Event Includes Release of Historical "GWU Faculty Emeriti Book" Third Edition

BOILING SPRINGS, N.C.—Gardner-Webb welcomed nearly two dozen distinguished former faculty members to the University's Tucker Student Center this summer for a luncheon to honor their dedication to the institution and to celebrate the release of the third edition of the "GWU Faculty Emeriti Book."

"The Faculty Emeriti Luncheon was a wonderful opportunity for the University to reconnect with a group of faculty members who have made a profound contribution to

the shape and fiber of Gardner-Webb University," said Dr. Ben Leslie, GWU Provost and Executive Vice President. "Their presence at Gardner-Webb has been sacrificial in that any of them could easily have found greater financial reward elsewhere. But they believe in our ideal of Christian higher education, and have chosen to leave their mark here. And believe me, in each and every case, they have."

Emeriti rank at Gardner-Webb is reserved for those who have retired from full-time teaching at the University with at least 15 years of service as a member of the faculty. The position is recommended by faculty through an academic department, the Administrative Advisory Committee and the University administration. The Board of Trustees then appoints the retired faculty member to emeriti status. More than 40 total faculty members have received the honor in Gardner-Webb's history.

"This title and this recognition mean a great deal to me," shared Dr. Bob Morgan, GWU Professor Emeritus of French and Mathematics. "I have enjoyed all of my wonderful connections with Gardner-Webb since I first came to teach here in 1967."

At the luncheon, several GWU speakers offered reflection on the impact of the emeriti faculty members, including Leslie, President Dr. Frank Bonner, Chair of the Faculty and Professor of Philosophy Dr. Perry Hildreth, Vice President of Christian Life and Service

and Senior Minister Dr. Tracy Jessup, and Public Relations Specialist Matthew Tessnear. Emeriti also relished time to visit with

friends and former colleagues.

"The project has since transformed from that first edition hardcover book in 1994 to now include both print and digital online formats as a living, breathing emeriti history in this latest edition.
