Collaboration to Result in Resources for Leadership Training

BOILING SPRINGS, N.C. – The Gardner-Webb University Pittman Center for Congregational Enrichment is announcing a new partnership with Christian Leaders Link, a leadership training entity of Virginia Baptists, located in Roanoke, Va.

Beginning in July, the Pittman Center will provide resources for use by the Link. These funds will allow the two ministries to co-host workshops, conferences, and other non-degree training events during the year. Events will be hosted in a variety of locations throughout Virginia, especially in southwest and southern Virginia.

Rev. John Bridges, director of the GWU Pittman Center, noted the center's recent efforts to provide off-campus training initiatives. "Our intent is to provide churches and their leaders with the training they need," he said. "Partnering with Christian Leaders Link and relying on their knowledge of leaders and churches in the region allows us to better target particular training needs that need to be addressed. We are excited about the opportunities to unite for Kingdom work in Virginia."

Dr. Gary Chapman, director of the Christian Leaders Link, indicated planning for the initiative has already begun. "We look forward to this innovative partnership," Chapman noted. "The commitment of the Pittman Center will only enhance the training we are able to offer Virginia Baptists."

The mission of Christian Leaders Link is to provide practical church training and theological study for laypersons and ministers in order to further the cause of Kingdom
