Crest High School Chamber Orchestra Participates in 18th Annual Event

BOILING SPRINGS, N.C.—The Gardner-Webb University/Cleveland County Orchestra will host a concert of great works on Nov. 25 at 8 p.m. in Dover Theatre. Joining the group for the 18th year is the Crest High School Chamber Orchestra, under the direction of Peter Strickland, a 1997 GWU alumnus.

Also featured during the program will be Gardner-Webb President Dr. William M. Downs, who will narrate for "A Lincoln Portrait" by Copland. The iconic piece was written by Copland in 1942 on a commission from the conductor Andre Kostelanetz. The country was still mourning after the Dec. 7, 1941, attack on Pearl Harbor, and the United States was gearing up for entry into World War II. Kostelanetz was looking for orchestral music that would celebrate the spirit of the American people. The piece includes excerpts from Abraham Lincoln's speeches and writings.

The musicians will also perform "Pictures at an Exhibition" by Mussorgsky/Ravel and Vivaldi's "Double Cello Concerto," featuring Tanja Bechtler, GWU professor of cello, and MacKenzie Quattlebaum, a senior music major.

Conductor Dr. Patricia C. Sparti is proud of the group's recent accomplishments. "The
