University Ensembles to Perform "Concert for a Cause" on April 28 in Shelby, N.C.

BOILING SPRINGS, N.C.—Two Gardner-Webb University Department of Music ensembles will perform a concert April 28 to benefit the food ministries of a church in Shelby, N.C.

The "Concert for a Cause" will feature about 20 students in the GWU Chorale and Early Music Ensemble, in support of the Shepherd's Table and Food Pantry at the Episcopal Church of the Redeemer. The event is free and open to the public, but attendants may bring non-perishable food or toiletry items to donate to the church's outreach ministry.

"This is a tradition we are hoping to start with churches in the Shelby and Boiling Springs areas to put on a concert and collect donations for their ministries," shared Dr. Morgan Soja, GWU Assistant Professor of Music Education and director of the GWU Chorale. "We know that Gardner-Webb's motto, 'Pro Deo et Humanitate' (For God and Humanity), means that we should not just 'sing to the Lord' but also use our voices to serve the Lord as well."

The concert is set to begin at 7 p.m. at the church, which is located at 502 W. Sumter St. in Shelby. The Chorale will perform works including a Romantic Era piece by Johannes Brahms, a Romani dance song, an African-American spiritual, a contemporary American art song and a setting of Psalm 150. The Early Music Ensemble will perform selections from the Renaissance and Baroque eras.
