'God of Carnage' is Dark Domestic Comedy with Four Actors

BOILING SPRINGS, N.C.—The second play of the season for the Gardner-Webb University Department of Theatre Arts is the dark domestic comedy by Yasmina Reza, "God of Carnage." Performances will be Nov. 16-19 in the Millennium Playhouse, located behind the Communications Studies Hall, 141 S. Main St., Boiling Springs.

The Tony Award-winning play is a story about two couples whose boys had a playground altercation. The parents—Alan and Annette, and Michael and Veronica—meet to discuss what happened, agreeing to be civil. However, tensions emerge and the evening ends in chaos. The one-act performance is a challenge for the actors, because they are on stage for almost the entire show.

"It's only four people so there's a lot of concentration and work that has to go into this play," observed Director Dr. Chris Nelson, GWU Assistant Professor of Theatre and department chair. "It's also high-intensity at times, so that can be challenging as well."

R.J. Thompson, a junior theatre arts major from Boiling Springs, is Alan, and playing Annette, is Holly Strother, a senior youth discipleship major from Red Springs, N.C. Japheth Vazquez Nieves, a freshman English major from Vega Baja, Puerto Rico, is Michael, and Veronica is played by Sarah Bragdon, a freshman nursing major, Spanish minor from Anderson, S.C.
