Future Students Become Familiar with Gardner-Webb Through Dawg Days

BOILING SPRINGS, N.C. – Gardner-Webb University is planning the first of two upcoming Dawg Days on Saturday, Oct. 25 at the Tucker Student Center. Dawg Days are free visitation days that allow future students to become familiar with the University and what it has to offer. The second event is planned for Nov. 11.

“It’s kind of like an open house,” said Elisabeth Edmonson, GWU Event and Visit Coordinator for Undergraduate Admissions. Edmonson finds the event to be great for anyone interested in attending Gardner-Webb. “It not only allows potential students and their parents to get an intimate look at what Gardner-Webb is all about, but also gives them the chance to see the facilities and faces behind the University.”
