Abbeville, S. C. May 23, 1887

Dear Father

Received your letter a few days ago. Was glad to hear Tom Hudson was getting along all right. We are needing rain here very bad. Gardens are not doing any good. Every thing is parching up. In some parts of the county there has been plenty of rain. I am doing very well except my cough troubles me so much at night. I go to the store every morning feeling very well but about 12 o clock I begin to feel weak and bad and I almost give out before we close the store. Dr. Hill says if he was me that he would go home for he does not think that it is doing me any good but injuring my health. Aslo says he thinks I had better quit the drug business as it keeps me confined too close. He has been doing all he could for me since I have been here and does not charge me anything for it. I think it very kind in him. Give Miss Bettie my best wishes. Was sorry to hear of Sam Hoey being shot. I will close for this time as I do not know anything else to write about. Write when you can.
