Musician and Author Jimi Ray ('87) to Speak at Dimensions on Feb. 24

BOILING SPRINGS, N.C.—Musician, author and 1987 alumnus
Jimi Ray will visit Gardner-Webb on Tuesday, Feb. 24, to share
his spiritual journey during the University's Dimensions program. The event is free and
open to the public.

Ray formed a band, Age of Faith, after graduating from Gardner-Webb. The group signed with two major record labels, created five recordings that were released nationwide and produced a No. 1 song. After more than a decade of success, the band dissolved and Ray plunged into a period of depression and an addiction to prescription pain medication.

Those triumphs and trials are the subject of Ray's new book, "I Wish It Would Rain," which he discussed in a biography on his personal website. "I'm looking forward to sharing with people exactly what happened and how my life derailed dramatically," he offered. "One of the greatest aspects of this book is being able to share with people how God never gave up on me. There were many days when I wondered if He had turned his back, when in reality I was the one turning. God was there all the time. The amazing love, mercy and redemption shown to me was unbelievable. I pray others who now walk in the shoes I walked in will realize the same thing."

Ray's Dimensions program will begin at 9:25 a.m. in Paul Porter Arena, located inside the Lutz-Yelton Convocation Center (LYCC). "I attended Gardner-Webb University with Jimi Ray and was always impressed by his musical gifts," shared Dr. Tracy Jessup, vice president of the GWU Office of Christian Life and Service and senior minister to the University. "Through the ups and downs in his life, Jimi can testify to God's faithfulness, and that's a reminder that is good for all of us to hear."
