The exhibit, “Creative Journey: Bonnie Hartford Price,” is on display now in the Tucker Art Gallery. Price, who passed away in 2013, was a prominent artist in Cleveland and surrounding counties for many years. She was a founding member of the Southern Arts Society, based in Kings Mountain, N.C., she won numerous awards for her work, and her creations have been displayed in a variety of venues throughout the region.

The GWU exhibit displays a collection of works that span her entire career, including paintings, drawings, sculptures, prints and handmade books, and select pieces that have never been displayed.

A reception to celebrate the exhibit is set for Aug. 21 from 4 to 7 p.m. The public is invited.
