Dr. Elizabeth Amato received the Excellence in Teaching Award. This honor is presented each year to an exceptional faculty member with at least five years of full-time teaching service to the University. The award recognizes academic rigor, effective course design, and dedication to students.

Recipients are nominated by one of their peers and receive a recommendation from their department chair. In addition, both faculty and students have an opportunity to score and leave comments and feedback to help make the final determination of the winner. The award also recognizes a faculty member who exemplifies the motto and mission of Gardner-Webb. It includes a \$1,000 cash prize and the invitation to speak at Fall Convocation.

Amato is associate professor of political science and international relations in the Department of Social Sciences. While making the presentation, Aubrey asserted that in her teaching and life, Amato exemplifies the mission and motto of the University, "pro Deo et Humanitate," For God and Humanity.

Aubrey continued, "She is said to have fully committed to providing interesting and thought-provoking course work for students, as well as mentoring and advising students in and out of her major. She demonstrates her love for teaching every day, in and out of the classroom."

Aubrey read a few quotes from Amato's students that describe her teaching style:

Further, Aubrey praised Amato for continuing to develop her professional skills in scholarship through involvement in several political science organizations. Amato attends conferences regularly allowing her to keep her classes relevant and up to date. In 2018, she completed her first book, "The Pursuit of Happiness and the American Regime: Political Theory in Literature." In addition, Amato has authored multiple articles and chapters and served as a go-to resource on elections for regional media and public events.

Amato has rewritten the curriculum for political science, developed a Political Science Club and a Pre-Law Society. She has designed and taught informative and interesting courses. She brings a contagious enthusiasm to her classes and holds students to high standards out of a genuine desire to prepare them for professional success.

Aubrey concluded, "Her students are always first.
