

Besides enhancing his leadership skills, Williams wanted an opportunity to gain research experience, because he hopes to teach college when he retires from his current position. "I chose the Gardner-Webb program because of the experience and knowledge of the professors,

and the required doctoral project is real-time experience to prepare you for life after completing the program," he noted. "I value the comprehensive nature of the classes and program emphasis. The professors have been very supportive and are extremely knowledgeable."
