# New President Dr. William M. Downs Honors Scholastic Achievements, Shares His Faith at Dimensions


BOILING SPRINGS, N.C.-Gardner-Webb University President Dr. William M. Downs recently began the semester by presiding over the Fall Academic Convocation and giving a special address to students as part of the Dimensions series.

During both programs, Downs focused on Gardner-Webb's mission. "I want to underscore one important message as we launch this new year," Downs stated at the Fall Convocation. "And the message is this—we are a private university with a very public mission, and it is incumbent upon all of us to live up to that public mission in some way."


At the Dimensions program, which seeks to enhance the spiritual, intellectual and cultural life at the University and to promote a sense of community, Downs shared about his personal faith. He also talked about passages from the Bible that guided him as an undergraduate.

The academic convocation celebrated the accomplishments of new and returning students and featured Assistant

Professor of Music Dr. Bruce Moser, winner of the 2019 Excellence in Teaching Award, as the guest speaker. Moser's remarks included stories of famous composers, John Cage and Phil Glass, who washed dishes and drove a taxi until their music was published. He also talked about his own disappointments, and shared stories about the difficulties faced by the GWU administrators who were on the stage with him. He challenged students to persevere through hard times.

"It doesn't matter the type of success—be it history-book-making like John Cage and Phil Glass, or everyday-relatable like passing a course, beating an illness or maintaining a relationship—it takes the resolve to work hard and endure when things don't go as planned," he related. "And when those storms blow in and push your little boat off its carefully charted path, you can take comfort in not only knowing who's in the boat with you, but also that your calloused hands aren't strangers to picking up an oar and paddling."

After Moser's speech, Scholastic Achievement Awards were presented to students who have maintained a 4.0 Grade Point Average for one year, two years and three years. The Ignite Excellence Scholars were also recognized.
