EASTSIDE BAPTIST CHURCH



Eastside Baptist Church was organized in December, 1911, with thirty-one charter members. The first pastor, C.O. Johnson, led in building the first sanctuary and was pastor for one year. Others who have served as pastors are: Reverend W.O. Camp, Reverend H.E. Waldron, Reverend R.P. Hamby, Reverend W.P. Higginstaff, Reverend E.B. Hicks, and the present pastor, Reverend Wilson W. Padgett, who has served for twenty-one years.

The church was moved eight years ago from Buffalo Street to its present site at 1165 Wyke Road. The \$500,000 church plant and facilities is located on a nine-acre site opposite the Jefferson Elementary School. The Kings Mountain Baptist Association Office site is adjacent to it.

The average length of pastorates for the church's seven pastors is eight and one-half years. The present resident membership is about six hundred.

DEDICATED



The 1979 Minutes of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association are dedicated to the memory of Reverend Tom W. Bray, who for more than forty years was a faithful preacher of God's Word.

Mr. Bray entered the ministry in 1936, having previously been a harbor and insurance representative. He was a veteran of World War I. He served churches in Clifford, Davidson and Rowan counties. (From 1950 until retirement in March of 1958, he served as Director of Missions of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association.)

Reverend Bray was a man of true compassion and a faithful follower of our Lord, Jesus Christ. He is survived by two sons, Thomas and William, and by his wife, Mrs. Edith Moore Bray.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

We, the members of Missionary Baptist Churches in the County of Cleveland, State of North Carolina, and territory adjacent thereto, do hereby propose to establish and maintain the principles and rules of order of a district Association in conformity to the following plan:

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of this body shall be the Kings Mountain Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

It shall be the purpose of the Association to cooperate with the State and Southern Baptist Convention in the promotion of Christian Missions at home and abroad and in any other related objects such as Evangelism, Christian Education, Benevolent Enterprises, and Social Services, which it may deem proper and desirable for the furtherance of the Kingdom of God.

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: The Association shall be composed of cooperating Baptist churches in the area of the Association.

Section 2: Churches desiring membership in the Association shall apply to the Membership Committee. Application should include:

1. Formal action by the group seeking admission reflecting that 75% of those voting expresses their intent to cooperate.
2. A written statement reflecting their beliefs and practices.
3. A written statement that expresses their intent to cooperate.
4. A willingness to meet with Membership Committee to discuss other items of mutual interest to both parties.

The Membership Committee should be sensitive to groups seeking its services and be willing to present a statement of Baptist belief and practice and what it means to cooperate with the churches in the Association in a world-wide mission program. If recommended by this committee and accepted by the Association, a relation or a church shall agree to come under the watchcare of the Association for a minimum of one year. Membership within the Association shall be determined by vote of the Association at its annual meeting. Churches under the watchcare shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of the Association except their members shall not hold office nor vote.

Section 3: The Association shall be the sole judge of its membership and may receive churches, or reject churches, according to its constitution and by-laws. Member churches may also withdraw as they desire, and if requested, the Associational Executive Board may grant letters of recommendation to other like associations.

ARTICLE IV MEETINGS

Section 1: The Association shall meet annually on Tuesday and Wednesday after the third Sunday in October and continue until the business of the Association is disposed of.

Section 2: Special meetings may be called by the Moderator or Executive Board, provided two weeks notice is given to the member churches.

Section 3: Each church shall elect annually, in addition to the pastor, two messengers to the meetings of the Association for each fifty members of the church, provided each church shall not have less than three nor more than ten messengers. These shall constitute the voting body of the Association. The names of messengers printed in the minutes shall include only those in attendance and registering at the Associational Meeting.

ARTICLE V AUTHORITY

Each church in this Association is independent and sovereign in its own affairs, and the Association has no authority over the churches except as provided in this Constitution in Article III, Section 2 and 3.

ARTICLE VI OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTIONS

Section 1: The officers of the Association shall be Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, Auditor, Historian, Music Director, Organist, Sunday School Director, Chairman of the Library Council, Baptist Youth for Christ Director, and Parliamentarian.

Section 2: The Moderator, Vice-Moderator and Clerk-Treasurer shall be elected on the morning of the last day of the annual meeting. All other officers shall be contacted and nominated by the Committee on Nominations and elected by the Associational Executive Board at their April meeting.

Section 3: The newly elected Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer shall assume at the close of the annual session all duties incumbent upon them relating to the work of the ensuing associational year. All other officers shall assume all duties incumbent upon them relating to the work of the ensuing year on October 1.

Section 4: Any person having served two terms as Moderator shall be ineligible for re-election for two years.

ARTICLE VII TRUSTEES AND THEIR ELECTION

There shall be three Trustees of the Association, one preferably a lawyer, serving terms of three years each on a rotating basis. On nomination by the Committee on Nominations, one new trustee shall be elected at the Annual Meeting, no trustee being eligible to succeed himself until after the lapse of one year. The expiration date of each trustee's term of office shall appear by his name in the Associational Minutes.

ARTICLE VIII THE ASSOCIATIONAL EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Associational Executive Board shall be composed of all Associational officers (Article VI, Section 1), the Associational Director of Missions, the Christian Social Ministries Director, *ex-officio* without voting privileges, each active pastor, two members chosen by each member church from its membership and certified to the Association in its annual report, and chairmen of all standing committees of the Association. The Associational Executive Board shall have the authority to act for the Association between sessions, except as limited by the Constitution. Associational Executive Board members are the connecting link between the Association and the churches. Executive Board members should represent the churches to the Association. Executive Board members should act as representatives for the Association to the churches. It is the responsibility of the Executive Board members to promote the programs, represent the needs and report to the churches concerning the work and ministry of the Association. Executive Board members should seek acceptable means of representing the Association to their respective fellowships. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to meet quarterly and to make reports and recommendations to the Association in its Annual Meeting.

The quarterly meetings will be in January, April and July, on Monday after the third Sunday.

ARTICLE IX COMMITTEES

Section 1: The Association shall have the following standing committees, with their terms of office being from the close of the annual meeting through the following annual meeting:

A. To be nominated by the Committee on Conditions and elected by the Association at the Annual Meeting:

1. Order of Business and Program Committee (By-Law IV, Section D)
2. Executive Committee (By-Law IV, Section 2)
3. Evangelism Committee (By-Law IV, Section 3)
4. Finance Committee (By-Law IV, Section 4)
5. Ordination Committee (By-Law IV, Section 5)
6. Nominating Committee (By-Law IV, Section 6)
7. Constitution Committee (By-Law IV, Section 7)
8. Membership Committee (By-Law IV, Section 8)
9. Calendar Committee (By-Law IV, Section 9)
10. Resolutions Committee (By-Law IV, Section 10)
11. Historical Committee (By-Law IV, Section 11)
12. Secretary Extension Committee (By-Law IV, Section 12)
13. Christian Life Committee (By-Law IV, Section 13)
14. Christian Social Ministry Committee (By-Law IV, Section 17)
15. Church Reconciliation Committee (By-Law IV, Section 18)
16. Mission Committee (By-Law IV, Section 19)
17. Recreation and Drama Committee (By-Law IV, Section 20)
18. Any other committee authorized by the Association.

B. To be appointed by the Moderator at the annual meeting: Committee on Committees. (By-Law IV, Section 14)

Section 2: The following committee shall be appointed by the Moderator at least thirty days prior to the Annual Meeting to serve during the Annual Meeting: Enrollment Committee (By-Law IV, Section 16).

ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this Constitution may be made at any Annual Session of the Association upon an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the voting members present. Proposed changes must be presented to the Association on the first day and voted upon by a standing vote of the Association on the last day. It is recommended that all proposed changes first be submitted to the Constitution Committee.

BY-LAWS

By-Law I PARLIAMENTARY RULES

Robert's Rules of Order shall be followed as the Association's rules for conducting its deliberative assemblies, except as the Association prescribes otherwise.

By-Law II ASSOCIATION YEAR

The Associational Year shall begin October 1 and close September 30.

By-Law III DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1: The Moderator shall preside over the meeting of the body according to the Constitution and By-Laws, appoint Committee on Committees and Committee on Enrollment. He shall be the Chairman of the Associational Executive Board and be an ex officio (without voting privileges) member of all other committees. Upon completion of his term of office, the Moderator shall become a member-at-large (for two years) of the Minnesota Committee, Executive, and the Executive Board.

Section 2: The Vice-Moderator shall preside in the absence, or at the pleasure, of the Moderator, and shall be the Vice-Chairman of the Executive Board.

Section 3: The Clerk-Treasurer shall send annual report forms to the member churches at least a month before the Association's Annual Meeting, distribute at the Annual Meeting copies of the digest of these reports, make an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, supervise the printing and distributing of Minutes to the member churches, keep on file copies of Minutes, records, and other documents of the Association, and shall also serve as Secretary of the Executive Board. He shall inform all members elected to office or appointed to serve on committees of such action. He shall receive and bank all funds of the Association in the name of the Association; disburse the same upon instructions from the Association, its Executive Board, or as designated in the budget (no money is to be disbursed which is not included in the budget except upon recommendation of the Finance Committee to the Executive Board or the Association in annual session); render an accurate report of receipts and disbursements and distribute same at the Annual Meeting and give a report at each quarterly Executive Board meeting and keep books available and up-to-date for examination.

Section 4: The Auditor shall, at the close of the Associational Year, make an audit of the Treasurer's records and report to the Association in session.

Section 5: The Historian shall collect and preserve historical data on the Association and its churches, and make a written report to each Annual Meeting of the Association.

Section 6: The Sunday School Director shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Sunday School Department. This officer shall attend the Executive Committee meetings and offer creative plans to this committee that would promote this work.

The Associational Sunday School should assist church leaders to be more effective in their responsibility. This should include:

1. Provide opportunities for fellowship and inspiration.
2. Interpret the Sunday School Program.
3. Train Sunday School leaders.
4. Consult with Sunday School leaders concerning their program.
5. Provide organization and leadership for cooperative work among the churches.

Section 7: The Church Training Department shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Church Training Department. This officer shall attend Executive Committee meetings, maintain the on-going work of this department at all times, and give an annual report to the Association.

Section 8: The Music Director shall provide leadership for the Association in session and when requested at other times during the year. This officer shall attend the Executive Committee meetings and offer creative plans to this Committee that would promote the work. He shall encourage music growth in the churches throughout the year and shall make a written report to the Annual Meeting.

Section 9: The Brotherhood Director shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of men and boys in the churches. The officer shall attend the Executive Committee meetings and offer creative plans to promote the development of men and boys and an awareness of world mission needs.

Section 10: The Woman's Missionary Union Director serves on the Executive Committee of the Association and works with the Director of Missions; leads the WMU Council; confers with our association WMU officers and assists them in their work; leads in providing opportunities for leaders and members of their church WMUs to have fellowship and receive inspiration concerning their mutual missions task; leads in interpreting the WMU program to church leaders; leads in training church WMU workers and members;

consults with church leaders concerning initiation of WMU work and the improvement of existing work; presides at and plans for associational meeting; leads in associational WMU annual planning; leads in discovering unmet action needs and in coordinating the work being done; and reports progress of WMU work to the Association and serves as contact between the Association and state WMU.

Section 11: The Chairman of the Library Council shall promote the beginning and maintenance of church libraries in the churches; provide training opportunities for church librarians; maintain and develop the associational library; attend the Executive Committee meetings; cooperate with the Director of Missions and make an annual report to the Association at its annual session.

Section 12: The Baptist Youth for Christ Director shall, under the supervision of the Director of Missions, guide and promote the youth activities of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association. Such activities may include:

1. Youth Council sessions.
2. Bi-monthly sessions of Youth for Christ in local churches.
3. A Kairos Crusade for Christ every 3 to 5 years.
4. Mission Vacation Bible School and/or Backyard VBS.
5. Sponsorship of a booth at Cleveland County Fair each October.
6. Any other activity which the Baptist Youth for Christ Director, Youth Council, Director of Missions, and Executive Committee deem necessary to foster a positive Christian witness for Christ.

Section 13: The Parliamentarian shall, at the Annual Meeting of the Association, rule on all questions of parliamentary procedure which shall arise during the sessions. The Parliamentarian shall serve as a resource person to the churches and shall, upon request, advise and assist the churches on matters of parliamentary procedure.

Section 14: Vacancies occurring between Annual Sessions shall be filled by the Executive Board, except the office of Moderator, in which case the Vice-Moderator shall automatically become Moderator.

By-Law IV DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Section 1: **The Order of Business and Program Committee** shall be composed of three members and the Moderator, Clerk and the Associational Music Director. It shall rotate the place of meeting among the groups of churches with the host church being determined by the group. It shall recommend the preacher and the alternate for the annual session. It shall prepare a printed program for the Annual Meeting for the Association, which shall be sent to all persons on the program and to all pastors at least thirty days before the Annual Meeting. It shall, on the opening day of the Annual Meeting of the Association, present the printed program for adoption and serve through the session when adjustments in the order of business become necessary. This committee will be responsible for promoting the Annual Meeting through the various news media.

Section 2: The Executive Committee

1. Shall be composed of the Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk/Treasurer, Music Director, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, Brotherhood Director, WMU Director, Baptist Youth for Christ Director, Chairperson of the Christian Social Ministries Committee; President of the Pastors' Conference; Chairman of the Nominating Committee, Chairman of Committee on Committees, Chairman of Christian Life Committee, Chairman of Membership Committee, Chairman of Finance Committee, and Chairman of Evangelism.

2. When without a Director of Missions, this committee shall seek out and recommend to the Association, or its Executive Board, for election of a new Director of Missions according to By-Law VI, Section 11.

3. It shall administer all matters referred to it by the Association or Executive Board and act on routine or emergency matters concerning business management, approve employment of all office personnel, deal with problems relating to personnel, and maintain adequate equipment for the office. It shall meet regularly, not less than quarterly, but a quorum of seven is necessary to transact business.

Section 3: The Evangelism Committee, composed of six members, shall promote the work of evangelism in the churches and the Association in cooperation with the State Department of Evangelism. All plans and programs to be subject to the approval of the Association or its Executive Board.

Section 4: The Finance Committee, composed of three members, with the treasurer, shall study the Association's financial needs of an adequate program, present a budget to the Association for the following year, devise plans for securing the cooperation of the churches in raising funds to meet the budget, and make a written report to the Annual Meeting.

The Committee shall be prepared to assist any church within the Association, upon request, with the stewardship programs offered by the Convention.

The Committee shall express gratitude to the churches for their stewardship development that enables them to participate in local, home, and foreign missions.

Section 5: The Ordination Committee, composed of five members, with the pastor of the home church (the church of which the candidate is a member), the Director of Missions, and delegates of the home and requesting churches, shall, when requested by a member church, assist with the examination and ordination of a candidate for the Gospel Ministry.

The Committee requires that it receive a copy of that portion of the Minutes, signed by the clerk, of the church conference at which the home voted to request examination of the candidate.

The Committee requires that the candidate be called by a church for ministry before requesting examination.

The Chairman shall notify the candidate of the time, place, and procedure.

The Committee suggests that the candidate be questioned at least two weeks prior to his ordination.

The Committee shall question the candidate about his conversion, his call, his priorities, his doctrine, and his personal life. The Committee may also counsel the candidate.

The candidate should feel free to seek advice from the Committee regarding any area of the ministry.

In every instance, the Committee shall be guided by the Scripture, especially 1 Timothy 3:1-7 and Titus 1:5-9.

The Committee shall give written notice to the home church as to whether or not it recommends that the church proceed with the ordination.

The Chairman shall report the Committee's activities to the Executive Board quarterly and provide a written report for the Annual Meeting.

Section 6: The Nominating Committee, composed of six members, shall contact before and nominate at the April Executive Board meeting, the officers of the Association according to Article VI and VIII of the Constitution. This Committee shall also, in cooperation with the Nominating Committee of various departments except the WMLU and Brotherhood organizations, recommend workers for these various departments. The officers and workers of these respective organizations shall be nominated by the organization themselves and submitted to the Nominating Committee (Article VI, Section 1). It

shall also nominate associational representatives for the various institutions and agencies of our convention and members of the General Board of our Baptist State Convention. This Committee shall also assist the Executive Board in filling vacancies which occur between annual meetings of the Association. This Committee's nominations shall not preclude other nominations from the floor.

Section 7: The Constitution Committee, composed of three members, shall be available to study changes or revisions in the Constitution, and to make recommendations as needed.

Section 8: The Membership Committee, composed of five members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution and By-Laws. The Membership Committee should be sensitive to groups seeking its services and be willing to present a statement of Baptist faith and practice and what it means to cooperate with other churches in the Association in a world-wide mission program. The Membership Committee shall annually review all churches and missions under the watchcare of the Association and may present them for membership within the Association or that they continue under the watchcare.

Section 9: The Calendar Committee shall be composed of the following Associational officers: Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, WMU Director, Brotherhood Director, Music Director and Vice-Moderator as chairman. This committee shall work out as soon as possible each year an Associational Calendar for the coming year and present same to the Executive Board for adoption.

Section 10: The Resolutions Committee composed of three members, shall draw up and present to the Association resolutions of appreciation, plan and promote the work of the Committee in an annual planning meeting; and present resolutions of appreciation to individuals, organizations, and churches when there are events worthy of commendation.

Section 11: The Historical Committee shall be composed of the Historian as chairman and six other members. It shall be the duty of the Historical Committee to collect, compile, and preserve all materials of interest to the Association and member churches. It shall make its report at the Annual Association Meeting.

Section 12: The Seminary Extension Committee, composed of three members, shall publicize study courses and programs that are available; and shall plan, provide and promote Seminary Extension studies as they may be desired.

Section 13: The Christian Life Committee, composed of six members, will give continued attention to the moral climate of the community and shall initiate necessary action to maintain and improve the climate. The committee shall commend these persons and institutions that uphold Christian virtues, and shall support the churches in the teaching of Christian personal and social righteousness.

Section 14: The Committee on Committees, composed of five members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution (Article IX, Section 1), and shall assist the Executive Board in filling vacancies on all standing committees occurring between sessions. This committee shall also name the Chairman of each committee.

Section 15: The Telephone Contact Committee shall be composed of one person from each group of churches in the Association (6). This committee members shall relay messages to pastors and key leaders during the year. All messages to be sent should be cleared with the Director of Missions.

Section 16: The Enrollment Committee shall prepare for and direct the enrollment of the messengers at all of the sessions.

Section 17: The Christian Social Ministry Committee, composed of six members, shall assist the CSM Director in the planning, promoting and coordination of the Christian Social Ministry programs. This is to be a sub-committee of the Associational Missions Committee, with the Chairperson of the CSM committee serving as a member of the Missions Committee. Its *officio* members shall be the Moderator and the Director of Missions.

Section 18: The Church Reconciliation Committee shall be composed of the present Moderator as chairman, two immediate past Moderators and two lay persons to be appointed annually by the above stated members. The chairman will report to the Executive Committee or the Executive Board the names of those lay persons appointed. This committee will be open to any person or persons of a member church seeking assistance with problems related to their church.

Section 19: The Missions Committee shall be made up of the following members: the Director of Missions will be the chairman without voting privileges, Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, Finance Committee Chairman, Chairperson of CSM Committee, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, Brotherhood Director, WMU Director, and President of the Pastor's Conference.

This Committee is to be available as a sounding board, to support the Director of Missions as a person (as well as an officer in the Association), provide feed-back concerning Associational programs and activities, conveying suggestions from the Association, and offering support in projecting programs to the Executive Committee and/or Executive Board. The Missions Committee shall seek to determine areas of need within and without the Association and formulate recommendations to the Associational Executive Committee. This responsibility includes recommending the purchase of land for future church development to the Associational Executive Committee. The Missions Committee has no authority other than to make recommendations to the Executive Committee or the Executive Board. The Committee may be called together at the discretion of the Chairman or determine its own meeting time and place.

Section 20: The Recreation and Drama Committee shall promote a program of Christian recreation and drama in the churches. The Committee shall regard recreation and drama as a means, not an end. The Recreation and Drama Committee shall use their programs as a way to teach, a means of witnessing and an avenue of expressing the abundant Christian life. The Recreation and Drama Committee shall be responsible to give assistance to any church that should request help in the area of recreation and drama. The Committee's responsibilities shall include fellowships, Senior Adults, retreats, crafts, drama workshops and other assignments of the Association, if asked. The Chairman of the Recreation and Drama Committee shall plan with the Director of Missions and give a report of the committee's activities at the Executive Board quarterly meetings.

Section 21: Members of all these committees, except those appointed by the Moderator, shall be elected to serve not more than three years on a rotating basis.

By-Law V TRUSTEES

The duty of the Trustees shall be to hold in trust any property, money, endowment, or other securities of said Association, and they shall handle all legal matters of the Association under the direction of the Association or its Executive Board.

By-Law VI DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS

Section 1: His selection shall be upon the recommendation of the Executive Committee and on vote by the Association at its Annual Meeting, or between sessions of the Association, by its Executive Board. His time of office shall continue until terminated by mutual consent or request of either party. He shall be a member of all committees and organizations of the Association in a serving and advisory capacity.

By-Law VII DIRECTOR OF CHRISTIAN SOCIAL MINISTRY

Section 1: Employment - The Director of CSM shall be jointly employed by the Association, the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina and the Home Mission Board. The employee should be elected to work until the sponsoring groups mutually agree to cease the tenure of service or the employee resigns. The CSM Director shall work under the supervision of the Director of Missions and in compliance with the Job Description provided by the State and Association.

Section 2: Basic Function - The basic functions are to work with the CSM Committee to organize, supervise and promote a program of activities to meet the spiritual, educational, emotional and physical needs of the people within the geographical boundaries of the Association.

Section 3: The CSM Director shall be an ex officio member of the Associational Executive Board, Associational Executive Committee and Missions Committee without voting privileges.

Section 4: When without a Christian Social Ministries Director, the Associational Executive Committee shall be responsible for the appointment of a Search Committee to seek a person to serve as Christian Social Ministries Director according to By-Law VII Section 1 and 2.

By-Law VIII AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the By-Laws may be made at any session of the Annual Meeting by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

By-Law IX DEFINE PROCEDURE

Section 1: The business session of the Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.

Section 2: Every report, resolution, or amendment offered to the Association shall be submitted in writing if requested by the Moderator.

Section 3: No person shall speak more than twice on the same subject except by permission of the Association.

Section 4: Messengers present from half the churches shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5: Unless the Association decides otherwise, Annual Sessions shall be held on a rotating basis with a church or churches in each of the six Associational Groups as follows: Polkville, Lattimore, Shelby, Kings Mountain, Grover, and Waco.

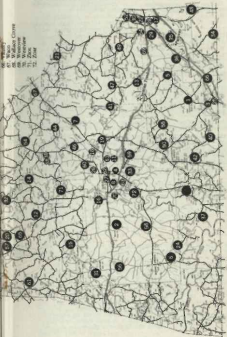

The Constitution Committee recommends the following constitutional changes:

Article VI: Officers and Their Election

Section 2: "The Moderator, Vice-Moderator and Clerk-Treasurer shall be elected on the morning of the last day of the annual meeting. All other officers shall be contacted and nominated by the Committee on Nominations and elected by the Associational Executive Board at their April meeting."

Section 3: Strike out, "the following January 1" and replace with "October 1".

Article VIII. The Executive Board.

"The Associational Executive Board shall meet in January, April, and July, on Monday after the third Sunday."

DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS - ANNUAL REPORT

The Kings Mountain Baptist Association is alive, well and growing. This is true in terms of what it has done, what is planned to be accomplished, and the challenge that lies before us.

I came to this association hoping to earn the right to be a support person to the leadership of the churches, especially pastors. A look at the daily log which I keep indicates that this is a priority item not only in word but in deed. Three hundred thirty-nine of the activities and events engaged in were directly or indirectly designed to support pastoral leadership. Thirty-seven events came under another category.

Another priority item in the Kings Mountain Baptist Association is an awareness of mission needs here in our own community. The prayer breakfast held for the personnel of the midway of the Cleveland County Fair proved to be a realistic mission need to which there was a legitimate response.

Mission education and involvement is another goal. Our CSM Director, Bob Davis, is well able to provide opportunity for any church wishing to become involved. Our prayer breakfasts prior to the Lottie Moon and Annee Armstrong emphases are designed to achieve mission education for men and boys. These have been well attended. The programs have been excellent.

Prayer selection committee training is a service that the association is best prepared to provide. The association is able to share principles and procedures that enable a committee to operate more effectively but leaving the decision-making totally in the hands of the committee.

The association for the first time in its history has all of the annual letters in before the annual session.

From the first time we began the plans for our future building we had in the building fund savings account \$23,500. Since that time we have received approximately \$40,000. We now have over \$63,000. We have just begun!

Gifts to the association increased twenty-seven percent over last year for a total of \$71,753.26.

Our suggested goal for associational giving has been three percent, and a number of churches have moved in that direction. There are always those who give more than you ask. The Piedmont Church in Kings Mountain has been giving four percent for a number of years. Bethany Church in Groves recently moved from three percent to four percent. The Macedonia Church went to five percent - three percent to the general fund and two percent to the proposed building. Weaverview Church here in Shelby is faced with a possible building program, nevertheless increased their giving to four percent. Union Baptist is in the midst of a building program and was already giving three percent and chose to increase their giving to associational missions. These are leader churches, and it is evident that the Kings Mountain Baptist Association is alive and well and growing.

The exciting events that await us also prove that we are alive and well and growing. Conferences designed for the development of family life, marriage enrichment, sabbath/vacation time to Nashville, associational GA Camps, four-day pastoral leadership seminar, one-day communications seminar, and a group of pastors coming from South Africa to lead fourteen of our churches in revival indicates something of the variety of activities in which we are engaged. It is also our prayer that we will be able to launch long range planning for the Kings Mountain Baptist Association for the next five years.

Have we done it all? No. There is a need that we have not touched. The need is to sponsor Indo-Chinese refugee families. United States has accepted a quota of one hundred sixty-eight thousand, and it is just a matter of where these people go. We are dependent upon volunteers to meet these needs. Many of you have foreign missions at heart but may never have a chance to go. Here is an opportunity to bring foreign missions to us and by doing this you may win them to Jesus Christ.

I came here six years ago believing that I was led by the Lord. Every year has affirmed that understanding. My greatest challenge is to convince you that associational missions is legitimate. My greatest conviction is that associational missions is a necessity. If we permit this link in the chain of God's Kingdom to be weak and ineffective, there will be fallout in the local churches and missions here and around the world.

I am dependent upon you. I need you to help me see that we accomplish our mission. I need you, the Lord needs you. The mission needs of this day challenge the very best that is in us. History will record our response to the challenge God has given us.

CHRISTIAN SOCIAL MINISTRIES - ANNUAL REPORT

I delight in sharing with you the good things that you have made possible in our Christian Social Ministries programs during the past twelve months. Response to needs shared with you has been tremendous. You have brought vital meaning to our ministries in reaching and reaching the heart of the people of Cleveland County.

On many occasions in our Lord's life here on earth, it is said that when he looked upon the multitudes, he was filled with compassion. This look of compassion is a goal to be sought in the life of the Christian, and it appears to me that many of you are actively striving to meet the goal. Unless we can look at the world through eyes of compassion we will not be able to be effective in our witnessing to those less fortunate than we.

Our programing expanded as we have progressed through the year. I appreciate the leadership of our Director of Missions who has given support, encouragement and now, larger facilities, that we might be able to offer greater opportunities for you to minister, and I am grateful to you for your interest, enthusiasm and willingness to accept projects that I have shared with you. You have responded and served well. As we look about us, let us pray that God will continue to call us to look into the fields for they are white unto harvest.

Our churches that have a Christian Social Ministries Representative now number twenty-five. It has been a joy to work with these and I appreciate the faithfulness with which they have served. If your CSM Representative has changed, please let me know. Let me encourage those of you who do not have a representative to enlist one as soon as possible. If you do, you can provide a meaningful opportunity for at least one of your people to become involved in local missions, and this person in turn will open the door to the many areas of ministry on the associational level.

In our Youth and Family Services Ministries, we have several on-going programs. In February, we began our Minister's Day in Juvenile Court program. The goal of this endeavor is to provide spiritual guidance to the court personnel and to the youth and family of juveniles. We have six ministers who are participating in this ministry. Our camping program has ministered to 66 youth with camps in November, March and July. Sixteen of our churches assisted in this camp program with food and supplies. Seven church groups provided socials for the youth of Juvenile Court. This involved 103 youth and their Juvenile Court Counselors in activities of fun and fellowship with Christian youth from local churches. Ten church groups or individuals sponsored the ten youth from Cleveland County who have been in training schools throughout the state. Sponsorship involves letters and small gift contact - a way of letting them know that someone cares. In October, macramé classes began for youth of Juvenile Court. Attendance has averaged 15 or 20. This class will continue for eight weeks.

In our Prison Ministry, we experienced a very good year with our Gardner-Webb students. Our first meeting in September of 1978 was attended by about 15 inmates. By the end of the year there were approximately fifty in attendance. At our first meeting this year, there were forty inmates. Two of our ladies' groups baked home-made goodies last year and one Actress group has provided them this year. Five other groups have signed up so far to provide items for later dates in the year. The fact that someone cared enough to do this seems to mean a great deal to the inmates. One of the most meaningful projects that we did last year was the gift packets at Christmas. In order to share the expressions of appreciation from some of the inmates, I share the following excerpts from some letters that I received: "There's not many people that takes Christmas as it's really meant to be. The gift and the hand-made Christmas card really moved me." "I have seen nothing no stranger than a stranger, lovely as the feeling of being lonely we often find ourselves being alone with only sounds and objects of no real meaning - I could see meaning on the gift packets." "I want you to know that I appreciated the things that you gave to the camp for Christmas. All was and is needed, and you know! The touching part about the whole thing was that all the things in the bags were hand-picked seemingly for each individual like your mother would pick it or something. It really brightened my Christmas." Twenty churches assisted with this project and response was so great that we were able to provide each inmate with two gift packets. We will do this again this year. Letters are to go out next week concerning this year's project.

In our Migrant Ministry, we received Health Care Kits from 25 church groups. These were distributed to four camps. Those that are left will be placed in food orders and for use next year. One church made School Kits to be distributed to migrant school children. And one church had a Backyard Bible Club in one of the migrant camps. In order to expand this ministry, we have forced the Migrant Ministries Council to study the local needs of the migrant worker and to develop programs to meet these needs.

Because of your concern for the literacy needs of Cleveland County, we have trained 41 adults to work with the adult non-reader and the school age child in one-on-one tutoring programs. Many of these are currently involved with a pupil and finding great satisfaction in this kind of ministry. "How shall they read of God's love if we don't teach them?" Westview, David and Union Baptist Churches have hosted our three workshops and I appreciate their service to this ministry. The Cleveland County Literacy Council was formed this year to study the literacy needs of our county and develop programs to meet these needs.

Our Emergency and Relief Ministry has expanded in the recent weeks since we have been in our new interim facility. This year we assisted eleven families with food, eight families with clothing, three families with furniture, eleven families with utilities, ten families with rent, seven families with medical needs, and three families with transportation. This makes a total of 55 families with total involvement of 192 people. "...For I was hungry and you gave food; thirsty and you gave water; naked and you gave clothing - Harting and you cared." Donations are now being accepted for the food closet, clothes closet and furniture closet. Let us know if you can help.

I look forward with great anticipation to the 1979-80 associational year. Associational Mission is a very vital instrument in fulfilling the Great Commission. Go ye and Do.

EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT 1978 - 1979

Four regular quarterly meetings of the Executive Board were held during the past church year. Our meetings were held on Monday evenings after the third Sunday, the months of October, January, April and July. Each of our meetings was well attended by members from our churches. Our church host for the meetings were: October - Pleasant Hill; January - Mull's Memorial; April - Macedonia; July - First Hill.

Various reports of committees were received, in addition to routine matters, major items of information and recommendations were approved by the Executive Board. Some of the items were:

1. Unanimously approved suggested plans for our proposed office building. The plans had been previously approved by our General Building Committee.
2. Approved plans to pair with the Western Baptist Association in Cumberland, Maryland, for Bold Missions.
3. Suggested and approved plans of gifts to the Association Building Fund, with our churches using as a goal \$5.00 per church member per year.
4. The General Building Committee and the Executive Committee were authorized to submit plans for our building to contractors for bids, at such time our funds are available in an amount of \$75,000.00 or \$150,000.00 in pledges. The General Building Committee and the Executive Committee were authorized to accept bids for an amount not in excess of \$250,000.00.
5. Approved a recommended Financial Budget for the Associational Year beginning October, 1979. The amount of our new Budget is \$118,399.60.

SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT FOR 1978 - 1979

In Southern Baptist church life, the Sunday School is the organization responsible for both Bible teaching and outreach (evangelism).

The importance of the Sunday School as the outreach organization is shown by the fact that over 90% of the people joining Southern Baptist churches were already members of the Sunday School when they joined the church. We baptize 242 people from within the Sunday School for every one we reach outside the Sunday School organization.

Statistics that can be used to evaluate the Sunday School are enrollment, average attendance, and yearly total of baptisms for the church. Enrollment shows the **strength** of the Sunday School; average attendance shows the **health** of the Sunday School; and while other factors also influence the number of baptisms, this figure reflects the **effectiveness** of the Sunday School as the outreach organization. At the end of the 1978-79 organizational year, the total ongoing enrollment of Sunday Schools in the Kings Mountain Baptist Association was 17,300. Average attendance for the year was 9,155. Baptisms for the year totaled 481. For perspective, lets compare these figures with 1976, the high point for Sunday School work in our association: Since 1976, enrollment has declined 9%, average attendance has declined 17%, and baptisms have declined 39%.

This trend is not true of all our churches. Twenty-two of our seventy-two churches have had an increase in enrollment since 1976. Those that have had an increase of 25% or more over these three years are: Community, David, First Hill, Midview, New Buffalo, and Victory.

Last year the churches in our association were challenged to have a 4% increase in enrollment. Churches that have met or passed this goal of a 4% increase since last year are: Bethany, Calvary, Caesar, Churchill Drive, David,

David, Emanuel (Marys Grove), Fallston, Flat Hill, Immanuel (Shelby), New Prospect, Northside, Patterson Grove, Peach Street, Plains View, Polkville, Sandy Plains, and Westview.

Eleven of our churches have had an increase in average attendance since 1978. These are: Buffalo, Community, David, Eastside (Shelby), Fallston, Flat Hill, Grover First, Midview, Plains View, Polkville, and Zoar.

Churches that have had an increase in attendance since last year are: Buffalo, Calvary, Carpenter's Grove, Casar, David, Double Shoals, Double Springs, Eastside (Shelby), Elliot Memorial, Fallston, Flat Hill, Grover First, Immanuel (Shelby), Macedonia, New Bethel, Northside, Patterson Grove, Patterson Springs, Plains View, Poplar Springs, Sandy Plains, Shelby First, Shelby Second, Union, and Westview.

New Churches and Sunday Schools organized since 1978 particularly help the associational growth picture as experience indicates that these new units grow rapidly.

The major associational Sunday School activity during this past year was the Teachers and Officers Training Clinic at Elizabeth Church. One hundred fifty-five people came to study with top resource people from around our state.

High Attendance Day is another major effort of our associational Sunday School.

Our association is working with the state Sunday School department to develop our Associational Sunday School Improvement Support Team (Assist). These are trained workers who can help an individual church with its internal teachers and officers training and improvement program. Persons nominated for this team in the coming year are:

Again, the associational Sunday School challenges the churches to a 4% increase in enrollment this year. This is working for our Lord. There is no easy route - the key words are **"working for our Lord"**. Working in lesson preparation. Working in teaching the Bible. Working in visiting the lost and praying. Working for our Lord.

ASSOCIATIONAL CHURCH TRAINING REPORT

Church Training is an integral part of the Bold Mission Thrust of the Association. It is called upon to train the present and future teachers and leaders of our churches. The Church Training Program is not in competition with other programs that are carried on in a church but enhance them.

The Church Training program deals with four areas of study. They are Christian Doctrine, Christian Ethics, Christian History and Church Policy and Organization. However, many other training areas are taught, depending on the individual church. Often, the four basic areas of study are neglected. If any of the areas are neglected the church suffers. It suffers by not having trained teachers and leaders.

There are fifty churches in our association that reported an on going Church Training programs last year. It is the aim of the Associational Church Training Council to assist all churches of the Association in training their people to be well informed trained teachers and leaders.

During our Associational Key Leadership Conference in August, there were fifteen churches represented. At this time we reviewed the new Equipping Center Materials and other materials that are now available to us for use. This material is available and can be checked out at the Baptist Center. I am thankful for the renewed interest in the Church Training Program.

During my participation in the state-wide Key Leadership Conference at Ridgmont in May, I was asked to set three goals for the Association Church Training Program. I proposed the following goals:

1. Start five (5) Church Training units. Each unit being a new program in a church that does not have an on-going program.
2. Have quarterly meeting's of the Associational Church Training Council. This Council is made up of the Associational Director and age-group leaders.
3. Have Bible Drill and Speakers' Tournament. Tournaments for children and youth who would compete on local, regional, and state-wide levels.

I ask each church to set goals for your Church Training program this year. Ask him and the Lord will bless you for it. With your help this will be the best Church Training year ever.

WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION REPORT

The WMU emphasis for 1978-79, **Teach Missions to Live, to Give**, completed the three-year emphasis on Teach Missions. As the missions organization of the church, WMU has participated in studies and activities related to the denominational emphasis: **Bold Mission Throat**.

The first associational WMU activity for the year was the Leadership Conference held at Poplar Springs Baptist Church on September 23-26, 1978. The Conference held sessions for two nights for the first time, and offered a study of WMU age-level manuals for officers and leaders.

Baptist Women's Day of Prayer was observed on November 6th at First Baptist Church, Shelby. A number of churches of our association participated in this observance.

During the year the age-level organizations have engaged in various activities. The GAs held an overnight "Mission Lock-In" in November. In February they had a talent show, and in August, a day camp. The Actresses held an overnight retreat at Camp Lay White with sixty Actresses attending. In March the Baptist Women hosted a Sunday afternoon for international students at Carden-Webb College.

The Annual Spring Meeting was held at Boling Springs Baptist Church on April 15th. One feature of the program was testimonies given by WMU members concerning their involvement in Mission Action. Mrs. Gene Phillips, missionary to Rhodesia, was the speaker.

During the year the WMU Council has met regularly to plan. Council members attended conferences and workshops at Ridgecrest. Several Council members have assisted churches in organizing new WMU work. "WMU News" has been sent quarterly to pastors and WMU leaders to provide information about plans and events.

The year 1979-80 calls for courage and dedication as WMU members are challenged by the emphasis "Life-Changing Commitments".

MEMORIALS KINGS MOUNTAIN BAPTIST ASSOCIATION September 24, 1979

Franklin Segler, in his little book, *A Faithful Stars*, says, "An essay, thought to be among the last expressions that came from the pen of H.B. Dana, was entitled, 'Lights and Shadows on the Canvas of Life'". One of his daughters was an amateur artist. Looking at one of her unfinished pictures, he remarked to her that it was not as good as she usually painted. She answered, "That picture is not yet completed. I haven't put the shadows in it yet. No picture is complete without both lights and shadows."

Dana saw in this a marvelous parable of life. It takes both lights and shadows to make life's pictures complete. We may think of life as a vast canvas on which an unseen hand is painting. Dana said that some would call that hand fate; he insisted on calling it Providence. "It is the very hand of God. For the portrait He is painting there to be best, the various colors must be properly blended. The picture must carry upon it both lights and shadows. Upon the canvas of every life there are both lights and shadows, and the shadows are just as necessary as the brighter hues." He contemplated some of the shadows that come into the lives of all of us: suffering, sorrow, death, disappointment, and failure. We cannot avoid them. They come inevitably, sometimes creeping stealthily upon the canvas; sometimes splashing the dark color onto the picture by one sudden unearned stroke.

All of us are painfully aware as we meet today that shadows have fallen upon the canvas of life since we last met, sometimes "creeping stealthily, sometimes with one sudden unearned stroke." We mourn the passing of many whom we have loved and lost for a while. One of our pastors have died, 12 of our deacons have died, and 236 of our faithful members have died. We pause for a moment of silent prayer and commemoration of their homing.

But Dana also reminded us of the brighter hues that help to make the canvas the beauty that it is. He added, "The lights are always there," and he names them, love, service, ambition, and hope. Whatever the position or station of life these four lights will always be casting their gentle glow.

So, we may go from this place saddened that those loved ones are no longer with us in the body, but knowing that they are one with us in spirit. And we go, not mourning as those who have no hope, but in the blessed assurance that we shall be reunited in God's own good time.

And thus the canvas of life will be completed with just the right blending of shadows and lights so that those viewing it shall see not only the lovely work of art, but shall sense the unseen hand of the Master Painter.

Bryant Kirkland has expressed our thoughts so well:
"We have dreamed dreams beyond our comprehending,
Visions too beautiful to be untrue;
We have seen mysteries that yield no clue,
And sought our goals on ways that have no ending.
We, creatures of the earth,
We have seen loveliness that shall not pass;
We have beheld immortal destinies.
Ah, we whose flesh shall perish as the grass
Have found the passion of the heart that dies
Into the hope of everlasting life."

Prayer:

"Father of love and light, our lives have been blessed by those whom we've loved and lost for a while. Let their shades fall upon us that we may go from this place to be a blessing to this world so much in need of love and caring.
In the name of Him who died to show us your love."
