students and by members from several churches. Some pastors have given testimony that these banquets have been a means of building relationships between churches in the area and these students.

Finally: M-Night was held at Elizabeth Baptist Church on November 28. We had 187 in attendance from 20 churches. Two banners were given during the service. The church receiving the banner for the highest percent of Church Training enrollment present was New Buffalo with Mt. Sinai receiving the banner for the total highest number present.

We have very few of our plans for the new year completed at this time. We will, however, be available to assist any church at any time. We will also alert you of our projects through *The Beacon* and announcements at General Board Meetings.

## WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION REPORT

Article VIII

Article VIII

After Associational Director of Missions, add "Director of Christian Social Ministries." (Ex officio member without voting privileges).

Article IX, Section 1. W.A. (14).

Change to "Christian Social Ministry Committee."

By-Law III. Duties of Officers, delete Section 13.

By-Law IV.

Duties of Committees, Section 1 (1) Delete "Youth and Family Services." Add, "Chairperson of the Christian Social Ministry Committee."

By-Law IV, Section 3

Delete the paragraph referring to Reville for Revival.

By-Law IV, Section 5

The Ordination Committee, composed of five members, with the pastor of home church (the church of which the candidate is a member), Director of Missions, and deacons of the home and requesting churches, shall, when requested by a member church, assist with the examination and ordination of a candidate for the Gospel Ministry. The Committee requires that it receive a copy of that portion of the Minutes, signed by the clerk, of the church conference at which the home church voted to request examination of the candidate.

The Committee requires that the candidate be called by a church for ministry before requesting examination.

The Chairman shall notify the candidate of the time, place, and procedure. The Committee suggests that the candidate be questioned at least two weeks prior to his ordination.

The Committee shall question the candidate about his conversion, his call, his priorities, his doctrine, and his personal life. The Committee may also counsel the candidate.

The candidate should feel free to seek advice from the Committee regarding any area of the ministry.

In every instance, the Committee shall be guided by the Scripture, especially 1 Timothy 3:1-7 and Titus 6:5-9.

The Committee shall give written notice to the home church as to whether or not it recommends that the church proceed with the ordination.

The Chairman shall report the Committee's activities to the General Board quarterly and provide a written report for the annual meeting.

By-Law IV, Section 15.

Delete, as this has been replaced and assumed into the Order of Business Program Committee.

By-Law IV

Add new Section 15: "A Telephone Contact Committee." "The Telephone Contact Committee shall be composed of one person from each group of churches in the association (6). These committee members shall relay messages to pastors and key leaders during the year. All messages to be sent should be cleared with the Director of Missions."

By-Law IV, Section 17

Delete.

Add new Section 17. "The Christian Social Ministry Committee, composed of six members, shall assist the CSM Director in the planning, promoting and correlation of the CSM programs. This is to be a sub-Committee of the Associational Missions Committee, with the Chairpersons to the CSM Committee serving as a member of the Missions Committee. Ex officio members shall be the Moderator and the Director of Missions."

By-Law IV, Section 19

Add "Chairperson of the CSM Committee." Just before the sentence beginning, "The Missions Committee has no authority other than..." insert "The Missions Committee shall seek to determine areas of need within and without the Association and formulate recommendations to the Associational Executive Committee. This responsibility includes recommending the purchase of land for future church development to the Associational Executive Committee."

By-Law IV, Section 20.

Delete "South Mountain Camp Committee" and ask the Nominating Committee to nominate a contact person under Institutional Representatives.

By-Law VII

Change to "By-Law VIII": also change By-Law VIII to IX, IX to X; X to XI. Add new By-Law VII. "Director of Christian Social Ministry."

#### Section 1

"Employment. The Director of CSM shall be jointly employed by the Association, the Baptist State Convention of N.C., and the Home Mission Board. The employee should be elected to work until the sponsoring groups mutually agree to cease the tenure of service or the employee resigns. The CSM Director shall work under the supervision of the Director of Missions and in compliance with the Job Description provided by the State and Association."

#### Section 2

"Basic Function. The basic functions are to work with the CSM Committee to organize, supervise and promote a program of activities to meet the spiritual, educational, emotional and physical needs of the people within the geographical boundaries of the association."

#### Section 3

"The CSM Director shall be an ex officio member of the Associational Executive Board, Associational Executive Committee and Missions Committee without voting privileges."

#### Section 4

"When without a Christian Social Ministries Director, the Associational Executive Committee shall be responsible for the appointment of a Search Committee to seek a person to serve as Christian Social Ministries Director according to By-Law VII, Section 1 and 2."
