# BRIEF HISTORY OF Patterson Grove Baptist Church Kings Mountain, North Carolina

On November 15, 1884, a Presbytery was formed with the Rev. G.M. Webb as chairman. There were 72 letters presented. "On motion," reads the minutes, "the church was constituted on the principles of the Holy Bible with name Patterson Grove."

The next day, Sunday, November 16, 1884, a Sunday School meeting was conducted and at 11 o'clock Rev. Webb preached the sermon of dedication from 2 Chron. 2:18, "And he (Solomon)...set the people a work."

On January 3, 1885, Rev. P.E. Flann became the first pastor and preached that day his first sermon from Psalm 114:12: "What shall I render unto the Lord for all his benefits toward me?"

During 1885 Rufus and Sarah Patterson and G.J. and Eli R. Patterson deeded to the church over four acres of land. Then, on September 24, 1885, the church was received as a member of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association.



By 1900 there were 148 members. Total receipts for the year was \$83.00 and the value of the church property was \$600. Today, total membership is 121 with total receipts during this past year of over \$91,000.00 of which \$35,174.17 went for world missions causes.

In 1922, the original building was remodeled. On November 1, 1954, the church voted to go fulltime (preaching every Sunday). On August 28, 1955, ground was broken to erect a new educational building and on March 27, 1966, ground was broken for a new sanctuary. The replacement value of all church property today is over \$850,000.00.

Patterson Grove has had 22 pastors since 1885. The present pastor, Rev. Richard Flyler, has served since March 24, 1963.

Patterson Grove also supports Rev. and Mrs. Ronald B. Wilson, missionaries to the Dominican Republic.

## **CONSTITUTION**

### **PREAMBLE**

We, the members of Missionary Baptist Churches in the County of Cleveland, State of North Carolina, and territory adjacent thereto, do hereby propose to establish and maintain the principles and rules of order of a district Association in conformity to the following plan:

### **ARTICLE I NAME**

The name of this body shall be the Kings Mountain Baptist Association.

### **ARTICLE II PURPOSE**

It shall be the purpose of the Association to cooperate with the State and Southern Baptist Convention in the promotion of Christian Missions at home and abroad and in any other related objects such as Evangelism, Christian Education, Benevolent Enterprises, and Social Services, which it may deem proper and desirable for the furtherance of the Kingdom of God.

### **ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP**

Section 1: The Association shall be composed of cooperating Baptist churches in the area of the Association.

Section 2: Churches desiring membership in the Association shall apply to the Membership Committee. Application should include:

1. Formal action by the group seeking admission reflecting that 75% of those voting expresses their intent to cooperate.
2. A written statement reflecting their beliefs and practices.
3. A written statement that expresses their intent to cooperate.
4. A willingness to meet with Membership Committee to discuss other items of mutual interest to both parties.

The Membership Committee should be sensitive to groups seeking its services and be willing to present a statement of Baptist belief and practice and what it means to cooperate with the churches in the Association in a world-wide mission program. If recommended by this committee and accepted by the Association, a mission or a church shall agree to come under the watchcare of the Association for a minimum of one year. Membership within the Association shall be determined by vote of the Association at its annual meeting. Churches under the watchcare shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of the Association except their members shall not hold office nor vote.

Section 3: The Association shall be the sole judge of its membership and may receive churches, or reject churches, according to its constitution and by-laws. Member churches may also withdraw as they desire, and if requested, the Associational Executive Board may grant letters of recommendation to other like associations.

### **ARTICLE IV MEETINGS**

Section 1: The Association shall meet annually on Tuesday and Wednesday after the third Sunday in October and continue until the business of the Association is disposed of.

Section 2: Special meetings may be called by the Moderator or Executive Board, provided two weeks notice is given to the member churches.

Section 3: Each church shall elect annually, in addition to the pastor, two messengers to the meetings of the Association for each fifty members of the church, provided each church shall not have less than three nor more than ten messengers. These shall constitute the voting body of the Association. The names of messengers printed in the minutes shall include only those in attendance and registering at the Associational Meeting.

## ARTICLE V AUTHORITY

Each church in this Association is independent and sovereign in its own affairs, and the Association has no authority over the churches except as provided in this Constitution in Article III, Section 2 and 3.

## ARTICLE VI OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTIONS

Section 1: The officers of the Association shall be Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, Auditor, Historian, Music Director, Organist, Sunday School Director, Chairman of the Library Council, Baptist Youth for Christ Director, and Parliamentarian.

Section 2: The Moderator, Vice-Moderator and Clerk-Treasurer shall be elected on the morning of the last day of the annual meeting. All other officers shall be contacted and nominated by the Committee on Nominations and elected by the Associational Executive Board at their April meeting.

Section 3: The newly elected Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer shall assume at the close of the annual session all duties incumbent upon them relating to the work of the ensuing associational year. All other officers shall assume all duties incumbent upon them relating to the work of the ensuing year on October 1.

Section 4: Any person having served two terms as Moderator shall be ineligible for re-election for two years.

## ARTICLE VII TRUSTEES AND THEIR ELECTION

There shall be three Trustees of the Association, one preferably a lawyer, serving terms of three years each on a rotating basis. On nomination by the Committee on Nominations, one new trustee shall be elected at the Annual Meeting, no trustee being eligible to succeed himself until after the lapse of one year. The expiration date of each trustee's term of office shall appear by his name in the Associational Minutes.

## ARTICLE VIII THE ASSOCIATIONAL EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Associational Executive Board shall be composed of all Associational officers (Article VI, Section 1), the Associational Director of Missions, the Christian Social Ministries Director, (ex-officio without voting privileges), each active pastor, two members chosen by each member church from its membership and certified to the Association in its annual report, and chairmen of all standing committees of the Association. The Associational Executive Board shall have the authority to act for the Association between sessions, except as limited by the Constitution. Associational Executive Board members are the connecting link between the Association and the churches. Executive Board members should represent the churches to the Association. Executive Board members should act as representatives for the Association to the churches. It is the responsibility of the Executive Board members to promote the programs, represent the needs and report to the churches concerning the work and ministry of the Association. Executive Board members should seek acceptable means of representing the Association to their respective fellowships. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to meet quarterly and to make reports and recommendations to the Association in its Annual Meeting.

The quarterly meetings will be in January, April and July, on Monday after the third Sunday.

## ARTICLE IX COMMITTEES

Section 1: The Association shall have the following standing committees, with their terms of office being from the close of the annual meeting through the following annual meeting.

A. To be nominated by the Committee on Committees and elected by the Association at the Annual Meeting:

1. Order of Business and Program Committee (By-Law IV, Section 3)
2. Executive Committee (By-Law IV, Section 5)
3. Evangelism Committee (By-Law IV, Section 5)
4. Finance Committee (By-Law IV, Section 4)
5. Ordination Committee (By-Law IV, Section 5)
6. Nominating Committee (By-Law IV, Section 6)
7. Constitution Committee (By-Law IV, Section 7)
8. Membership Committee (By-Law IV, Section 8)
9. Calendar Committee (By-Law IV, Section 9)
10. Resolutions Committee (By-Law IV, Section 10)
11. Historical Committee (By-Law IV, Section 11)
12. Seminary Extension Committee (By-Law IV, Section 12)
13. Christian Life Committee (By-Law IV, Section 13)
14. Christian Social Ministry Committee (By-Law IV, Section 17)
15. Church Reconciliation Committee (By-Law IV, Section 18)
16. Mission Committee (By-Law IV, Section 19)
17. Recreation and Drama Committee (By-Law IV, Section 20)
18. Any other committee authorized by the Association.

B. To be appointed by the Moderator at the annual meeting: Committee on Committees. (By-Law IV, Section 14)

Section 2: The following committee shall be appointed by the Moderator at least thirty days prior to the Annual Meeting to serve during the Annual Meeting: Enrollment Committee (By-Law IV, Section 16).

## **ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS**

Amendments to this Constitution may be made at any Annual Session of the Association upon an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the voting members present. Proposed changes must be presented to the Association on the first day and voted upon by a standing vote of the Association on the last day. It is recommended that all proposed changes first be submitted to the Constitution Committee.

## **BY-LAWS**

### **By-Law I PARLIAMENTARY RULES**

Robert's Rules of Order shall be followed as the Association's rules for conducting its deliberative assemblies, except as the Association prescribes otherwise.

### **By-Law II ASSOCIATION YEAR**

The Associational Year shall begin October 1 and close September 30.

### **By-Law III DUTIES OF OFFICERS**

Section 1: The Moderator shall preside over the meeting of the body according to the Constitution and By-Laws, appoint Committee on Committees and Committee on Enrollment. He shall be the Chairman of the Associational Executive Board and be an ex officio (without voting privileges) member of all other committees. Upon completion of his term of office, the Moderator shall become a member-at-large (for two years) of the Missions Committee, Executive, and the Executive Board.

Section 2: The Vice-Moderator shall preside in the absence, or at the pleasure, of the Moderator, and shall be the Vice-Chairman of the Executive Board.

Section 3: The Clerk-Treasurer shall send annual report forms to the member churches at least a month before the Association's Annual Meeting, distribute at the Annual Meeting copies of the digest of these reports, make an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, supervise the printing and distributing of Minutes to the member churches, keep on file copies of Minutes, records, and other documents of the Association, and shall also serve as Secretary of the Executive Board. He shall inform all members elected to office or appointed to serve on committees of such action. He shall receive and bank all funds of the Association in the name of the Association; disburse the same upon instructions from the Association, its Executive Board, or as designated in the budget (no money is to be disbursed which is not included in the budget except upon recommendation of the Finance Committee to the Executive Board or the Association in annual session); render an accurate report of receipts and disbursements and distribute same at the Annual Meeting and give a report at each quarterly Executive Board meeting and keep books available and up-to-date for examination.

Section 4: The Auditor shall, at the close of the Associational Year, make an audit of the Treasurer's records and report to the Association in session.

Section 5: The Historian shall collect and preserve historical data on the Association and its churches, and make a written report to each Annual Meeting of the Association.

Section 6: The Sunday School Director shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Sunday School Department. This officer shall attend the Executive Committee meetings and offer creative plans to this committee that would promote this work.

The Associational Sunday School should assist church leaders to be more effective in their responsibility. This should include:

1. Provide opportunities for fellowship and inspiration.
2. Interpret the Sunday School Program.
3. Train Sunday School leaders.
4. Consult with Sunday School leaders concerning their program.
5. Provide organization and leadership for cooperative work among the churches.

Section 7: The Church Training Department shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Church Training Department. This officer shall attend Executive Committee meetings, maintain the on-going work of this department at all times, and give an annual report to the Association.

Section 8: The Music Director shall provide leadership for the Association in session and when requested at other times during the year. This officer shall attend the Executive Committee meetings and offer creative plans to this Committee that would promote the work. He shall encourage music growth in the churches throughout the year and shall make a written report to the Annual Meeting.

Section 9: The Brotherhood Director shall cooperate with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of men and boys in the churches. The officer shall attend the Executive Committee meetings and offer creative plans to promote the development of men and boys and an awareness of world mission needs.

Section 10: The Woman's Missionary Union Director serves on the Executive Committee of the Association and works with the Director of Missions; leads the WMU Council; confers with our associational WMU officers and assists them in their work; leads in providing opportunities for leaders and members of their church WMUs to have fellowship and receive inspiration concerning their mutual mission task; leads in interpreting the WMU program to church leaders; leads in training church WMU workers and members;

consults with church leaders concerning initiation of WMU work and the improvement of existing work; presides at and plans for associational meeting; leads in associational WMU annual planning; leads in discovering mission action needs and in coordinating the work being done; and reports progress of WMU work to the Association and serves as contact between the Association and state WMU.

**Section 11:** The Chairman of the Library Council shall promote the beginning and maintenance of church libraries in the churches; provide training opportunities for church librarians; maintain and develop the associational library; attend the Executive Committee meetings; cooperate with the Director of Missions and make an annual report to the Association at its annual session.

**Section 12:** The Baptist Youth for Christ Director shall, under the supervision of the Director of Missions, guide and promote the youth activities of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association. Such activities may include:

1. Youth Council sessions.
2. Bi-monthly sessions of Youth for Christ in local churches.
3. A Kairos Crusade for Christ every 3 to 5 years.
4. Mission Vacation Bible School and/or Backyard VBS.
5. Sponsorship of a booth at Cleveland County Fair each October.
6. Any other activity which the Baptist Youth for Christ Director, Youth Council, Director of Missions, and Executive Committee deems necessary to foster a positive Christian witness for Christ.

**Section 13:** The Parliamentarian shall, at the Annual Meeting of the Association, rule on all questions of parliamentary procedure which shall arise during the sessions. The Parliamentarian shall serve as a resource person to the churches and shall, upon request, advise and assist the churches on matters of parliamentary procedure.

**Section 14:** Vacancies occurring between Annual Sessions shall be filled by the Executive Board, except the office of Moderator, in which case the Vice-Moderator shall automatically become Moderator.

#### **By-Law IV DUTIES OF COMMITTEES**

**Section 1: The Order of Business and Program Committee** shall be composed of three members and the Moderator, Clerk and the Associational Music Director. It shall rotate the place of meeting among the groups of churches with the host church being determined by the group. It shall recommend the preacher and the alternate for the annual sermon. It shall prepare a printed program for the Annual Meeting for the Association, which shall be sent to all persons on the program and to all pastors at least thirty days before the Annual Meeting. It shall, on the opening day of the Annual Meeting of the Association, present the printed program for adoption and serve through the session when adjustments in the order of business become necessary. This committee will be responsible for promoting the Annual Meeting through the various news media.

#### **Section 2: The Executive Committee**

1. Shall be composed of the Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk/Treasurer, Music Director, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, Brotherhood Director, WMU Director, Baptist Youth for Christ Director, Chairpersons of the Christian Social Ministries Committee; President of the Pastors' Conference; Chairman of the Nominating Committee, Chairman of Committee on Committees, Chairman of Christian Life Committee, Chairman of Membership Committee, Chairman of Finance Committee, and Chairman of Evangelism.

2. When without a Director of Missions, this committee shall seek out and recommend to the Association, or its Executive Board, for election of a new Director of Missions according to By-Law VI, Section 11.

3. It shall administer all matters referred to it by the Association or Executive Board and act on routine or emergency matters concerning business management, approve employment of all office personnel, deal with problems relating to personnel, and maintain adequate equipment for the office. It shall meet regularly, not less than quarterly, but a quorum of seven is necessary to transact business.

**Section 3: The Evangelism Committee**, composed of six members, shall promote the work of evangelism in the churches and the Association in cooperation with the State Department of Evangelism. All plans and programs to be subject to the approval of the Association or its Executive Board.

**Section 4: The Finance Committee**, composed of six members, two rotating annually, with the Treasurer, shall study the Association's financial needs of an adequate program, present a budget to the Association for the following year, devise plans for securing the cooperation of the churches in raising funds to meet the budget, and make a written report to the Annual Meeting.

The Committee shall be prepared to assist any church within the Association, upon request, with the stewardship programs offered by the Convention.

The Committee shall express gratitude to the churches for their stewardship development that enables them to participate in local, home, and foreign missions.

**Section 5: The Ordination Committee**, composed of five members, with the pastor of the home church (the church of which the candidate is a member), the Director of Missions, and deacons of the home and requesting churches, shall, when requested by a member church, assist with the examination and ordination of a candidate for the Gospel Ministry.

The Committee requires that it receive a copy of that portion of the Minutes, signed by the clerk, of the church conference at which the home voted to request examination of the candidate.

The Committee requires that the candidate be called by a church for ministry before requesting examination.

The Chairman shall notify the candidate of the time, place, and procedure.

The Committee suggests that the candidate be questioned at least two weeks prior to his ordination.

The Committee shall question the candidate about his conversion, his call, his priorities, his doctrine, and his personal life. The Committee may also counsel the candidate.

The candidate should feel free to seek advice from the Committee regarding any area of the ministry.

In every instance, the Committee shall be guided by the Scripture, especially I Timothy 3:1-7 and Titus 1:5-9.

The Committee shall give written notice to the home church as to whether or not it recommends that the church proceed with the ordination.

The Chairman shall report the Committee's activities to the Executive Board quarterly and provide a written report for the Annual Meeting.

**Section 6: The Nominating Committee**, composed of six members, shall contact before and nominate at the April Executive Board meeting, the officers of the Association according to Article VI and VIII of the Constitution. This Committee shall also, in cooperation with the Nominating Committee of various departments (except the WMU and Brotherhood organizations), recommend workers for these various departments. The officers and workers of these respective organizations shall be nominated by the organization themselves and submitted to the Nominating Committee (Article VI, Section 1). It

shall also nominate associational representatives for the various institutions and agencies of our convention and members of the General Board of our Baptist State Convention. This Committee shall also assist the Executive Board in filling vacancies which occur between annual meetings of the Association. This Committee's nominations shall not preclude other nominations from the floor.

**Section 7: The Constitution Committee**, composed of three members, shall be available to study changes or revisions in the Constitution, and to make recommendations as needed.

**Section 8: The Membership Committee**, composed of five members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution and By-Laws. The Membership Committee should be sensitive to groups seeking its services and be willing to present a statement of Baptist faith and practice and what it means to cooperate with other churches in the Association in a world-wide mission program. The Membership Committee shall annually review all churches and missions under the watchcare of the Association and may present them for membership within the Association or that they continue under the watchcare.

**Section 9: The Calendar Committee** shall be composed of the following Associational officers: Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, WMU Director, Brotherhood Director, Music Director and Vice-Moderator as chairman. This committee shall work out as soon as possible each year an Associational Calendar for the coming year and present same to the Executive Board for adoption.

**Section 10: The Resolutions Committee** composed of three members, shall draw up and present to the Association resolutions of appreciation, plan and promote the work of the Committee in an annual planning meeting; and present resolutions of appreciation to individuals, organizations, and churches when there are events worthy of commendation.

**Section 11: The Historical Committee** shall be composed of the Historian as chairman and six other members. It shall be the duty of the Historical Committee to collect, compile, and preserve all materials of interest to the Association and member churches. It shall make its report at the Annual Association Meeting.

**Section 12: The Seminary Extension Committee**, composed of three members, shall publicize study courses and programs that are available; and shall plan, provide and promote Seminary Extension studies as they may be desired.

**Section 13: The Christian Life Committee**, composed of six members, will give continual attention to the moral climate of the community and shall initiate necessary action to maintain and improve the climate. The committee shall commend those persons and institutions that uphold Christian virtues, and shall support the churches in the teaching of Christian personal and social righteousness.

**Section 14: The Committee on Committees**, composed of five members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution (Article IX, Section 1), and shall assist the Executive Board in filling vacancies on all standing committees occurring between sessions. This committee shall also name the Chairman of each committee.

**Section 15: The Telephone Contact Committee** shall be composed of one person from each group of churches in the Association (6). This committee members shall relay messages to pastors and lay leaders during the year. All messages to be sent should be cleared with the Director of Missions.

**Section 16: The Enrollment Committee** shall prepare for and direct the enrollment of the newcomers at all of the sessions.



**Section 17: The Christian Social Ministry Committee**, composed of six members, shall assist the CSM Director in the planning, promoting and coordination of the Christian Social Ministry programs. This is to be a sub-committee of the Associational Missions Committee, with the Chairperson of the CSM committee serving as a member of the Missions Committee. Its office members shall be the Moderator and the Director of Missions.

**Section 18: The Church Reconciliation Committee** shall be composed of the present Moderator as chairman, two immediate past Moderators and two lay persons to be appointed annually by the above stated members. The chairman will report to the Executive Committee or the Executive Board the names of those lay persons appointed. This committee will be open to any person or persons of a member church seeking assistance with problems related to their church.

**Section 19: The Missions Committee** shall be made up of the following members: the Director of Missions will be the chairman without voting privileges, Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, Finance Committee Chairman, Chairperson of CSM Committee, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, Brotherhood Director, WMU Director, and President of the Pastor's Conference.

This Committee is to be available as a sounding board, to support the Director of Missions as a person (as well as an officer in the Association), provide feed-back concerning Associational programs and activities, conveying suggestions from the Association, and offering support in projecting programs to the Executive Committee and/or Executive Board. The Missions Committee shall seek to determine areas of need within and without the Association and formulate recommendations to the Associational Executive Committee. This responsibility includes recommending the purchase of land for future church development to the Associational Executive Committee. The Missions Committee has no authority other than to make recommendations to the Executive Committee or the Executive Board. The Committee may be called together at the discretion of the Chairman or determine its own meeting time and place.

**Section 20: The Recreation and Drama Committee** shall promote a program of Christian recreation and drama in the churches. The Committee shall regard recreation and drama as a means, not an end. The Recreation and Drama Committee shall use their programs as a way to teach, a means of witnessing and an avenue of expressing the abundant Christian life. The Recreation and Drama Committee shall be responsible to give assistance to any church that should request help in the area of recreation and drama. The Committee's responsibilities shall include fellowships, Senior Adults, retreats, crafts, drama workshops and other assignments of the Association, if asked. The Chairman of the Recreation and Drama Committee shall plan with the Director of Missions and give a report of the committee's activities at the Executive Board quarterly meetings.

**Section 21: Members of all these committees**, except those appointed by the Moderator, shall be elected to serve not more than three years on a rotating basis.

### **By-Law V TRUSTEES**

The duty of the Trustees shall be to hold in trust any property, money, endowment, or other securities of said Association, and they shall handle all legal matters of the Association under the direction of the Association or its Executive Board.

#### **By-Law VI DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS**

Section 1: His selection shall be upon the recommendation of the Executive Committee and on vote by the Association at its Annual Meeting, or between sessions of the Association, by its Executive Board. His time of office shall continue until terminated by mutual consent or request of either party. He shall be a member of all committees and organizations of the Association in a serving and advisory capacity.

#### **By-Law VII DIRECTOR OF CHRISTIAN SOCIAL MINISTRY**

Section 1: Employment - The Director of CSM shall be jointly employed by the Association, the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina and the Home Mission Board. The employee should be elected to work until the sponsoring groups mutually agree to cease the tenure of service or the employee resigns. The CSM Director shall work under the supervision of the Director of Missions and in compliance with the Job Description provided by the State and Association.

Section 2: Basic Function - The basic functions are to work with the CSM Committee to organize, supervise and promote a program of activities to meet the spiritual, educational, emotional and physical needs of the people within the geographical boundaries of the Association.

Section 3: The CSM Director shall be an ex officio member of the Associational Executive Board, Associational Executive Committee and Mission Committee without voting privileges.

Section 4: When without a Christian Social Ministries Director, the Associational Executive Committee shall be responsible for the appointment of a Search Committee to seek a person to serve as Christian Social Ministries Director according to By-Law VII Section 1 and 2.

#### **By-Law VIII AMENDMENTS**

Amendments to the By-Laws may be made at any session of the Annual Meeting by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

#### **By-Law IX DEFINE PROCEDURE**

Section 1: The business session of the Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.

Section 2: Every report, resolution, or amendment offered to the Association shall be submitted in writing if requested by the Moderator.

Section 3: No person shall speak more than twice on the same subject except by permission of the Association.

Section 4: Messengers present from half the churches shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5: Unless the Association decides otherwise, Annual Sessions shall be held on a rotating basis with a church or churches in each of the six Associational Groups as follows: Polkville, Lantimore, Shelby, Kings Mountain, Crowder, and Waco.

8. Dr. Wynn Washburn gave the Historian's report, mentioning that several churches are celebrating "birthdays," some of which are at least 50-100 years old. He also recommended that each church write their history so that it might be shared with future generations.

9. Moderator Dan Jolly asked that enrollment cards be completed by those who have not already done so, and they were collected.

10. Christian Social Ministries Director Bob Davis, gave his report which included a list of several new ministries that we are starting within our association in the near future. He also urged each church to elect CSM Representatives and reminded us of our CSM theme "To Touch the Heart." Mr. Davis' report is found elsewhere in this volume.

11. Reverend Don Ledbetter moved that Mr. Carlos Young give the report on our Cooperative Program at this time, since we were running ahead of schedule. After the second, and approving of the motion, Mr. Young gave the report, mentioning that you don't give **TO** the Cooperative Program, but **THROUGH** it.

12. Dan Jolly, Moderator, recognized Reverend Marion Adams, pastor of Life Memorial Baptist Church and our Vice-Moderator, to moderate the rest of the afternoon.

13. Bob Dills led the congregation in singing "There is a Name I Love to Hear," accompanied by Mrs. Marie Horne at the organ.

14. Jody Whitcomb sang "The Lord is My Shepherd," accompanied by Jerri Patterson at the piano.

15. Mrs. Elizabeth Walters, Chairperson for the CSM Committee, came to give her testimony on our Christian Social Ministry. She stated that CSM is the scout division of God's army.

16. Reverend Royce Ballou was recognized to give the Sunday School report. He reported that the downward trend in our Sunday School enrollment and attendance has ended. Figures show an increase in both these areas as shown on a graph he shared with us. This report is found elsewhere in this volume.

17. Reverend Broadus Heatherly, pastor of Mt. Sinai Baptist Church, gave the Church Training report. Reverend Heatherly has served as Church Training Director for the Association for four years. He reminded us of the International Banquet to be held at Gardner-Webb College.

18. Director of Missions Cline Borders recognized and welcomed these new pastors and staff members: Raymond Shampert - pastor, Oak View; David Gordon - pastor, New Hope; Paul Silver - pastor, Faith; Mike Goodblock - pastor, Oak Grove; Frank Monroe - pastor, Temple; Kenneth Lynch - pastor, New Buffalo; Bobby Gantt - pastor, Grover First; Keith Dixon - Minister of Education, Boiling Springs; Judy Franks - part-time secretary, associational office.

He also recognized Mr. J.Y. Roper who was attending the Annual Meeting for the 36th consecutive year. It was noted that Mrs. G.G. Rollins was ill and could not attend the meeting. Mrs. Rollins had attended 41 Annual Meetings through last year. Mr. Borders reported that Mrs. Mae Perry, associational office manager, was ill but improving. Mr. Clint Newton, Jr., was recognized as a visitor with Mr. Carlos Young.

19. Reverend Ed Sessions, pastor of Flat Hill Baptist Church, gave the Membership Committee report. Parkway Mission, located south of Kings Mountain, was recognized for its work. He moved that Christian Freedom Baptist Church, whose pastor is Reverend Eddie Grigg, be accepted into the Association. Mal Schuman seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

20. The Executive Board report was given by Joe Cabanis, Secretary-Treasurer. He stated that 70 of our 72 churches have returned their church letters as of today. One of the highlights of the associational year was the approval of the bid for our new associational building. He invited everyone that has an interest to attend the Executive Board meetings. He announced that there are 318 in attendance today at this time.

21. The Moderator's message was given at this time by Reverend Dan Jolly, pastor of Zoar Baptist Church for the past eleven years. He gave thanks to all who have helped him while serving as Moderator. The theme for his message was from Proverbs - "where there is no vision, the people perish." He said that each of us in the Association is responsible for the destiny of others. We need to see the needs of humanity and have compassion enough to help by sharing God's love. He ended his message with a prayer for us to make God's business our business.

22. Benediction, with directions and thanks for the evening meal were given by Reverend Richard Pyle, host pastor.

### **Tuesday Evening**

23. Allen Jolley led the congregation in singing "On Calvary," "He Lives" and "How Great Thou Art" before the evening session began.

24. Reverend Jolly introduced Mrs. Marie Horne, who accompanied the congregational singing of "Blessed Assurance," led by Allen Jolley.

25. Reverend Mike Goodblock, pastor of Oak Grove Baptist Church, read the Scripture, taken from the 9th chapter of Matthew and 1 Corinthians, the 3rd chapter.

26. Reverend Joel Jenkins, Jr., pastor of Pleasant Ridge Baptist Church, led in prayer.

27. Cline W. Borders, Director of Missions, gave his report. That report is found elsewhere in this volume. He reported that significant new ministries were being

added to the ministry of the association and challenged messengers to become involved in meeting human needs here at home.

28. Rev. Frank Monroe, pastor of Temple Baptist Church, commended Reverend Borders, and suggested that the group in attendance stand in appreciation for his ministry. There was a hearty round of applause at this time also.

29. Reverend Jerry King, chairman of the Finance Committee, presented the budget. Copies had been distributed as the messengers arrived. Mr. King moved the adoption of the budget. Bill McDaniel seconded the motion and the motion carried.

30. Reverend Richard Pyles, pastor of Patterson Grove Baptist Church, and Chairman of the General Building Committee, gave the Building Committee report. That report is found elsewhere in this volume. He expressed appreciation to the members of the Building Committee for their work and cooperation and asked that messengers return to their churches and spread the word that their building is becoming a reality.

31. Reverend Paul Sorrells, pastor of Beaver Dam Baptist Church, gave the report of the Ordination Committee. This report is found elsewhere in this volume.

32. Allen Jolley led the congregation in singing, "He Keeps Me Singing." He then introduced Kathy Hamrick, who rendered "Victory in Jesus" using hand bells. She was accompanied at the piano by her mother, Mrs. Beth Hamrick.

33. Reverend Borders introduced Reverend Sam Pittman, Liaison for Associational Missions for the Foreign Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention, who spoke on the strategic position of associational missions. He related numerous kinds of vocational skills that are now needed from volunteers. He chose his scripture from Matthew 28:18-20. He expressed greetings from the Foreign Mission Board and appreciation for the excellent report of the Association in giving to the Cooperative Program and other designated gifts. He stressed the support of Bold Missions Thrust through the association, state, nation and overseas. He emphasized that ~~churches~~ appoint missionaries, and these missionaries represent the churches, not the Foreign Mission Board. We now have 3,065 missionaries serving in 95 countries of the world.

34. Reverend David Gordon, pastor of New Hope Baptist Church, gave the benediction.

#### **Wednesday Morning October 23, 1980**

35. The session was called to order by Moderator Dan Jolly at 9:30 A.M.

36. Bob Dells, Minister of Music at First Baptist Church, Shelby, led the congregation in singing "O For a Thousand Tongues to Sing."

37. Reverend Bobby Gantt read scripture from Philippians 4:4-13.

38. The opening prayer was led by Reverend Glenn Short, pastor of Highland Baptist Church.

39. Mr. Joe Cabaniss, Treasurer, was recognized by Moderator Dan Jolly. Mr. Cabaniss presented a motion to secure a loan for the new building. "He it resolved, that the Kings Mountain Baptist Association mortgage, encumber and otherwise pledge as security to the Home Savings and Loan Association of Kings Mountain, North Carolina, all of its real estate located on the North side of Wyke Road, Cleveland County, North Carolina, for the purpose of borrowing the sum not exceeding One Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$150,000.00) Dollars from said Savings and Loan Association at the current prevailing negotiated annual rate of interest, for the construction of an office facility. That all of the necessary instruments and documents pertaining to the borrowing of said amount be signed on behalf of the Association by the duly elected Trustees for the 1980-1981 term.

The Trustees are: T.S. Putnam, Fred Flowers, and Bob Hatnabright." Reverend Ned Buckner seconded this motion. It was approved. Mr. Cabanis also stated that the Special Gifts Committee has received 24 shares of Independence National Bank stock to sell, and made the following motion: "Be it further resolved, that twenty-four (24) shares of Independence National Bank, being Share Certificate No. U 26253, is sold for the sum of \$15.50 per share, and that Fred A. Flowers, a Trustee of the Association is hereby authorized to sign on behalf of this Association for the purpose of transferring same to the Purchaser." This motion was seconded by Reverend Sam Murphy. It was approved. Mr. Fred Flowers, Trustee, will accomplish this action.

40. At this time, Reverend Broadus Heatherly moved to dedicate the Minutes of this Annual Meeting to the memory of Mrs. Mae Petty, our associational secretary for the past twelve years, who died suddenly last night. This motion was seconded by Reverend Clyde Bearden, and approved.

41. The following organizational reports were made:

WMLU - Beth Hamrick

Music - Bob Dills

Media Center - Doris Borders for Bonnie Price

These reports are found elsewhere in this volume.

42. Moderator Dan Jolly presided for the election of officers. Reverend C.A. Kirby, Jr. nominated our present vice-moderator, Marion Adams, as moderator. Reverend Broadus Heatherly nominated Owen Wyatt as moderator. Ned Buckner moved to close the nominations. This was seconded and the nominations were closed. The vote was taken and Reverend Marion Adams was elected the new moderator.

Reverend Ned Buckner nominated Bruce Rabon as vice-moderator. Clyde Chapman nominated Clyde Bearden. Oliver Price moved to close the nominations. Ned Buckner seconded. The vote was taken and Reverend Clyde Bearden, pastor of Kings Mountain First, was elected the new vice-moderator.

Reverend James Rice nominated Joe Cabanis for clerk-treasurer. Don Ledbetter moved that we elect Mr. Cabanis by affirmation. Mal Schuman seconded this. Mr. Cabanis was elected as the new clerk-treasurer.

43. The report on enrollment was given by Mr. Joe Cabanis. Last evening we had 59 + in attendance, which made a total for Tuesday of 371. Today we have 202.

44. The report of the Committee on Committees was given by Linda Sweeney. She moved that they be accepted. Jim Rice seconded and approved. Mrs. Sweeney also announced that the Special Gifts Committee is enlarged from three to fifteen members.

45. Reverend Wade Dellinger gave the report of the Christian Life Committee. He made the motion that all reports be accepted as a part of our Minutes. Ned Buckner seconded this motion. The motion carried.

46. Bob Dills led us in singing "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name."

47. The constitutional change in By-Laws IV, Section-Duties of the Finance Committee, was presented by Ned Buckner, who moved that it be approved. C.A. Kirby, Jr. seconded the motion and it was approved.

48. Reverend Harvey Bolen, pastor of Patterson Springs, brought the report of the Resolutions Committee. This report is found elsewhere in this volume.

49. Reverend Cline Borders was recognized by the Moderator. He then presented Dan Jolly, Moderator for 1978-1980, with a plaque in appreciation for his service for past two years.

50. Reverend C.O. Greene, pastor of Norman's Grove, reported that two ministers, 13 deacons, and 202 members of our Baptist churches have died during the year. This Memorial report is found elsewhere in this volume.

51. Representatives of convention agencies were recognized at this time. Those recognized included: Ernest Glass, Wake Forest College; John Linderman, Desecrinations/Church Relations; Tom Sawyer, Mars Hill; Vernon Camp, Edgewater; Charles Scott, Gardner-Webb College; Dana Jenkins, Children's Home; Calvin Knight, Baptist Hospital; Hugh Starnes, Homes for the Aging.
52. Mr. Carlos Young gave the Biblical Recorder report. This is found elsewhere in this volume.
53. Dan Jolly introduced our new associational officers and pictures were made for the newspapers.
54. Bob Dills introduced Clyde Buckner, Minister of Music at Poplar Springs. Mr. Buckner sang a solo, accompanied at the piano by Mrs. Marie Horne.
55. Reverend Earl Redding, pastor of Love Valley Baptist Church for 36 years preached the annual sermon. He used Acts 3:1-8 as his scripture reference. The theme of his message was that Christ is our only hope.
56. Reverend Gary Youell, pastor of Plains View Baptist Church, gave the benediction.
57. Dan Jolly presented the gavel to the moderator, Marion Adams.
58. The meeting was declared adjourned by Moderator Dan Jolly.

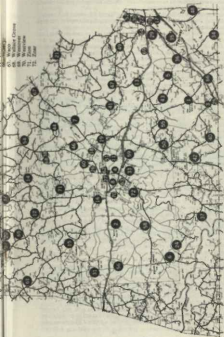

## DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS - ANNUAL REPORT

I am very pleased to be Director of Missions of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association as we continue to turn significant corners, strengthening the old and adding new and significant ministries.

Bob Davis continues to develop the Christian Social Ministries in a realistic and healthy way. We miss Mac Petty, who is recovering from surgery, but hope she will be back soon.

The ministry of the Kings Mountain Baptist Association far exceeds what I am involved in as Director of Missions. Yet my activity does reflect a part of that ministry. During the past year, it has been my privilege to preach 44 sermons in the churches of our association, to visit the worship services of 67 others and to visit in the home or office of 31 of our ministries. This past year I have conducted 23 workshops, seminars and/or marriage enrichment retreats.

It has been the highlight of my year to have been involved in 535 personal conferences and to be involved in telephone conferences with 691 persons. This past year I shared in one revival. I trained five Pulpit Selection Committees and provided on-going support as they carried out their responsibility.

I have participated in 12 associational committee meetings and 18 North Carolina State Convention committee meetings. The needs of pastors and their families who were hospitalized are reflected in the 135 visits that I made, as your Director of Missions. I shared in 33 Personal and Professional Growth Groups for pastors. I was privileged to attend 15 Pastors' Conferences during the year and to share in five community-type meetings. I was able to participate in 16 associational activities in this current associational year.

During the year, I have written six articles for publication. I have also written 903 personal letters as an expression of the ministry of the association.

Let me share with you some of the other highlights of the Year:

The pastors who came from South Africa brought a real spiritual blessing as they led revival services in various churches in the association.

I have questioned the report of our Baptist State Convention concerning the length of service of pastors to the churches. I have felt that the reported average for the state for two years - two years, six months did not reflect pastor-church relations in our Kings Mountain Association. We have conducted a study of pastoral tenure within our association. Our study covers a time span of 40 years - 1940-1979. When there was a change in pastors, nine months was allotted for the interim. The church having the shortest pastor's tenure averaged one year, six months. The church having the longest tenure averaged 17 years, nine months. Our associational average was five years, two months. I want to congratulate the pastors and churches for this achievement. I want to urge that we all join together in seeking longer tenure that is characterized by a healthy relationship, spiritual development and an aggressive, realistic outreach.

Last summer was exceedingly busy as I responded to an invitation from the Home Mission Board to lead conferences in both assemblies at Ridgecrest and Glorieta for Directors of Missions. I developed and wrote a Teaching Guide for the Seminary Extension Department's newest course entitled "The Minister's Wife." The North Carolina Baptist Convention asked me to develop a Listening-Viewing Guide for the churchmanship seminars which were held earlier in the year. These lectures will be available on videotape for our churches, beginning in 1981. The Viewing Guides will be made available to those using these tapes as a support in helping them to make this a more meaningful experience.

The Mission-Vacation Tour to Nashville, Tennessee was a new step for the Association, and one that we feel was highly successful in creating more fellowship among the membership of our churches. We had a total of 87 persons who went, from 22 churches.

Mrs. Borders and I continue to enjoy participating and leading Marriage Enrichment Retreats for the churches within our Association and churches in other associations as well. The Foreign Mission Prayer Breakfast was a real spiritual blessing to the men and boys who came to First Baptist last year to hear John Mills.

We added a new dimension to our ministry when in 1979 we began a prayer breakfast for the personnel of the midway of our Cleveland County Fair. The Lord has honored our efforts at this breakfast with a real awareness of His presence both years.

It was an historic moment as we gathered at our associational site for the ground breaking service for the new associational building. Kings Mountain Baptist Association has turned many corners and here was another that indicates the growing, expanding ministry of the 72 churches that constitute this association. I was at the head of the line pulling the rope and Richard Pyle was at the plow, breaking the ground. There were so many people present I could not feel the pressure of the plow in the ground as we moved together. To me, this was a parable of how having many hands to help with a task makes it easy. I continue to be grateful, so very grateful, for the many volunteers and able pastors who give leadership to the program of Kings Mountain Association. Mrs. Judy Allen and Miss Mary Sue Thompson operate our tape duplicating machine each week, and Mr. and Mrs. Sam Poston help in getting our mailouts together. These are vital ministries, and we thank you.

As we look to the future, I am anticipating the report of our Long Range Planning Committee, which is chaired by Reverend Paul Norreifa. This committee, when it has completed its work and reported to the association, will no doubt set the pattern for associational activity for the next five to ten years.

We will all be watching the new associational building as it grows up out of ground. I assure you that the associational staff is looking forward with great anticipation to having a more adequate and enlarged facility in which to express the ministry of the Kings Mountain Association. This facility will greatly magnify and multiply the ministry of the association and make it possible for us to meet more human need.

Please bear me when I say to you, I am very pleased to be the Director of Missions for the Kings Mountain Baptist Association as we continue to turn corners that magnify our Lord.

## **CHRISTIAN SOCIAL MINISTRIES - ANNUAL REPORT**

We have had a busy year in our Christian Social Ministry work. This is made possible through your growing interest in involvement in associational missions. We continue to see a vision of personal involvement in the heart of the people of Cleveland County. I commend you for your interest in sharing Christ's love for these special ministries that are a part of your Christian growth, and encourage you to continue to have a growing vision of sharing the love of Christ in more personal ways.

In our Juvenile Court Ministry, we began a Minister's Day in Court program. Six ministers have been involved in this. They attend court on a rotating basis and are available to work with families of the youth and court personnel. We arranged for two trips for youthful offenders and their counselors to visit the Western Carolina Correctional Center at Morganton and observe the "Final Step" program. A three-day camping experience was provided in April with thirteen persons attending. Three church groups assisted. Summer camp was held August 4-8 at South Mountain Christian Youth Camp, with fifteen people attending. A Christmas Social was sponsored by the Astoria of Boiling Springs Baptist Church. Twenty-six people from the court attended. In April, five churches provided refreshments for a picnic at Kings Mountain State Park.

Thirty attended this event. In August, the Actress of Lawndale Baptist Church sponsored a social, with nine people in attendance. In November, migrant classes were held for Juvenile Court youth. Average attendance for these classes was nineteen.

The work at our local prison camp has increased over the year. The Yorkville Ministry has met every other Tuesday with an average attendance of forty-three. Twenty-eight church groups assisted by providing home baked goodies for refreshments. During the year, thirty-three volunteers have served in this ministry and decisions for Christ have been made. Present attendance is in the high fifties. One hundred sixty scriptures have been distributed. A Bible study class was begun in June, meeting every Wednesday afternoon. Rev. Wade Dellinger began teaching the class in July. Average attendance has been eighteen. Our largest project this year was gift packets for the men in the local prison camp. Forty one church groups/individuals responded to this ministry. Young people from six churches helped with the packaging of the materials and delivered them to the prison. Because of your interest in touching their heart, we were able to share the meaning of the Christmas season with the 180 inmates who were there at the time.

In addition to these ministries, I have spent approximately two hours a week at the prison camp, sharing the love of Christ with the men in visitation and personal counseling. I have found that many of the men are receptive to religious counseling and programs. Their numbers are growing and so are they. Remember to pray for the prisoners and those who work with them as community volunteers.

Our Migrant Ministry was not as large this year. The number of migrant farm workers decreased because of the hail storm in the spring and the dry weather in the summer. Three churches provided Health Care Kits and one church provided School Kits. Two meetings of the Migrant Ministries Council were held. During the season, three camps were visited. Fifty three Scripture portions and Health Care Kits were delivered. Union and Sandy Plains Baptist churches were involved with two of the camps and much love was shared. A brochure listing services offered to the migrant farm worker was prepared and distributed through the Department of Services Food Stamp Office.

Our Literacy ministry workshops brought our number of trained literacy workers to 51. Our fall workshop at Union Baptist Church had an attendance of 100, with seven being certified. The spring workshop at First Baptist of Shelby was attended by twelve with ten certified to teach. The County Literacy Council met twice this year.

Our fastest growing ministry is the Emergency and Relief Ministry. In the 1978-79 year, we provided assistance with rent, utilities, food, medicine, referrals, clothing, etc., for 53 families. During this year we have provided assistance for 413 families. This is an average of 14+ per month. We began collecting food, clothing, furniture and money for special needs last October as we moved our present location. Since that time, 277 church groups/individuals have provided materials for these ministries. The average for this is 23 per month. This speaks well of your concern for missions on the association level. Needs in these areas are mountainous. During the approach of winter, we are already learning of people who do not have fuel. During the year we worked with inter-agency involvement. The Food for Life Committee was formed and the Cleveland County Utility Fund.

I am very pleased and encouraged by your enthusiasm for associational missions. There are still mountains of heart to be touched and I feel confident that more and more of our people will catch a vision of personal involvement as we continue to share the love of Jesus Christ in our Jerusalem.

Let me encourage you to make 1980-81 the year of the Christian Social Ministry Representative. Each church will become more involved in associational missions as you have someone designated as a contact person.

## EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT 1979 - 1980

Four regular quarterly meetings of the Executive Board were held during the past church year. Our meetings were held on Monday evenings after the third Sunday, the months of October, January, April and July. Each of our meetings was well attended by members from our churches. Our church host for the meetings were: October-Weavertown; January-Zoar; April-Piedmont; July-Lattimore. A special meeting was held September 9, 1980 with Eastside Church, Shelby as host.

Various reports of committees were received, in addition to routine matters, major items of information and recommendations were approved by the Executive Board. Some of the items were:

1. Approved relocation of Association office to more adequate space on East Marion Street, Shelby. Rental cost of space in the amount of \$250.00 per month.
2. Approved a recommendation to invite Fraternal Messengers from the Elmer Association to attend our annual meeting.
3. Approved the continuing program of our Baptist men in sponsoring a special program and breakfast for personnel appearing at the Cleveland County Fair.
4. Approved the awarding of a contract to Mr. T.C. Strickland, Jr. for construction of office building to be utilized by our Association for the sum of \$289,212.00, according to plans and specifications approved by the General Building Committee.

## SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT 1979 - 1980

Wonderful is the word for this year's Sunday School report! After several years of decline, I am thrilled to say that the downward trend has been reversed. With seventy (70) churches reporting, we see an increase of 427 in Sunday School enrollment from last year giving an enrollment figure of 17,679.

Average weekly attendance has increased by 350 to 9,462 this past year.

Since the Sunday School is also the one organization in the church charged with the responsibility of church outreach, we must also look at the number of baptisms since the result of effective outreach is new souls in the Kingdom. This figure also shows a tremendous increase of 123 from last year with a total of 608 baptisms reported in 64 of our churches.

The Sunday School Board is recognizing growth by giving awards to the fastest growing Sunday School in four categories:

1. The Sunday School having the largest numerical increase in enrollment during the church year, 2. The Sunday School having the largest percentage increase in enrollment during the church year, 3. The Sunday School having the largest numerical increase in average weekly attendance during the church year, and 4. The Sunday School having the largest percentage increase in average weekly attendance during the church year.

Pleasant Ridge, where David Webb is the Sunday School Director and Joel Jenkins, Jr. the pastor has reported a numerical increase of 130 in enrollment at 95 in average weekly attendance.

Northside Baptist in Shelby; Gary McNeilly, Sunday School Director and Stanley Webb pastor; reports an increase in enrollment of 129% and an increase in average weekly attendance of 100%.

Activities of your Associational Sunday School Improvement Support Team have included an outreach clinic in March led by John Hunter and a Curriculum Workshop in September led by Dr. Alice Culman. Your team has also worked with several churches in workshops and clinics within the individual churches.

Delightful as this report is, the task is still great as Nehemiah said. If we are to have the same percentage of the county's population enrolled and attending our Sunday School as we had ten years ago, we must increase our enrollment by 22% and our average attendance by 14% in this year. But as Nehemiah also said, "The people had a mind to work." As we have a mind to work, we too will achieve great things for our Lord.

### **WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION**

The W.M.U. emphasis for 1979-1980 was Life-Changing Commitments. This emphasis calls for life-changing commitments on the part of all church members, commitments to accept personal accountability for world missions. All W.M.U. curriculum and program materials for the year were related to Life-Changing Commitments and Bold Mission Thrust.

On March 15th, forty-five W.M.U. members travelled by chartered bus to Winston-Salem to attend the state W.M.Y. Convention. This was a day of good fellowship and inspiration.

The annual spring meeting was held April 15th at Temple Baptist Church, Kings Mountain. Miss Martha Franks, retired missionary was the speaker. A youth handbell choir from First Baptist Church, Shelby, provided special music.

During the year the W.M.U. council has met regularly to plan and promote associational W.M.U. work. Council members have attended training conferences at Ridgecrest and have assisted churches in starting new W.M.U. organizations. The council has continued to send a quarterly newsletter to pastors and W.M.U. leaders.

Our associational W.M.U. has been recognized as a Distinguished W.M.U. for the year 1978-79. This is the highest level of achievement and was attained through the efforts of many people and through the support of the association.

This is a poignant experience for me at this time. Mae Petty is dead. Surely she was one of God's choicest.

One of my teachers at Wake Forest used to say to his classes in Religion: "Young gentlemen, remember that as we grow older we tend to live in to spheres, memory and hope. And remember, too, that when you come to old age the only thing you'll have in memory's bag is what you are putting into it now."

The results look very promising that our city will soon have protection against this form of moral decay. Mr. Palmer took our request before the commissioners on Oct. 6, 1980, with the following results. The request received a good review and the attorney for the county is now seeking to find out all the legal aspects of the request. We will continue to monitor the final results of our work.

The Sunday observance of our local Christmas parade was an area we failed to accomplish any success. Monetary loss on the part of the merchants was the reason given for the Merchant's Association's refusal to consider another day of the work.

We made some tentative study on the possibility of having a conference for the special needs of those who have lost their companions. The Christian Life Commission in Raleigh voiced encouragement in this area of often neglected ministry.

Finally we are attempting to find a base of operation within our local congregations. We would like to encourage each congregation to establish a Christian Life Committee. Paragraphs concerning this committee's structure and functions are being mailed to all CSM representatives within our churches. We hope they will be received and acted upon accordingly.

A lot of research and planning have taken place this year. It is our prayers and hope that the year 1980-1981 will produce more tangible results.

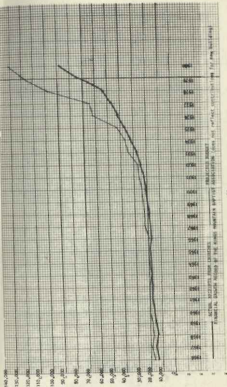
