BOILING SPRINGS, N.C. – Gardner-Webb University's School of Performing and Visual Arts presents *The Old Maid and The Thief: A Grotesque Opera in 14 Scenes,* Thursday-Saturday, Feb. 13-15 at 7:30 p.m. and a matinee Sunday, Feb. 16 at 2:30 p.m. in the Dover Theatre, located in the Lutz-Yelton Convocation (LYCC). The stage performers and orchestra members for the opera consist of GWU students and community participants.

Dr. Megan McCauley, GWU Director of Opera Theatre and assistant professor of voice is directing the opera, which was written by Gian Carlo Menotti. Dr. Patricia Sparti, professor of music and music director, is conducting the GWU Orchestra as they provide live music for the event.

"This comedy was originally composed as an opera for radio," said McCauley. "It tells a story of two women desperate for the attention of a man and the mistaken identity of an escaped convict on the run."

The Old Maid and The Thief is performed in English and is appropriate for audiences of all ages. McCauley says audience members can expect a show full of surprises, laughs, and disguises.

McCauley adds, "There will also be a photo booth in the lobby for free pictures in disguise, and a raffle on opening night for a grand prize."
