BOILING SPRINGS, N.C. – Gardner-Webb University is proud to present its third annual Summer Leadership Conference, titled "Embracing and Institutionalizing Reform: Bringing Out the Change Agent in Each of Us." The conference is jointly sponsored by the School of Education's Center for Innovative Leadership Development (CILD) and the Godbold School of Business's Center for Ethics and Entrepreneurship (CEE).
