NEED SOMETHING DONE? ASK THE *New Dean Brings Life Experience*

Teacher, pastor, full-time father, chaplain, and dean. These are just a few of the words to describe Dr. Bob Shackleford. At present, he serves all of these positions, plus a few more.

That's why Vice President and Dean of Academic Affairs Gil Blackburn says the old adage, "Need something done? Ask the busiest person you know" fits Shackleford. And it is probably one of the reasons that in May of this year Shackleford was named dean of the college of extended professional studies at Gardner-Webb, with primary responsibility for the school's GOAL Program. This came just three years after he began teaching at GWU, and only three years after receiving his doctorate.

His education began back in 1969 when he attended Bluefield College in Virginia on a basketball scholarship. It was basketball that led him to the College of the Ozarks in Point Lookout, Missouri. He majored in physical education with plans of becoming a basketball coach – something countless numbers of future GWU sociology students are glad never occurred.

Shackleford remembers one instance when the basketball team was returning home from an away game. Heading into a snow storm, the driver refused to stop. Panic among team members set in when the vehicle, traveling at 60 miles per hour, reached an icy bridge with an 18-wheeler heading in their direction. Shackleford confesses to being the team's most religious member. In fact, he was serving as the youth minister at First Baptist Church in Branson at the time. When they hit the bridge, Shackleford recalls, the men began yelling, "Pray, Shackleford, pray!"

Maybe it was that experience or his work with the youth that changed Shackleford's direction, but after receiving his bachelor of science, he entered the Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary. In 1976, he graduated with a

Master of Divinity. For the next 14 years, Shackleford served as pastor for a number of churches in West Virginia, North Carolina and South Carolina. He says he enjoyed his time serving as a full-time pastor but always knew he wanted to teach.

From 1984 to 1989, Shackleford worked on his Master of Science in Child Development and Family Relations at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. He then took a year off and contemplated his next move. In 1990, he



resigned as pastor of the First Baptist Church in Bluefield, West Virginia, and pursued his Ph.D. in Human Development and Family Relations.

The next three years Shackleford was a full-time student, taught courses at UNC-Greensboro and also taught classes for the evening program at High Point University. After graduation in 1993, he was hired as a full-time instructor at Gardner-Webb. Here, he has taught a variety of classes including Marriage and Family, Sociology of Religion and Social Problems.

While he was teaching, Shackleford has been quoted as saying "I know of no one else who wakes up in the morning and looks forward to getting up and going to work more than I do."

He says that on the first day of class, he often looks at the students and thinks, "They have so many preconceived ideas and notions and so many wounds from the past. I have 45 hours to help challenge them to understand about the family."

He adds, "I want students to make better decisions about their lives because of the things talked about in my class."

Meanwhile, as if his days at GWU aren't totally consumed, Shackleford fills his time with several other duties. He has spent more than a year serving as the interim pastor at First Baptist Church in Henrietta, NC. He has also been raising two children, Kristi, 19, and Kori, 17.

And, throughout most of his adult life, he has been serving as a chaplain, first in the Army Reserves and then in the Air National Guard. This is a serious commitment that often finds him performing funerals for military leaders, speaking to groups (including a recent military commencement service), and spending time away from home. One of his most unforgettable experiences as chaplain for the Air National Guard was working in Charlotte after the crash of flight 1016 in July 1994. All military personnel working at the crash site were required by the commander to talk with Shackleford before they could leave the site. He says the scene was traumatic and worse than anything the group had ever seen. It took him months to get over the shock as well.

All of Shackleford's duties have a common factor – they are challenging. And, the love of the challenge was the deciding factor when Shackleford was approached by the GWU administration about taking over the position of dean of the college of extended professional

studies. He now manages the operations of the GOAL (Greater Opportunities for Adult Learners) program at 14 sites across the state.

Shackleford has always been interested in adult education, having taught the evening program at High Point and has taught two GOAL courses each semester since he has been with Gardner-Webb. He says proudly he has already taught at 10 of the 14 sites.

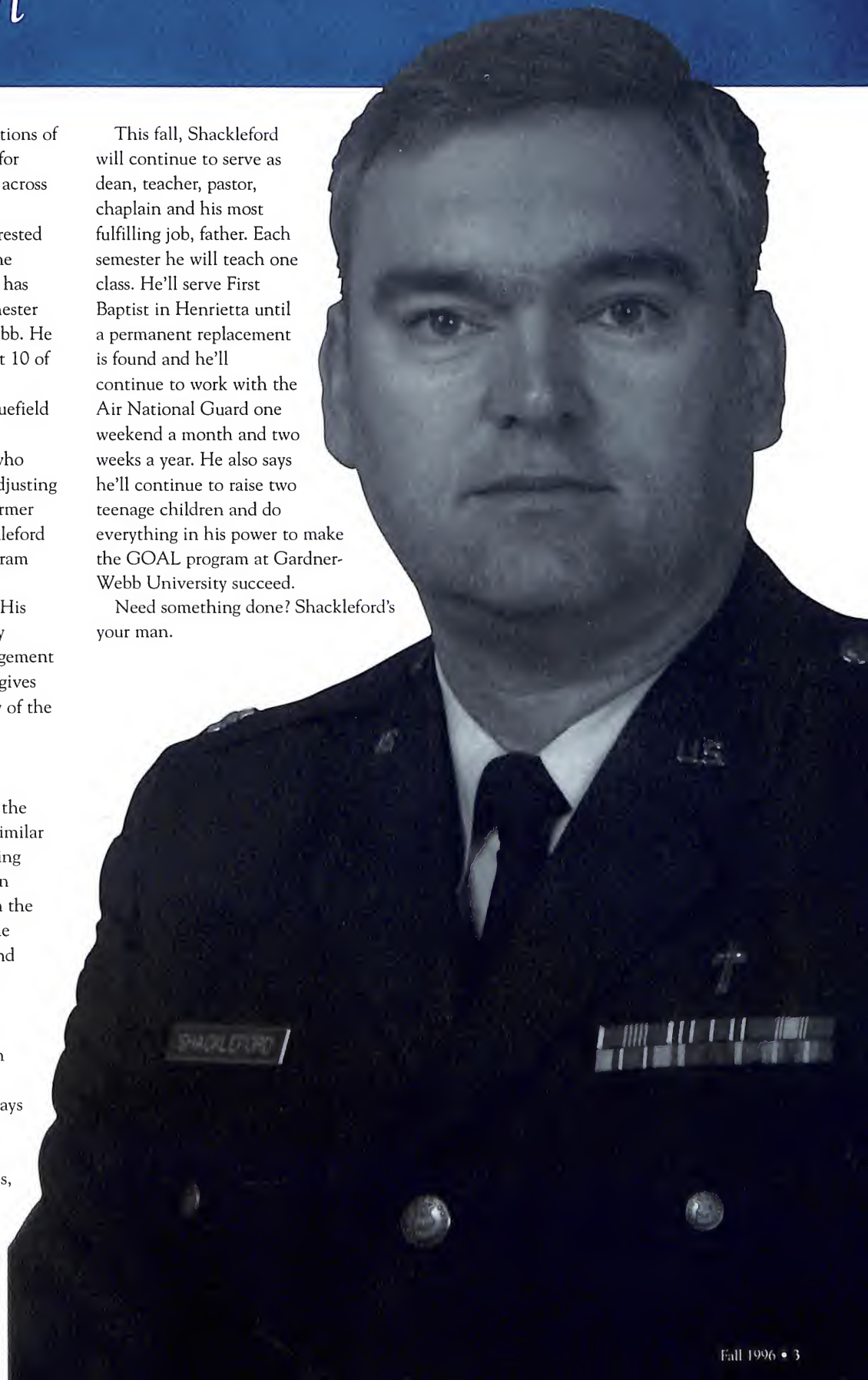
Shackleford, a member of the Bluefield College Sports Hall of Fame, is an imposing figure at 6'6". But those who work closely with him are already adjusting to the change. Martha Owens, a former GOAL business advisor, feels Shackleford brings outstanding ideas to the program and has the perfect combination of qualities to be an effective leader. "His military background makes him very efficient and allows for a firm management style while his pastoral background gives him a keen and compassionate view of the needs of human beings," she says. "Everyone can tell that this is the beginning of something special."

Changes are already occurring in the program. An orientation program, similar to what undergraduates on the Boiling Springs campus experience, has been implemented in the 14 locations. In the future, Shackleford says he wants the program to improve academically and involve the graduates of the GOAL program on a greater level.

Shackleford also feels that other courses of study in conjunction with those already being offered could survive at several GOAL sites. He says they hope to "find the needs and meet them." He wants to do this through some innovative techniques, saying, "We need to utilize technology to enhance education without losing the human touch."

This fall, Shackleford will continue to serve as dean, teacher, pastor, chaplain and his most fulfilling job, father. Each semester he will teach one class. He'll serve First Baptist in Henrietta until a permanent replacement is found and he'll continue to work with the Air National Guard one weekend a month and two weeks a year. He also says he'll continue to raise two teenage children and do everything in his power to make the GOAL program at Gardner-Webb University succeed.

Need something done? Shackleford's your man.



UPDATE

Two GWU projects that are receiving immediate attention have been made possible by separate gifts from First Gaston Foundation Inc. of Gastonia, and The George I. Alden Trust in Worcester, Massachusetts.

A \$50,000 commitment from First Gaston Foundation has been given toward the renovation project of the Myers Spangler Housing Complex. With the renovation divided into two parts, Phase I will completely refurbish rooms in Myers Hall with new furniture, carpet, windows, air conditioning, painting and removal of the existing piped HVAC system. Phase II of Myers will include new interior lighting, improved smoke and fire detection systems and improved bathroom fixtures. Similar renovations for Spangler Hall are scheduled to take place in the next calendar year.

The George I. Alden Trust has provided a cash gift of \$30,000 toward the creation of a multi-media classroom on the GWU campus, according to Dr. Frank Bonner, provost and senior vice president.

Described by Bonner as "in the planning stages, but something we are definitely pursuing," the idea of the classroom is to take an existing room on campus and transform it with technology that will allow professors to use high-tech teaching methods and possibly teleconferencing capabilities to enhance learning.

For example, through television, video and computer equipment, the room could be used to simultaneously teach classes on Gardner-Webb's Boiling Springs and Statesville campuses. Students who are without the benefit of having a professor in the same room with them can receive information through large-screen monitors, video and computer technology – thus creating a more personal learning experience, even though the instructor may be more than an hour away.

Graphics and information, Bonner said, can be projected through 3-D imaging with the proposed equipment. The idea came from a similar classroom seen used at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh.

BREAKING NEW GROUND

Lake Hollifield Bell Tower Project Underway

A July 30th groundbreaking ceremony on the GWU campus for the new Lake Hollifield bell tower will remain significant for several reasons.

The occasion marked the anniversary of the death of Wyndolyn and Hughy Hollifield's only son, Forrest, who died in combat in Vietnam. The ceremony was also the first chance Mrs. Hollifield had to return to GWU since Hughy Hollifield's death in May.

But while this Tuesday morning could have been a sorrowful time, the focus was shifted to what was an event of celebration. Guests gathered on a knoll overlooking the majestic Lake Hollifield to witness the beginning of something special. A tower, complete with a system of bells called a carillon that can be played electronically or manually, will soon stand for all to see and hear. And the ground on which it will be erected has now been officially broken.

In what some guests called an amazingly short amount of time, the goal for completion of the tower was set by Dr. Chris White, and later affirmed by the construction company's president, as November. "Wouldn't it be glorious to have these bells playing in victory after the November 16th game against Mars Hill?" White asked the crowd.

With an artist's rendering of the tower at his side, White pointed out that it was designed in three very distinct sections. The top of the structure that houses a massive clock is a replica of the most visible part of the old Huggins-Curtis building, which decades ago before it burned was the main building on campus, featuring dorm rooms, offices, classrooms and a cafeteria. This, the president noted, represents the past.

The ground-level section of the tower has integrated into its architecture a miniature version of the arched window that is seen on the front of Noel Hall,

the newest building on campus that is home to the School of Divinity. Naturally, White said, this is symbolic of the present.

The middle portion of the structure features the carillon. Literally tons of bells will hang here to ring out on any number of occasions. As the Gardner-Webb community eagerly awaits hearing the soothing sounds of the carillon for years to come, Dr. White explained that this represents the future.

The ceremony gave the opportunity for various individuals to note just what this day meant to them. On behalf of the students, SGA president Michael Mustian eloquently stated, "The commitment you have shown, Mrs. Hollifield, is about the faith and love that will surely continue the level of excellence we as students have become accustomed to at Gardner-Webb. While other schools may have more students or more famous names attached to it, our school has its people. And, Mrs. Hollifield, you are one of those very special people."

Dr. Terry Fern, chair of the Department of Fine Arts, added on behalf of the faculty, "Through this gift you have chosen to improve the world around us, and we thank you. I assure you that the faculty and students will always have occasion to honor and remember you and Mr. Hollifield."

WASHBURN'S SUPPORT OF CAMPAIGN BRINGS RECOGNITION FROM GWU, GOVERNOR HUNT

North Carolina Governor Jim Hunt was present at Gardner-Webb on Tuesday, June 25, for the official dedication of the school's admissions building in honor of Dr. and Mrs. H. Gene Washburn of Boiling Springs. Currently the chairman of the GWU Board of Trustees, Dr. Washburn has joined with his wife, Billie, in committing a major gift to the University's "Dreaming, Daring, Doing" capital campaign.

The ribbon-cutting ceremony formally recognized the first renaming of an existing campus facility in honor of a donor who has supported the current campaign effort. The first new facility named in honor of a donor was Lindsay Court, a banquet hall in the University's Lutz-Yelton Convocation Center made possible by Winifred Lindsay of Rutherfordton.

The building named in honor of the Washburns will be known as Washburn Hall, a facility that houses all the University's admissions and financial planning activities. Before being donated to Gardner-Webb years ago, the building was for decades the site of Dr. Washburn's medical practice. A portion of the major gift committed by the Washburns has been used to renovate the facility for office space and improvements.

Although the amount of the couple's gift is undisclosed, White noted that Dr. Washburn's donated time, services and equipment as University physician as well as team physician for all GWU athletic sports for so many years would "certainly reach well into the seven figures."

He added, "Dr. Washburn and Billie have been major contributors to this

University long before this campaign was ever started. There is no way to put a price tag on the amount of support they have given over the past decades."

Dr. Washburn is a 1952 graduate of Gardner-Webb and now practices at Boiling Springs Medical Associates, located adjacent to the GWU campus.

Dr. White explained the extreme importance of the Washburns' gift, saying, "To be successful in a huge fund-raising effort such as ours, the leaders of the University – the Board of Trustees and the school's administration – must step forward and show support. The Washburns have taken that step and set a remarkable example for other contributors to follow."

Referring to Dr. Washburn's generous nature, White added, "Before you stands a man who has served his country through the U.S. Army, his profession through a caring medical practice, and his University through the contribution of resources. He and his wife should be truly commended."

Governor Hunt was equally impressed with the occasion, saying, "The future of education rests on the shoulders of committed individuals – people like the Washburns who, year after year, are a constant driving force for schools such as Gardner-Webb University."

PREPARE TO TAKE THE WALK OF HONOR

As excitement about the construction of a new bell tower at Lake Hollifield has reached peak levels, yet another project has been unveiled related to the campaign. Soon Gardner-Webb employees, students, friends and alumni will be able to stroll past the Dover Campus Center along a new Walk of Honor.

With the construction of the Walk being made possible by a gift from Fields Young III, national campaign chair of the "Dreaming, Daring, Doing" campaign, and his wife Margaret, all donors of \$500 or above to the fund-raising effort now will forever be recognized for their generosity.

This level of giving entitles the donor to have a brick placed within the Walk and inscribed with the names of the donors themselves or in honor or memory of an individual. Alumni may even have their class year included.

Existing gifts to the campaign provide the starting point for the Walk with all forthcoming gifts during the life of the campaign at \$500 or above extending the Walk as far as necessary. The five-year "Dreaming, Daring, Doing" campaign officially ends in 1999. Campaign officials added that the gift may be made in full or payable over a five-year period.

Because involvement in giving to Gardner-Webb has never before been so important and vital, the Walk of Honor seeks to express a sincere thanks on behalf of the University to those people who are helping it become a nationally prestigious institution.

The campaign is experiencing great success, but there is much more that can be done. Private support from alumni and others who are closest to the University will serve to ensure a progressive future for Gardner-Webb and its students.

Your gift will make a difference. The Walk of Honor will show generations to come who is to thank for it.

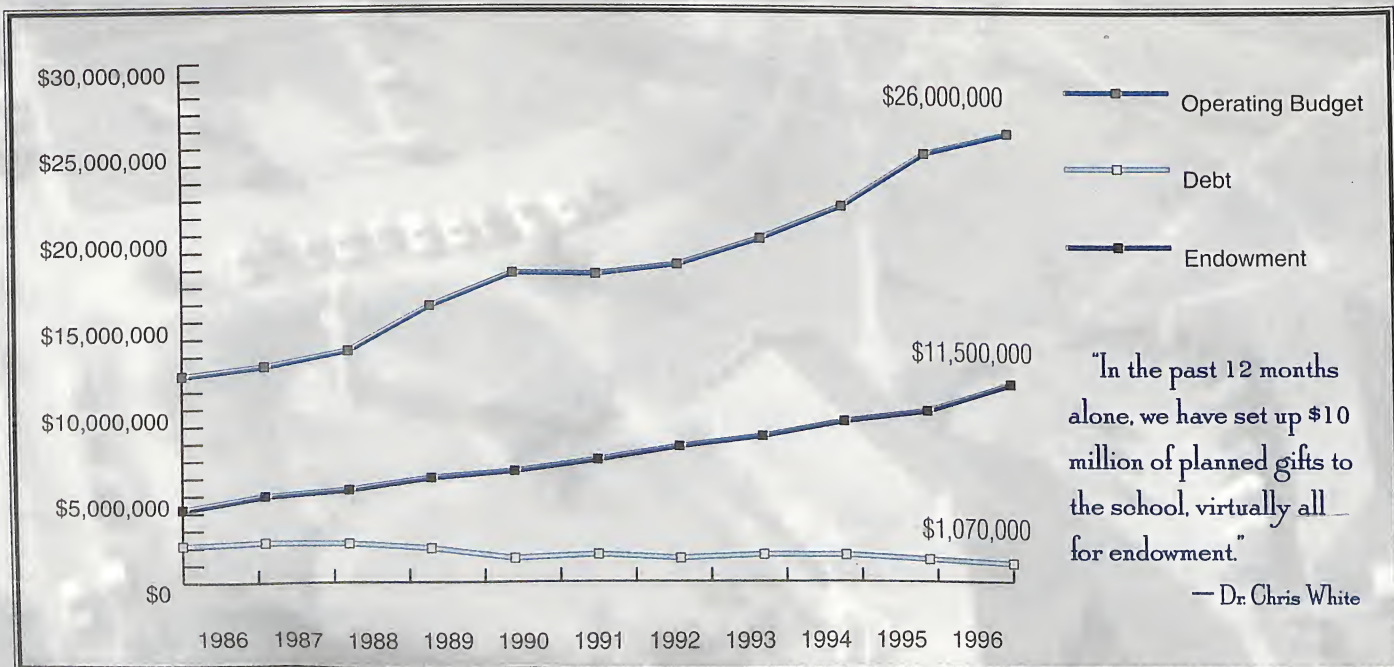
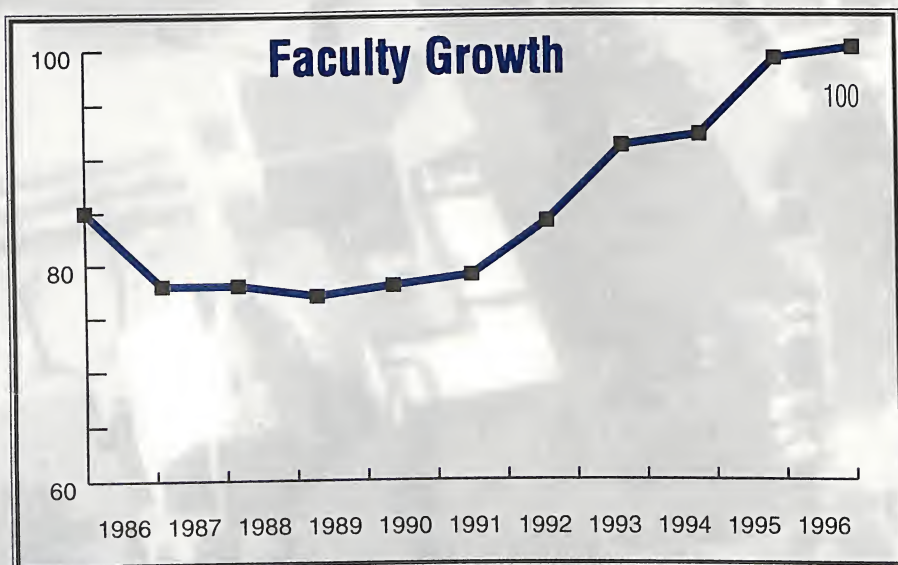
- Kendra Haneline – senior business major: "I've wanted to come here since I was in the 7th grade. I came for a youth camp and just fell in love."

I had been (Anderson College). But, the main thing was the people."

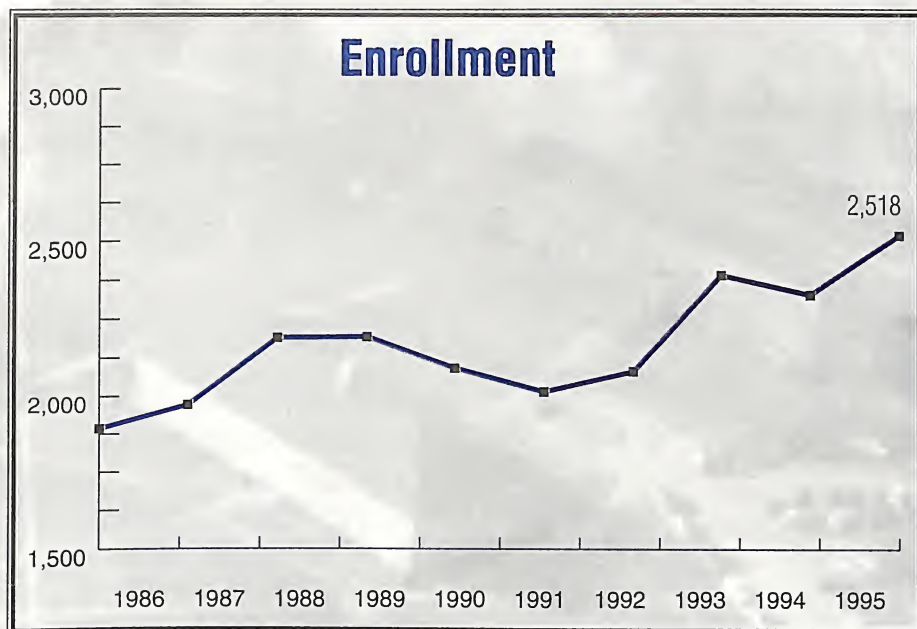

A LOOK INTO THE FUTURE: "THROUGH THE PRESIDENT'S EYES"

With 10 years behind him, Dr. Chris White is not taking much time to reflect on his accomplishments but, instead, looks toward the future. White's goals reach every aspect of life at Gardner-Webb, including academics, athletics, finances and student life.

One of the visible statistics that Gardner-Webb is often measured by is enrollment. In the past decade, enrollment has increased 33 percent, mostly during a time when the number of high school graduates nationally was the lowest it has been in 20 years. White would like to experience the same success in the next 10 years, striving for an enrollment by the year 2006 of over 3,300 students.

The increase in the endowment at GWU is one of the most significant monetary gains made during White's leadership. "In the past 12 months alone, we have set up \$10 million of planned gifts to the school, virtually all for endowment," says White. Expect an endowment of an impressive \$30 million in the next decade.

Academically, White hopes to continue to do more with international education. GWU already has two exchange agreements with foreign institutions – Dohto University in Japan and Sookmyung Women's University in South Korea. Also, Gardner-Webb is beginning to move into the field of sports medicine, and the next

discipline on the undergraduate level will most likely be special education. The next graduate level degree, according to White, will probably be in the health field. Expect Gardner-Webb to offer its first doctorate in the near future as well. In fact, the president says there will be a Doctor of Ministry as soon as the accreditation process for the School of Divinity allows for its creation. White believes these additions are likely, but his long-term goal remains the addition of a law school.

With the increase in students and programs, the next logical area to address is facilities. The president sees significant building projects taking place in the future. Top priority is the renovation of Hamrick Hall, the oldest and most historic building on campus. That facility will house the School of Business. White feels the next project will depend on funding. Look for the following (in no particular order) to be discussed:

- Wellness Center (attached to a completely renovated Bost Gym)
- Science building
- Communications Studies building
- Music facility and recital hall.

While still pondering the goals for facilities, White is quick to point out his concern for housing on campus. According to him, no new dorms will be built. Instead, he envisions a possible housing complex on the undeveloped side of Lake

Hollifield that will most likely consist of two-bedroom apartments for single adults as well as families. This, he says, is crucial to the expansion of the graduate program and the attraction of older students to GWU programs.

"I also would like to see Gardner-Webb's athletic programs return to the prominence of the days of Eddie Holbrook (GWU basketball coach, 1964-1977)," says White. "And this year Gardner-Webb has the potential to have its best athletic year in a long time." One reason is that for the first time in history, GWU now offers the full amount of scholarships the conference allows in every sport. White is also currently taking his turn as the president of the South Atlantic Conference.

With a decade of progress to build upon, White is confident that these goals will someday be achieved. "I think we can do all of this by being focused on who we are and getting better and better."

ACCREDITING BODY GIVES GWU HIGH MARKS 10-YEAR REVIEW A SUCCESS

Want to operate a successful university?
Not without this you won't.

Gardner-Webb University learned recently it had successfully completed an accreditation review process that is required every 10 years for 800 colleges and universities in the southeastern United States. The review, conducted by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), is an intensive, two-year study of every aspect of an institution's programs and operations, according to Dr. Frank Bonner, GWU provost and senior vice president.

After a comprehensive self-study is conducted by a university, a visiting SACS committee spends several days reviewing the school and then takes collected data back to another SACS committee called the Commission on Colleges. When all information has met SACS criteria, reaffirmation of a school's accreditation is granted. SACS accredits institutions in 11 Southeastern states. Accreditation, Bonner said, is imperative for a college or university to operate.

"Without accreditation, students could not receive federal financial aid or be eligible for admission into graduate or professional schools. Likewise, foundations will not recognize schools seeking funding that are not accredited. The clean bill of health given to us by SACS confirms what

we were confident of – that Gardner-Webb can be recognized for its quality in all areas."

Gardner-Webb's two-year self-study of its programs and campus activities was led by faculty member Dr. Sue Camp, professor of business. The University evaluated areas such as the institution's mission statement and effectiveness, financial health, academic offerings, student life, facilities, policies and documents.

"The key is to demonstrate that you're meeting your institution's goals and that you're pursuing good, sound practices in higher education," explained Camp. "As a Gardner-Webb graduate and professor, I've

Bonner noted that every effort is made by SACS to provide a visiting committee comprised of members from comparable institutions as the one they evaluate, thus ensuring that it is a peer review. The only stipulation, he added, is that committee members cannot be employed by schools in the same state as the one they observe.

Bonner explained that while specific programs within a university can have national accreditation, overall accreditation for an institution is conducted regionally rather than nationally. For example,

education, nursing and music programs all feature national accreditation. The GWU School of Divinity, begun in 1993, currently is working toward national accreditation, having taken the first major step in that process recently by being elected as an associate member of the Association of Theological Schools.

GRADUATION MEMORABLE FOR GOAL PROGRAM NEW DEAN GIVES ADDRESS

Advisors in the GOAL Program admit they get a special feeling at each graduation ceremony held on the Gardner-Webb campus. That's because working with students in the University's night school program, they get to know people who most likely have struggled more with gaining a college education than the traditional student.

The GWU GOAL program was well-represented at Gardner-Webb's summer commencement in August. Nearly 125 graduates of the program were part of the 170 that received degrees in the Lutz-Yelton Convocation Center on campus.

The ceremony was especially significant because the keynote address was delivered by Dr. Bob Shackleford, the newly appointed dean of the college of extended professional studies, who now oversees the management of the GOAL Program.

Shackleford said to the graduating class, "A sentence in a book by Bill Bradley changed my life, and maybe it will have the same effect on you. It read 'When I'm not practicing, someone, somewhere is; and when we meet, he'll beat me.' Just remember it's not always who has the talent and who doesn't – it's who's willing to work hard and do the job."

One student indicative of the spirit of the GOAL program is Jewel Jones. As a 54-year-old working professional, Jones has tackled the prospect of going back to college rather late in life. But all the while Jones kept her grades near perfect and "gave every ounce of herself to getting that degree." Jones received the bachelor of science degree in business administration through classes at Gardner-Webb's Richmond County site.

Most all of the GOAL students make sacrifices to attend the program, according to GOAL advisors. "Generally, these people

are at the age of taking care of children or elderly parents, so by taking classes while holding a full-time job and attending to other obligations is quite an undertaking," one staffer explained. She added that often GOAL students have pursued a career without a college education and come to realize the importance of such schooling during mid-life.

Degrees conferred at commencement included the Master of Business Administration (MBA), bachelor of arts, master of arts, bachelor of science, and Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN).

PROFESSORS RECOGNIZED

TWO RECEIVE AWARD FOR ACADEMIC COURSE

Gardner-Webb professors Drs. Barbara Burkett and Jack Partain are the only North Carolina winners of a prestigious prize. A course they created, "Issues in Science and Religion," won a \$10,000 award from the John Templeton Foundation.

The foundation, established in 1987, encourages the pursuit of scientific and religious knowledge. Only 100 awards were presented nationwide.

Dr. Burkett is a professor of biology, Dr. Partain serves as a professor of religion at Gardner-Webb. In order to receive the award, Drs. Burkett and Partain traveled to Berkeley, California, to attend a summer workshop.

SCHOOL OF DIVINITY TAKES STEP FORWARD

ACCREDITATION NEARING

The School of Divinity at Gardner-Webb was admitted as an associate member of The Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada (ATS) at the 40th biennial meeting in Denver, Colorado. ATS associate membership is a necessary step toward gaining full accreditation. University officials call this a great achievement for the School of Divinity because it not only represents high standards, but it was granted at the earliest possible date.

Since the School of Divinity was established in 1992, the faculty and staff of the School and of the University have been working in close cooperation with

the ATS staff toward candidacy. Requirements for admission include employing a certain number of properly qualified faculty; the offering of a broad range of theological disciplines in the educational program; featuring a library of appropriate size and adequacy; a commitment of openness to diversity; and the completion of a full graduating class.

The first divinity commencement in 1995 awarded the Master of Divinity (M.Div.) degree to five graduates who had transferred some coursework into the program. This spring, the commencement for 11 graduates included those who completed the full M.Div. degree with the School of Divinity.

Currently, out of the 192 schools that are accredited by ATS in the United States and Canada, only two of those are in North Carolina – Duke Divinity School and Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary. It will take the GWU School of Divinity a minimum of two more years to become fully accredited.

DEPARTMENT CHAIR ELECTED TO REGIONAL POST

MORGAN TO HEAD ALPHA CHI



Gardner-Webb University foreign languages chair Dr. Robert E. Morgan has been elected as president of Region III of Alpha Chi, the national college honor scholarship society.

Morgan, who is the faculty sponsor of the North Carolina Zeta chapter of Alpha Chi at Gardner-Webb, will serve a two-year term as president. In this capacity he will be the head of Region III, which consists of 80 college and university chapters of Alpha Chi in the Southeast.

Vice President and Dean of Academic Affairs Dr. Gil Blackburn says, "Dr. Morgan's election to this position is indicative of the status we are giving to academic performance on campus. Our

Morgan echoes the thoughts of Blackburn, saying that he is not only pleased on a individual basis but also for Gardner-Webb. "Anytime we can do something that puts Gardner-Webb University in the academic forefront increases the value of the degrees our students earn," Morgan said.

Three hundred institutions in the United States and Puerto Rico have Alpha Chi chapters. Membership in Alpha Chi is limited to the top 10 percent of juniors and seniors academically and recognizes character as well as scholarship. Alpha Chi will celebrate its 75th anniversary in 1997.

FREEMAN FUND MAKES COLLEGE A POSSIBILITY FOR AREA STUDENTS

FIVE QUALIFY FOR ASSISTANCE

This isn't your typical scholarship story.

Several Cleveland County business leaders have formed a scholarship fund that provides financial assistance to high school students who qualify academically for college but whose unique situations might otherwise prevent them from attending.

In a July presentation five Cleveland County high school graduates received

awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$2,500 from the Joseph B. Freeman Jr. Education Fund. Guidelines for the fund state that at least half of the recipients will be students planning to attend Gardner-Webb. In turn, Gardner-Webb agrees to match, dollar for dollar, awarded to recipients who enroll as full-time undergraduates. Scholarship and matching funds provide tuition, housing and meals for the students.

Three of the five teenagers honored Tuesday will enroll at GWU in the fall. They are Starr Tressa Gist and Dorinda May Holmes of Shelby High School, and Joel Steven Kendrick Jr. of Burns High School.

The remaining two recipients are both from Shelby High School, Lance O'Neill McCluney, who plans to attend UNC-Charlotte, and Kari Leigh Davis, who will enroll at Brevard College.

This year's recipients are shining examples of exactly why this fund was created, said GWU President Dr. Chris White. He specifically cited the personal circumstances of Gist and Kendrick as evidence, explaining that both have overcome difficulties and hardship to pursue their college dreams.

Kendrick last year was involved in a near-fatal automobile accident that doctors thought would leave him unable to walk. After a great deal of rehabilitation, however, he has made an admirable recovery and plans to study physical therapy in college. Because of medical expenses incurred, White said, Kendrick was an ideal candidate for a Freeman award.

Gist was recognized by the scholarship selection committee for remarkable scholastic aptitude, an exceptional SAT score, and a propensity for composing colorful short stories. With both parents deceased and the responsibility of helping care for others in her household, Gist was praised by Dr. White for her positive attitude and her desire to succeed. It was noted that a recommendation letter written on her behalf by one of her teachers described her as "a miracle." Gist will study history at Gardner-Webb.

The fund helps those about to fall through the cracks.

Established in 1991, the fund was named for the late Joseph B. Freeman, who for many years was head of the Interstate Johnson Lane office in Shelby and who was a visible supporter of educational pursuits in Cleveland County.

An unusual footnote to the Freeman awards presentation is the distinction that Shelby businessman Stuart LeGrand has achieved. LeGrand was recently notified that he had won an automobile in a drawing held by the Boys Club. Gardner-Webb President Dr. Chris White, upon hearing that LeGrand had also previously won another automobile in a similar drawing, asked LeGrand if he would like to donate the cash value of the vehicle to Gardner-Webb, specifically to the Freeman Education Fund. LeGrand agreed.

"His unselfish act is sort of indicative of the spirit in which the fund was created, to give what we can to those who might benefit most from it," said White.

OLD TESTAMENT PROFESSOR JOINS GWU

KEOWN TO REPLACE WYATT

Dr. Gerald L. Keown has joined Gardner-Webb as a professor of Old Testament Interpretation for the School of Divinity. Keown, who is replacing the retiring Dr. Roy Wyatt, comes to GWU from The



Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky.

During the past year, Keown also did some teaching abroad. He taught at the Baptist Theological Seminary in Singapore and the Moscow Theological Seminary in Russia. In addition to teaching, Keown has led Bible conferences, revivals, and serves as an interim pastor. He has been published in several journals and study Bibles and most recently co-authored a commentary for the publication "Word" on the subject of Jeremiah.

Keown is married and has two daughters.

GWU TRUSTEE ACCEPTS NEW POSITION

PHILSON TAKES VP SLOT

GWU Board of Trustees member Thomas Philson recently changed jobs. He was named vice president of employee development for Carolinas HealthCare System. Previously, Philson served as the vice president of human resources for the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Hospital Authority.

Philson began serving as a trustee over a decade ago. He is currently the chair of the finance committee and a member of the executive committee on the University's Board of Trustees.

NEW LEADERSHIP IN PLACE FOR MBA PROGRAM

HARDIN NAMED DIRECTOR

Dr. Russell Hardin was named as the new director of the Master of Business Administration (MBA) Program, effective this fall semester.

Hardin, assistant professor of business administration and accounting, follows Dr. Keith Griggs as head of the program. Griggs, chair of the Broyhill School of Management, helped put together a stellar MBA faculty and saw the program through its first graduating class.

Hardin is considered one of the foremost authorities in the accounting field, as was shown by the invitation he received from an international accounting conference in Norway to present a recent paper, "The Career Orientation of CPAs: An Empirical Analysis." He has also been asked to

address groups in Chicago and San Antonio, Texas.

Hardin holds a Ph.D. in Accountancy from The University of Mississippi. He has taught for over two decades.

JAPANESE BUSINESSMAN SHOWS INTEREST IN GWU

COMMERCE REP TAKES TOUR

The Japanese liaison to the North Carolina Department of Commerce recently visited the campus of Gardner-Webb University as part of a brief tour of Cleveland County. Hideji Kurihara, who will be stationed in Toyko, will represent the business interests of North Carolina in Japan.

Kurihara toured several parts of the campus during his visit, including Webb Hall, the School of Business in Lindsay Hall and the World Trade Resource Center. He was impressed by the beauty of the campus as well as the commitment GWU has toward furthering international business.

Gardner-Webb's regionalism also impressed Kurihara. He was unfamiliar with the University's GOAL program, which is featured at 14 locations around North Carolina, and was intrigued by the concept.

Kurihara is replacing John Sylvester in the Toyko office. His stop in Cleveland County was one of only a few in the state. While here, he also visited Cleveland Yutaka Corporation, a new Japanese company just minutes from the GWU campus, and Cleveland Community College.

Steve Nye, Cleveland County Economic Development Commission director, says that Gardner-Webb's affiliation with Dohto University in Japan is one reason he wanted to bring Kurihara to campus. "We want Mr. Kurihara to know that Japanese companies choosing to locate in Cleveland County will have an advantage because of the interchange of students between Gardner-Webb and Dohto University, as well as the university's strong business program."

FOOTBALL PROGRAM PICKED SECOND IN

Looks For Third Conference

"To succeed our older guys must step up."

As the 1996 football season was approaching, a loud noise could be heard coming from the practice fields on the campus of Gardner-Webb University. It was the sound of a rising storm in NCAA Division II football, a team primed and ready for an explosion of success in 1996.

After posting a 6-4 overall record, and a 4-3 third place finish in the South Atlantic Conference last season, the Runnin' Bulldogs seem ready to thunder towards a conference championship and a trip to the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

The Dogs enter the 1996 season picked second in the pre-season coaches poll, behind defending champion Carson-Newman. The Eagles are ranked 6th in one national publication's pre-season poll.

With 13 starters returning, the 1996 version of the Runnin' Bulldogs has the potential to storm the South Atlantic Conference and the national scene.

The strength of the Runnin' Bulldogs this season will be a hard-hitting, talented defense that returns 14 of its top 22 players, including second leading tackler Bo Shannon (89 tackles, 14 hurries). The 5-10 210 lb. sophomore will team with Wes Schenk (6-3, 245 So.), Ronnie Getz (6-0, 200 Sr.), Thomas Marsh (5-10, 215 Sr.) and Chris James (5-10, 220 Sr.) to give

the Dogs one of the nation's best linebacking corps.

The secondary will also be strong, returning two starters that helped lead the 1995 unit to a #9 national ranking in Pass Efficiency Defense. Honorable mention All-American choice Speedy Mickles (6-0 175, Sr.) returns for his final season after leading GWU with four interceptions last season. Senior Robert Mooror (6-1, 215) will get the nod at safety after starting several games last season.

Senior Andrei Coley (5-10, 175) and a trio of junior college transfers will make a strong push for playing time at the other corner. JuCo All-American Javier Martinez (6-0, 190) from Iowa Central C.C. should also see time in the defensive backfield or at a linebacker slot.

The driving force up front will be pre-season All-SAC candidate Kenny Freeman (6-3, 255 Sr.). He led the Dogs with six sacks in 1995, also collecting 64 total stops. Freeman's "refuse to lose" attitude and intensity rubs off on his teammates.

Another player that will push for post-season honors this season is Georgia Tech transfer James Singleton (6-3, 295). The former high school All-American possesses the size, strength and speed to dominate the line of scrimmage. Joining Freeman and Singleton up front will be Rashad Bratton (6-1, 260 Jr.). Bratton saw action in nine games, backing up All-American Jason Brewer. He totaled nine tackles, including two for loss. Sophomore Wardell Cooper (6-3, 255) and junior Keon Stewart (6-2, 230) will also push for playing time.

A fresh philosophy on the offensive side of the ball will provide GWU fans with a new look for 1996. First-year offensive coordinator Mike Ledford brings an exciting, powerful offensive system with him from Tennessee Tech. The Dogs will

line up in a multiple I-Formation this season, taking advantage of a big, veteran offensive line, mobile quarterbacks and a variety of talented runners.

Key to the new offensive scheme will be the play of an offensive line that returns four starters and all five top reserves.

Leading the way will be All-American candidate Kelwin Witherspoon (6-3, 280 Sr.). The two time All-Conference selection excels in all phases of blocking, and uses his superior athletic ability to both overpower and out-maneuver defenders. The Turbeville, S.C., native will start at one of the tackle spots. Sophomore Ben Fuller (6-4, 275) will also challenge for All-Star honors, lining up at guard. Veteran center Billy Henderson (6-2, 260 Jr.), and guard Michael Wilbanks (6-4, 280 Sr.) will also be strong candidates for All-Conference honors.

Big David Green (6-5, 300 Sr.) will start at tackle, with junior college All-American Brandon Ma'Puhi (6-3, 300), junior Kevin Cruise (6-6, 310) and senior Seth Townley (6-2, 300) pushing for playing time.

Sophomore Tyrone McGill (6-1, 185) will get the call at quarterback, giving the Runnin' Bulldogs one of the most dangerous signal callers in the conference. The former Gaffney (S.C.) High star can pass and run the football effectively, which will provide another dimension for opposing defenses to stop. McGill threw for 150 yards last season in a reserve roll, completing 16 of 36 passes. He ran for 42 yards on 16 carries.

With top receivers Lonnie Custer (graduation) and Terry Guess (NFL Draft) gone, GWU quarterbacks will have to find new targets to throw to in 1996.

Senior Terrance Porter (6-4, 180) returns after sitting out the 1995 season with an injury. The former Dorman (S.C.) High star will be the leader of a young but talented group of receivers. In 1994, he caught 18 balls for 290 yards and three touchdowns. His excellent size creates a mismatch for smaller defensive backs.

Two youngsters that will see plenty of time this season are Robye DeWitt (5-9,

175 So.) and Tanner May (6-0, 170 Fr.). DeWitt saw action last season as a kick returner, bringing back four kicks for 57 yards. His speed and intensity will be assets this season. May redshirted in 1995, but made great strides in the spring and should improve more as the season progresses.

Good blocking and receiving from the tight end position will be a key part of the Runnin' Bulldog offense this fall, and four talented players will battle for the majority of playing time.

Returning starter Britt Phillips (6-3, 240 Sr.) has good experience in the passing game, and has the size to be an outstanding blocker. Redshirt freshman Josh Low (6-2, 225) is a future star with great hands and a knack for blocking.

Junior Amp Smith (6-3, 255) and senior Dwayne Simpson (6-3, 215) have moved from runningback to tight end in the spring, and both have shown good progress in learning the new position. With the move to a ground-oriented attack, GWU will depend on a stable of exciting tailbacks and punishing fullbacks to thunder through opposing defenses.

Shed Harris (6-0, 205 Sr.), the team's leading rusher in 1995, returns for his final season, and should flourish in the new offensive system.

Although bothered by injuries through much of his career, Harris has moved into eighth place on Gardner-Webb's all-time rushing list with 1,373 career yards. He needs only 175 yards to move into the top five. The Aiken, S.C., native had his best season in 1994, running for a career-high 686 yards on 126 carries (5.4 per carry) and five touchdowns. Last season, he ran for 419 yards on 94 carries (4.5 per carry) and one touchdown.

Chris Cobb (5-11, 200 Jr.), a transfer from Georgia Military, had a tremendous spring practice, and should get plenty of carries this season. Independence (Kan.) Community College speedster Terry Blessingame (6-0, 190 Jr.), who runs a cat-quick 4.4 40-yard dash, will push for

playing time, as will Baron Dockery (6-0, 200 Jr.), a transfer from Middle Georgia.

Former NC/SC Shrine Bowler Charles Palmer (5-10, 245 So.) of Gaffney (S.C.) High will get the nod at fullback. The big, punishing runner, who has been timed as fast as 4.5 in the 40-yard dash, is a good blocker that should be a star in the future.

Backing up Palmer will be converted linebacker Odell Peoples (6-1, 230 Jr.) and former Shelby (N.C.) High star Omar Roberts (6-1, 220, Fr.).

Punter Trey Greene, who booted 57 kicks for a 39.0 average in 1995, returns this season. He pinned opponents inside the 20-yard line 13 times.

Gardner-Webb began the season with Division II powerhouse Valdosta (Ga.) State on August 31 under the lights in Boiling Springs. The Blazers were rated as high as 8th in some pre-season polls and boast two first-team All-Americans in quarterback Lance Funderburke and receiver Sean Pender.

If the Runnin' Bulldogs can take advantage of playing four of the first five games in the friendly confines of Spangler Stadium, the October 26 showdown at Carson-Newman could have a South Atlantic Conference title and a trip the the NCAA Division II playoffs on the line for both squads.

SEVEN RUNNIN' BULLDOGS SELECTED PRE-SEASON ALL- CONFERENCE

The South Atlantic Conference office recently announced the 1996 pre-season All-Conference teams, and seven Runnin' Bulldogs were honored.

1995 honorable mention All-American defensive back Speedy Mickles was named to the first-team defense, as was defensive end Kenny Freeman. Punter Trey Greene was also named to the first-team.

Two-time All-Conference performer Kelwin Witherspoon was named to the second-team offensive unit as was running back Shed Harris.

Linebackers Bo Shannon and Thomas Marsh, who will lead a talented GWU defense this season, were named to the second-team defense.

"Obviously we are looking for great things from our returning starters," Coach Woody Fish said. "Any coach will tell you that experience is the key to making things happen. Our situation is no different. To succeed, the older guys must step up."

MEN'S SOCCER TEAM POISED FOR A RUN AT SAC CROWN

After a posting a school-record 12 victories in 1995, the Gardner-Webb men's soccer team has its sights set on a higher goal for the 1996 season, the South Atlantic Conference championship.

With eight returning starters and a wealth of incoming talent, Head Coach Tony Setzer has his best chance in the program's 10-year history to bring home the school's first-ever soccer title.

The major factor in the Runnin' Bulldog's success this season will be senior All-American Jerome Lee Yaw. The native of Point-A-Pierre, Trinidad, torched opponents for 20 goals and six assists last season to earn SAC Player of the Year honors. Lee Yaw also became the first athlete in Gardner-Webb history to be named both an All-American and Academic All-American in the same season, earning NSCAA and GTE Academic All-American recognition to go along with NSCAA All-American honors.

With one season left in his stellar career, Lee Yaw has the chance to go down as one of the top players in South Atlantic Conference history. He is the leading career goals scorer in SAC history with 43, also leading in career total scoring with 105 points.

Other returning players that will be key to the GWU offensive attack are senior midfielders "Speedy" Solomon and J Hemphill, as well as sophomores George Odembo and Adam Brugner. Each of these players gained valuable experience last season and will give the Runnin' Bulldogs other options on the offensive end of the field.

Offense will not be the only strong suit for Gardner-Webb this season. Acrobatic goalkeeper Brooks Derrick is back for his final campaign at GWU after leading the NCAA Division II South Region with a 0.65 Goals Against Average last season. He will



make a strong case for All-Conference and possible All-American

honors in 1996. The Mauldin, S.C., native has a strong group of defenders in front of him, including Billy Abrams, Rodney Keith, David Welsh, Robby Ambler, Errol Williams and Eric Narvez.

Setzer stayed busy in the offseason

assembling one of his finest recruiting classes for the upcoming season.

Leading the way is junior midfielder Hugo Biggar, a transfer from Spartanburg (S.C.) Methodist. The lightning-quick Capetown, South Africa, native helped the Pioneers to a NJCAA National Championship as a freshman and will be an exciting addition to the GWU attack.

Other newcomers that will make strong contributions are junior forward Derek Slattery of Spartanburg (S.C.) Methodist, freshman midfielder Anuwela Johnson of Point-A-Pierre, Trinidad, and junior defender Josh Heatherly of Spartanburg (S.C.) Methodist.

The Runnin' Bulldogs are picked third in the South Atlantic Conference pre-season poll, behind Presbyterian and Wingate. As the start of the 1996 season rolls near, the Runnin' Bulldogs appear ready to challenge the two conference powers for the title.

SAC COMMISSIONER SPEAKS OUT

Echols Brings Good News to GWU, Answers Questions About The Conference

Recently, South Atlantic Conference commissioner Doug Echols visited the Gardner-Webb campus to have his picture taken with GWU basketball coaches Rick Scruggs and Eddie McCurley in order to promote the latest bit of exciting good news to hit the University: that Gardner-Webb will host the Food Lion SAC men's and women's basketball tournament February 26 - March 1.

Beginning this year, Gardner-Webb will be the first SAC school to host the tournament on its campus as part of a new rotating system, with each of the other conference schools taking a turn to play host for the next several years. Echols praised GWU for expressing an interest in being the first site in the new system, saying that the other schools will look to this year's tournament at Gardner-Webb as a model for their own plans as hosts.

Echols also announced that GWU will be the host site for the Food Lion SAC men's soccer tournament November 9-10. What follows are comments from Echols as

he took time to address other issues facing the conference.

• **Regarding GWU President Dr. Chris White's current role as president of the SAC and chair of the president's council for the conference:**

"He is the final authority on matters regarding the conference. I report to him and the council, but often I simply meet one-on-one with him to discuss daily business and any new issues facing our schools. He is a progressive-minded individual who conveys the same attention and concern for the conference as he does for Gardner-Webb."

• **On the addition of Newberry to the SAC and the eventual loss of Elon College to Division I:**

"Newberry was previously a member of the SAC, so we're extremely pleased to have a familiar face back. Elon's task, however, will be a very challenging one for them I think. Elon has evaluated its situation and feels this is the best move for the school. I'm concerned many times that

what some might think is best for the school might not always be what's best for the student-athletes. In some cases the competition is so tough for schools making the move (to Division I) that the negatives of getting beat over and over outweigh the positives, like increased exposure and publicity."

• **Describing the current state of Division II in comparison to the larger and smaller divisions:**

"I really feel Division II is much more stable and organized than either Division I or Division III. We simply have better representation at the governing level, meaning that nearly all our schools have the same amount of input in regard to policy and organization. In Division I, you have the largest and strongest schools – the top 100 or so out of 300 – wanting to run the show for everyone. In Division III, which has the most schools, there are so many different institutions, and different-sized institutions, that governance does not occur as smoothly and efficiently.

"I really like where our (SAC) schools are right now. It's one of the top conferences in the nation. If I was a school contemplating a move to Division I, my feelings would be very mixed. I think I would rather be at the top of the heap in Division II than at the bottom of the heap in Division I."

According to the Panthers, the award is based on leadership, citizenship and academic merit. Only graduating seniors from North and South Carolina who have earned a varsity letter are eligible. Students must also have a grade point average of at least 3.0, a recommendation by their athletic director and plans to enroll as a full-time graduate student.

White, a resident of Durham and wife of GWU alum Marty White, played both volleyball and softball at Gardner-Webb. She graduated with perfect 4.0 grade point average. She was awarded the Most Outstanding Female Graduate Award and the Senior Scholastic Achievement Award at the May 1996 commencement ceremonies. White was also named a First Union Scholar Athlete, a district member of the GTE Academic All-American Volleyball team, and was a member of Alpha Chi national honor society.

White will begin studying medicine this fall at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She plans to work toward an M.D. with a specialty in pediatric medicine.

GWU Director of Athletics Ozzie McFarland commented, "Heather is certainly deserving of this recognition. As a student and an athlete at Gardner-Webb she has set a remarkable example for others to follow. A prestigious award such as this reflects well not only on Heather, but on Gardner-Webb University as well."

A four-person committee, chaired by former N.C. governor Jim Martin, conducts the selection process. Martin said, "We had many strong candidates to apply for the scholarships. We are quickly learning that the decision to select only two winners is an increasingly difficult one."

GWU STAFFER ASSISTS NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED PROGRAM

As the assistant director of residence life, Juls Hux is recognized on the Gardner-Webb campus for her availability to counsel students with any problem they encounter. Her desire to help others, however, reaches beyond her professional element. She helps run the Children's Summer Day Camp in Cleveland County operated by the Abuse Prevention Council. The camp focuses on issues relevant to

children living in an abusive family situation and provides a place for them to feel safe and relaxed. Last year, the camp received one of seven Marshall's Domestic Peace Prizes from the Family Violence Prevention Fund in San Francisco and Marshall's Department Stores. The camp served 32 children during its two summer sessions.

AN EDUCATION IN AND OUT OF THE CLASSROOM

Listen, says Dr. Les Brown, GWU professor of science, and you'll hear that something unique is happening on campus.

Faculty and students having discussions, groups gathering to debate the importance of an author's books, freshmen sitting with seniors to collaborate on a research project – and none of it for class credit. "What next?" a character from a cult classic movie proclaimed once. "Cats and dogs living together? It'll be total anarchy!"

Not quite, explains Dr. Brown, but he hopes the stir up the same kind of emotion with a slate activities called "Year of the Scholar." Brown took an idea and ran with it, to create opportunities for professors and students to meet informally and join together in academic pursuits. The theme is to create an atmosphere – a scholarly atmosphere – at Gardner-Webb that allows for discussion and debate and argument and collaboration, and all just for learning's sake.

No grades, no credit, just an environment that fosters a broadening of horizons for both faculty and students.

Need more of an explanation? Six primary areas are being focused on during this, the Year of the Scholar:

- A coffee house that would provide a gathering place and outlet for creative expression, fellowship and discussion;
- A designation of the "100 Most Important Books" that can be read in groups or individually;
- A film festival that features six movies each semester that have made unique or important strides in the history of the cinema industry;
- An annual scholarly journal that will publish at the end of an academic year the joint research/writings of students and faculty mentor;
- A distinguished scholar-lecture series that brings in notable academic personalities for speeches or debates;

- A faculty showcase that allows for the demonstration of current projects or endeavors outside of class.

What has transpired thus far, say Year of the Scholar committee members, is very interesting. The idea of a coffee house is very popular, according to Dr. Matt Theado, assistant professor of English.

"Students come up to me asking how they can help organize the creation of it," he says. "I think people often feel



constrained in a classroom. The whole idea of meeting with others of different heritages, different backgrounds, appeals to a lot of our students."

One vision has the coffee house being located in the basement of Royster Dormitory, what used to be years ago part of the old hospital in Boiling Springs. That space was utilized for...well...let's just say the name for the coffee house, if housed there, will likely be called "The Morgue."

Officially, the objectives of Year of the Scholar are to 1) foster learning for learning's sake; 2) to be a catalyst for lifelong learning; 3) to promote scholarly activity; 4) to bring recognition to scholarly activity to GWU; 5) to unify the university experience; 6) to stimulate educated inquiry and discussion; 7) to break down the barriers of provincialism; 8) to expose one's precepts to examination in a non-threatening environment; and 9) to promote the integration of faith and scholarship.

Dr. Frank Bonner, provost and senior vice president, is the administrative liaison for the schedule of activities. He says everyone out there should perk up and take a long look at what's happening at Gardner-Webb.

"From what we can determine, we're the only school we know of that's organized an undertaking like this. Not even Duke or Chapel Hill has anything like this developed. We are taking the lead in creating a scholarly atmosphere for our campus, one that spills out from the classroom. It gives students and professors a chance to focus on more than just grades – it's allowing for a more total and complete educational experience."

He added, "Nothing before on this campus has ever done more to unite those who attend class and those who teach class."

"This is a springboard year for all of the future," says Dr. Brown. "Things are moving quite fast, and in a positive direction. I have no idea it could go this far this fast."

A local newspaper that got wind of Year of the Scholar declared in an editorial, "This is a laid-back, hip approach that's sure to appeal to open-minded students. It is fueled by creativity, spontaneity, unity and thought."

Stay tuned. The fun has just started.

The Michael J. Frost Teacher Education Endowed Scholarship Fund: established in April 1995 and funded through a gift from the Lutz Foundation. The fund is designated to assist female undergraduate students enrolled in the Gardner-Webb teacher education program. The late Ray Webb Lutz led the effort to name this fund in honor of Michael Frost.

The Hampton C. and Betty C. Hager Business Administration Endowed Scholarship: established in September 1995 and funded through a gift from the Lutz Foundation.
