She's received positive feedback and is quick to recognize the source of her success. "This project would not have been accomplished without God's hand of blessing," affirmed Schurman, who lives

in Greenville, S.C. "I was in need of someone who could help with the editing, He provided three

volunteers. Those who I asked to write an article said yes and were extremely supportive of my journey. When I look over this finished project, I see God throughout, from beginning to end and I want to praise Him." Schurman, formerly of Shelby, N.C., chose to attend Gardner-Webb because it was close to home, and she could easily transfer from the community college. She appreciated her professors and the knowledge they shared. "I enjoyed my teachers and the lessons they taught me and the






