Distinguished Alumnus Performance Sept. 26 Comes as Musician Joins Cambridge University

BOILING SPRINGS, N.C. – Gardner-Webb University's School of Performing and Visual Arts presents Matthew Lineberger in a Distinguished Alumnus Piano (solo) Recital on Thursday, Sept. 26 at 8:15 p.m. in Blanton Auditorium, located in Hamrick Hall. The event is being held just prior to Lineberger beginning his pursuit of a Master of Music in Choral Conducting at Cambridge University, located in the United Kingdom.

Lineberger, a Gardner-Webb music alumnus is a native of Morganton, N.C. He is no stranger to faculty, staff, students, and the public and is heavily involved in music events on campus. Lineberger is a versatile musician, who has performed – at numerous events as a piano soloist, with instrumental ensembles, and with vocal groups.
