Recital to Feature National Soloist Joanna Ross Hersey

BOILING SPRINGS, N.C. – Gardner-Webb University's Department of Music will present a concert featuring Joanna Ross Hersey, Yamaha Performing Artist and Professor of Tuba and Euphonium at UNC Pembroke, on Thursday, Jan. 15 in the Blanton Auditorium.

The performance will begin at 8 p.m. and will include pieces such as *Vivace from Sonata* in *E Minor* by Jean-Baptiste Loelliet, *Three Pieces for Violoncello and Piano* by Nadia Boulanger, and *Cavatina and Variations* by Jean Baptiste Arban. Admission is free and the recital is open to the public.

Hersey is the former principal tubist for the U.S. Coast Guard, a position she earned at the age of 19. She has performed throughout the country as a soloist and clinician, has played for three U.S. presidents and has appeared on *The Today Show* and *Good Morning America*.

Currently, Hersey is the principal tubist for the Carolina Philharmonic and the Carolina International Orchestra. Her second solo album is to be released next month and will feature a collection of her own compositions as well as works by Faye Ellen Silverman and Hildegard von Bingen.
