Abbeville, S. C., Dec 3, 1886.

Dear Father

I received your letter a few days ago and was very sorry to hear of Mrs. Beam('s) death for I think she was one of the nicest wom(e)n I ever knew. I received a letter from Sam a few days ago and he said that he had been working in the rain all day. I wrote him that he had better take care of himself or he would have a cough like I have. I am getting along very well but we have a very cold store. It is a long store and the store is in the back part and it does not warm the front part as we keep the door open all the time. I think if he does not have a better way to heat the room I shall make arrangements to go some where else for I don't think I can stand so much cold. I have seen Mr. Webber. He sends his regards to you. I am staying at the Hotel. Have a good warm nice room and the proprietor says anytime I want anything he has not got, that he will try and get it for me. Quill wrote me that you w(ere) sick with a cold. I hope you are better. Give Miss Bettie my regards. Write soon.
