Celebrating its 25th anniversary, Carolina Brass performs extensively in educational settings. The group's mission is to promote the understanding of music and to improve the performance level of musicians of all ages through performances, residencies, master classes, and recordings.



With a combination of virtuosity and good humor, Carolina Brass is a favorite among audiences of all ages.
