

"I just have not been as productive during quarantine," says Dover, who is a senior art major from Boiling Springs. "I find that I really thrive in my creativity when I am around other students and seeing their work. That inspires me in my own work."

"I find that I really want to do a lot of creative artwork in times of stress – the work helps me to feel better," she says. products, jewelry, ceramics, paintings, photography, and floral arrangements. While operating the sale, art students will also learn practical skills. "The sale gives them hands-on

experience in learning to market their wares," says Paula Casper, GWU assistant professor of art and art club advisor. "This process includes everything from production, presentation, and sales to receiving and welcoming feedback, and interacting with their potential and actual customers." Students in the art club will keep 85 percent of the sale price, while the club collects 15 percent.

"This system serves a dual purpose in that it educates the students about the mechanics of an actual art marketplace and collectively provides a lucrative source of funds for the advancement of their

artistic experiences while here at GWU," Casper says. The money collected by the GWU art club has been used to help the students go on art-related trips

both locally and abroad. In the past such trips have included ceramic wood-firings in Dillsboro and

Rutherfordton; the High Museum in Atlanta, Georgia; numerous art museums in Charlotte; the

Smithsonian and the National Gallery of Art in Washington, D.C.; the Metropolitan and the Guggenheim in New York City; and locales in southern France, Italy and Greece. 




