Hoyt Bynum Jr. is Chamber President, Local Pastor, and Advocate for Children

BOILING SPRINGS, N.C. –Gardner-Webb University strives to produce well-rounded graduates who incorporate faith, service and leadership in their lives. Alum Hoyt Bynum Jr. is such a graduate; a successful businessman, a community servant, and a third-generation preacher.

Bynum received a bachelor's degree in business administration from Gardner-Webb University in 1993. In addition to starting a new church, he is currently working on a Master of Art in Religion and Christian Leadership and recently took over as president of the Simpsonville (S.C.) Area Chamber of Commerce.

"One of my favorite verses in scripture is Romans 8:28, which states 'we know that in all things, God works for the good for those who love him, who have been called according to His purpose," Bynum reflected. "I'm grateful to live my life according to God's purpose. Now, it's up to me to continue to walk in obedience, love and favor of God."
